The 94th Academy Awards returned to the Dolby Theater in Hollywood as the top films from the last year were honoured by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences. The show was hosted by Regina Hall, Amy Schumer and Wanda Sykes, the first time the award ceremony has had multiple hosts since Anne Hathaway and James Franco co-hosted the 83rd instalment in 2011. The 94th Academy Awards honoured the films released between January 1 and December 31, 2021. The nominations were announced on February 8, by actors Tracee Ellis Ross and Leslie Jordan.

Highlights of 2022 Oscars

- Dune directed by Denis Villeneuve leads the awards total with 6 wins. The film which was nominated under 10 categories, has bagged 6 awards for Cinematography; Film Editing; Music (Original Score); Production Design; Sound and Visual Effects.
- "CODA", directed by Sian Heder, became the 1st film produced by a streaming service, Apple TV+, to win Best Picture. CODA has won the Oscars 2022 under 3 categories: Best Picture; Actor In A Supporting Role and Writing (Adapted Screenplay).
- Will Smith has won the Best Actor In A Leading Role for his performance in "King Richard" and

- <u>Jessica Chastain has won the Best Actress</u> In A Leading Role for her role in "The Eyes Of Tammy Fave".
- Jane Campion has won the Best Director award at Oscars 2022 for her film, "Power of the Dog". She is the 3rd Female director to win the Best Director Oscar following Chloe Zhao for "Nomadland" (2020) and Kathryn Bigelow for "The Hurt Locker" (2009).
- Troy Kotsur won the Oscars for Best Actor In A
 Supporting Role and become the 2nd deaf actor to
 win an academy award. Marlee Matlin was the
 first Deaf actor to win an Oscar in 1987 for
 Children of a Lesser God.
- Ariana DeBose won the Best Supporting Actress award for West Side Story. She became the first openly queer woman of colour to win the acting Oscar.She is only the 2nd Latina actor to win an Oscar, Rita Moreno, who also won the best supporting actress Oscar for the same role in 1962.
- Samuel Jackson, Elaine May, and Liv Ullmann were honoured with the Honorary Academy Awards for 2022. The Jean Hersholt Humanitarian Award was given to Danny Glover.

Economic crisis in Sri Lanka

- Sri Lanka is facing its worst economic crisis since the country's financial crisis of 1948. The last time
 - the country was in such distress was right after independence from the British. The prices of essential commodities



are rising to the skies and many Lankans are fleeing their country to find refuge in India.

- The prices of milk, rice, food grains, vegetables are skyrocketing and petrol and diesel are not available in the country. There is also news that the schools are unable to print papers due to its shortage which is why exams are not being conducted in the country.
- The reason for Sri Lanka's crumbling economy is the shortage of foreign currency. This has led to a huge reduction in imports of essential goods the country used to easily get.
- As one knows, Sri Lanka relies on imports heavily.
 It imports petrol, diesel, food, sugar, lentils, paper, medicines etc. The country now has no money in its forex accounts to buy all this for its citizens.
- Sri Lanka's FDI has also plummeted recently leaving the country with lesser foreign reserves. It decreased from \$548 million in 2020 to 793 million in 2019 and 1.6 billion in 2018.
- The inflation in Sri Lanka hit 15.1% last month. The data released by the Government show that now the inflation has reached 25.7%.
- Citizens of the country are on roads in protest. The cooking gas cylinders are also being sold at a higher price than before. There is a hike of 1359 Rs on each cylinder within a week.
- India helps all its neighbours and has stepped in here as well. Sri Lanka amidst all this has refused to take help from IMF (International Monetary Fund).

World's Biggest Electric Cruise Ship made its maiden voyage in China

• The largest electric cruise ship in the world has returned back to port in Yichang in central Hubei province, China after travelling up and down the Yangtze River for its maiden voyage. This cruise ship has been powered by a 7,500-kilowatt-hour massive-sized marine battery. This battery has been provided by Contemporary Amperex Technology, the No. 1 battery manufacturer for electric cars in the world.

Kuwait becomes hottest place on earth, records 53.2 degree Celsius

- Kuwait reached a scorching temperature of 53.2 degrees Celsius (127.7 degrees Fahrenheit), making it among the hottest places on earth. It was so hot in Kuwait last summer that birds dropped dead from the sky. Sea horses boiled to death in the bay. Dead clams coated the rocks, their shells popped open like they'd been steamed.
- The country continues to burn oil for electricity and ranks among the top global carbon emitters per capita, according to the World Resources Institute. As asphalt melts on highways, Kuwaitis bundle up for bone-chilling air-conditioning in malls. Renewable energy accounts for less than 1 per cent of demand far below Kuwait's target of 15 per cent by 2030.

First wildlife bond issued by World Bank to save Africa's black rhino

The World Bank (International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, IBRD) has issued the Wildlife Conservation Bond (WCB) to support of South Africa's efforts to conserve endangered species of Black Rhino. Wildlife Conservation Bond (WCB) is also known as "Rhino Bond". It is a five-year \$150 million Sustainable Development Bond. It includes a

potential performance payment from the Global Environment Facility (GEF).

 The bond will contribute to protecting and increasing black rhino populations in two protected areas in South Africa namely the Addo Elephant National Park (AENP) and the Great Fish River Nature Reserve (GFRNR).

Mahatma Gandhi Green Triangle' Unveiled In Madagascar

Mahatma Gandhi Green Triangle' has been unveiled in Madagascar to mark Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav. Ambassador of India to Madagascar, Abhay Kumar celebrated the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav by inaugurating a Green Triangle, along with Mayor of Antananarivo Naina Andriantsitohaina. The word green in the plaque signifies their commitment to development and saving the environment. The naming of this park as Mahatma Gandhi Green Triangle is an apt tribute to Mahatma Gandhi.

U.S. revokes Russia's 'Favored Nation' trade status


- President Biden announced that the United States—along with the G7, the European Union, and NATO—will revoke Russia's Most Favored Nation (MFN) trade status. Revoking Russia's PNTR status will allow the United States to increase and impose new tariffs on all Russian imports. In the US, the "most favoured nation" status is also known as permanent normal trade relations (PNTR). Only North Korea and Cuba do not enjoy the "most favoured nation" status from the US.
- The main aim of this step is to punish the Russian government for its invasion of Ukraine. The United States will also not export luxury goods to Russia. Earlier, the United States has banned the import of Oil and energy from Russia. This action will cause economic harm to Russia by damaging its ability to export to wealthier Western markets; it will also raise costs for Americans and our trading partners that may rely on affected Russian products.
- A most favoured nation status designation means two countries have agreed to trade with each other

under the best possible terms — low tariffs, few barriers to trade and the highest possible imports allowed.

Russia is now world's most sanctioned country 2022

• Russia has become the most sanctioned country in the world, due to its invasion on Ukraine, according

to a New York-based sanctions watchlist site Castellum.AI.
Russia faced 2,778 new sanctions since



February 22, 2022, led by the US and European nations, bringing the total sanctions to 5,530. The country already had 2,754 sanctions in place before February 22.

 Countries across the world are putting sanctions on Russia to stop its invasion of Ukraine. Russia has now surpassed countries like Iran and North Korea in terms of a number of sanctions. Before this, Iran was the most sanctioned country, facing 3,616 sanctions against it over the last decade, while Syria and North Korea have 2,608 and 2,077 sanctions, respectively.

Pakistan again placed on FATF's grey list

 The global money laundering and terrorist financing watchdog, Financial Action Task Force



(FATF), retained Pakistan in the grey list and asked the country to work on money laundering investigations and prosecutions. FATF also added

the United Arab Emirates (UAE) to its grey watchlist.

• The decision has been taken after the conclusion of the four-day FATF Plenary from March 1-4, 2022. The event took place in hybrid mode from Paris, France. Pakistan has been on the grey list of FATF since June 2018 for failing to check money laundering and terror financing. It was given a plan of action to complete it by October 2019 but it fails to comply with the FATF mandates.

NATIONAL

Union cabinet approves amendment in Mega Power Policy 2009 for provisional mega power projects

- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) extended the time limit for 10 power projects by 36months to 156 months instead of 120 months from the date of import. This will enable the power projectsto furnish documents required to become certified 'mega' projects in order to competitively bid forfuture PPAs (Power Purchase Agreements) and get tax exemptions as per policy terms.
- This has been done by amending the Mega Power Policy 2009.
- During this extended period, bids for firm power (combination of intermittent renewable energy, storageand conventional power) will be invited in co-ordination with Ministry of New & Renewable Energy (MNRE) and Solar Energy Corporation of India Limited (SECI) and these Mega projects will be expected to participate in such bids to secure PPAs.

Museum of all former Prime Ministers of India to be inaugurated in Delhi

- A museum of all former Prime Ministers, Pradhan Mantri Sangrahalaya (the Museum of Prime Ministers), has been built at Teen Murti Estate, in Delhi.The Rs. 270 crore project will be inaugurated on April 14, 2022 at Teen Murti Bhavan complex which was residence of ex-PM Jawaharlal Nehru.
- The Museum will showcase the life, times and contribution of all 14 Prime Ministers of India so far, except for the collections and works on Jawaharlal Nehru, who has a separate Nehru Memorial Museum, which was also his residence.
- The PMs Museum project was approved in 2018, and deadline for its completion was October 2020, but faced delays due to pandemic-related

lockdowns, as well as civil works and contentcuration issues.

India's first 'steel road' built in Diamond City of India 'Surat'

- India's first-of-its kind road made out of steel waste has come up in Surat city of Gujarat at the Hazira Industrial Area.
- The road has been built by Arcelor Mittal Nippon Steel India in collaboration with CSIR India (Council of Scientific and Industrial Research), CRRI (Central Road Research Institute) and NITI Aayog,
- The new experimental road project is 6-lane and 1kilometre in length. It consists of 100 percent processed steel slag.
- Slag is a by-product separated from metals during the smelting or refining of ore.
- The initiative may help to solve the steel waste material issue, produced by different plants around the country each year, amounting to around nineteen million tonnes, that usually go to landfills.

Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana extended for 6 months till September 2022

- The Government of India has announced an extension in the free ration scheme Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY) for another six months till September 2022. Earlier the scheme was valid till March 2022.
- The PMGKAY scheme was launched in March 2020 amid the COVID-19 pandemic so that the vulnerable households do not suffer due to the nonavailability of adequate foodgrains.
- The extension would incur an additional cost of Rs 80,000 crore to the exchequer. So far about Rs 2.6 trillion has been spent on the scheme.
- Under the PM-GKAY each beneficiary gets 5 kg free ration per person per month in addition to his

- normal quota of foodgrain under the National Food Security Act (NFSA).
- PM-GKAY is the largest food security program in the world.

'Ishan Manthan' Festival organised in New Delhi to showcase culture, crafts and cuisines of Northeast

- Union Minister for Culture, Tourism & DONER Shri G Kishan Reddy inaugurated the three-day North-East festival called 'Ishan Manthan' at the Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts in New Delhi on March 25, 2022.
- The three-day Ishan Manthan programme will celebrate the rich ethnicity and colours of North East India, from March 25 to 27, 2022.
- The event will give an opportunity know about the culture, art, music, folk dances, handicrafts and traditional cuisines of Northeast India.

Union Minister Smriti Irani inaugurates 10-day mega Red Fort Festival 'Bharat Bhagya Vidhata' of Ministry of Culture

- Union Minister of Women and Child Development, Smriti Irani inaugurated the ten-day mega Red Fort Festival, 'Bharat Bhagya Vidhata' at Red Fort in Delhi on March 25, 2022.
- The Red Fort festival has been organised by the Union Ministry of Culture, as part of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsay.
- The ministry has collaborated with the Dalmia Bharat Group (DBG) to organise the event as DBG has adopted the Red Fort as its Monument Mitra.
- The festival will commemorate the heritage, culture and diversity of every part of India.

Ministry of Jal Shakti launches Sujlam 2.0 Campaign

Ministry of Jal Shakti has launched the Sujalam 2.0 campaign for greywater management on the occasion of World Water Day, 2022 (22 March 2022). It was launched by Union Minister of Jal Shakti, Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat.

- Theme: The theme for this year for Sujalam 2.0 campaign is 'Groundwater: making the invisible visible'.
- Objective of Sujalam 2.0: to manage greywater through people's participation. Under the campaign, we plan to mobilize communities, our institutions like panchayats, schools, anganwadi to undertake greywater management.
- What is Grey Water: Greywater refers to domestic wastewater generated in households or office buildings from streams without fecal contamination, i.e., all streams except for the wastewater from toilets.
- A Joint Advisory was also signed by 9 Ministries on how greywater management will be taken up at their level based on convergence model with all those who are directly associated in programme implementation.

Ministry of Heavy Industries extends Phase-II of FAME India Scheme for two years till 2024

- Ministry of Heavy Industries had notified Phase-II of FAME India Scheme for three years from April 2019 to March 2022.
- However, the government has extended the FAME
 II scheme for 2 years. So now this scheme will be applicable till March 2024.
- Total budgetary support to Phase-II of FAME India Scheme for a period of five years is Rs. 10,000 crore, from financial year 2019-20 to 2023-24.
- Focus area of Phase II will be mainly on supporting electrification of public & shared transportation through demand incentive and creation of a network of charging infrastructure.
- Objective of FAME India Scheme is to promote adoption of electric/ hybrid vehicles (xEVs) in India.
- Phase I of the FAME India Scheme was formulated in 2015, with total budget outlay of Rs 895 crore upto March 31, 2019.
- The main focus of this phase was on four areas i.e. technological development, demand generation,

pilot project and charging infrastructure components.

Nitin Gadkari inaugurates India's first Green Hydrogen Fuel Cell Electric Vehicle (FCEV) Toyota Mirai

- Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways Shri Nitin Gadkari inaugurated the world's most advanced technology-developed Green Hydrogen Fuel Cell Electric Vehicle (FCEV) Toyota Mirai at New Delhi on March 16, 2022.
- Toyota Mirai is India's first Fuel Cell Electric Vehicle (FCEV), which is completely powered by Hydrogen.
- Toyota Mirai has been launched by Toyota Kirloskar Motor Pvt Ltd and International Center for Automotive Technology (ICAT) under a pilot project, to study and evaluate the performance of Toyota Mirai on Indian roads and climatic conditions.
- This is a first of its kind project in India which will create a Green Hydrogen based ecosystem in the country and help India to become 'Energy Selfreliant' by 2047.

Indian Railways' First Gati Shakti Cargo Terminal commissioned in Asansol Division of Eastern Railway

- The Indian Railways has commissioned the first 'Gati Shakti Multi-Modal Cargo Terminal' (GCT) in Asansol Division of Eastern Railways, under the PM GATI-SHAKTI programme.
- This private siding of Maithan Power Limited was commissioned by the Asansol division at Thaparnagar in Jharkahnd.
- This is the first Gati Shakti Multi Modal Cargo Terminal (GCT) commissioned in the Indian Railways network since the launch of the GCT policy in December 2021.
- The commissioning of this terminal will enhance the earnings of Indian Railways by around Rs. 11 crores per month.

 Indian Railways will set up around 500 multi-modal cargo terminals under the PM GATI-SHAKTI programme within 4-5 years, in line with PM Narendra Modi's vision of "Gati Shakti" and the Railway Ministry's Policy regarding GCT.

India's first-of-its kind 'World Peace Center' to be established in Gurugram

- India's first World Peace Center is soon to come up in Gurugram, Haryana, for the establishment of peace and harmony in the world by mental, emotional and character development of the people...
- The new Centre will be set up by the New Delhibased Ahimsa Vishwa Bharti Organisation, established by eminent Jainacharya and Ambassador of Peace, Dr Lokeshji
- The new World Peace Center will come up in Sector 39 of Gurugram opposite Medanta Hospital and adjacent to Delhi-Jaipur Highway.

India's first medical city 'Indrayani Medicity' to come up in Pune

- The state government of Maharashtra has announced to set up country's first medical city named as 'Indrayani Medicity' in Pune, to provide all kinds of specialised treatment under one roof.
- It will come up in 300-acre of land area in Khed taluka of Pune.
- The project is estimated to attract investment worth over Rs. 10.000 crore.
- Indrayani Medicity will have hospitals, centres for medical research, pharmaceutical manufacturing, wellness and physiotherapy, and will be first-of-itskind city in the country to have all the treatments available at one place.

Cabinet approves establishment of WHO Global Centre for Traditional Medicine in Jamnagar, Gujarat

The Union Cabinet has approved the establishment of the WHO Global Centre for Traditional Medicine (WHO GCTM) in Jamnagar, Gujarat.

- This would be the first and only global Centre for traditional medicine across the globe, set up by the World Health Organization (WHO).
- The WHO GCTM will be established under the Ministry of AYUSH.

Cabinet approves setting up of National Land Monetization Corporation as a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) for monetization of surplus land

- The Union Cabinet has approved to set up a new company called National Land Monetization Corporation (NLMC), as a special purpose vehicle (SPV).
- NLMC will hold and monetise surplus land and building assets, of Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) and other Government agencies, that are being privatised or being shut down.
- NLMC shall be a wholly-owned Government of India company. It will be set up under the administrative jurisdiction of the Ministry of Finance.
- The initial authorized share capital of NLMC will be Rs. 5000 crore and paid-up share capital will be Rs. 150 crore.

India's largest reclining statue of Lord Buddha being built at Bodh Gaya

- India's largest reclining statue of Lord Buddha is being built in Bodh Gaya in Bihar.
- The statue of Lord Buddha is in the sleeping posture. It is being made using fiberglass. The statue will be 100 feet long and 30 feet high.
- The giant statue is being built by Buddha International Welfare Mission, one of the top Buddhist Temples in West Bengal (also known as Kolkata Temple).
- Its construction started in the year 2019.
- Bodh Gaya is the place of enlightenment of Lord Buddha, and famous pilgrimage site for Buddhism, visited by devotees from all over the world.

PM Modi inaugurates Rs 11,400 crore Pune Metro Rail Project

- The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated Pune Metro Rail Project on March 06, 2022, and also interacted with differently-abled, visually impaired students present inside the metro coach, during his 10-minute ride in the Pune Metro.
- Pune Metro Rail Project has been built at a total cost of INR 11,420 Crore. It has a total length of 33.2 km and 30 stations.
- Pune Metro is the first metro project in the country to have Aluminum body coaches, indigenously manufactured under Make in India policy of GoI.
- PM Modi also unveiled the statue of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj at the premises of the Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) and laid the foundation stone and inaugurated multiple developmental projects in Pune.

UNESCO includes Meghalaya's natural root bridges on tentative list of world heritage sites

- The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) includes Meghalaya's "Living Root Bridges or Jingkieng Jri" on a tentative list of World heritage sites. At present there areabout 100 living root bridges around 70 villages of Meghalaya's subtropical terrain region.
- Villagers, (especially Khasi and Jaintia tribal communities) build and maintain these bridges from the past for more than 600 years.
- Purpose Of The Root Bridge:Villagers of Meghalaya grow these living root bridges to cross the water bodies, they do it by training the Indian rubber fig tree (ficus elastica) on both sides of water bodies over a period of about 10 to 15 yearswhere the roots form the bridge.

India plans to start building 10 Nuclear Power Plant in 'Fleet Mode'

 India is set to put in motion construction of 10 'fleet mode' nuclear reactors over the next three years. The First Pour of Concrete (FPC) for a 700

- MegaWatts (MW) Kaiga Atomic Power Plant, Karnataka units 5 & 6 are scheduled by 2023.
- The centre had approved the construction of 10 indigenously developed Pressurised Heavy-WaterReactors (PHWRs) of 700 MegaWatts (MW) each in June 2017 with a total cost of Rs 1.05 Lakh crore

Gol sets an ambitious target of creating 220 new airports by 2025

- Jyotiraditya Scindia, the Union Civil Aviation Minister, announced that the Government of India (GoI)planned to develop as many as 220 new airports by 2025, citing the aviation industry as a major component of India's economy.
- India has progressed in both domestic and international travel since the COVID-19 pandemic.
- In the following years, cargo flights for perishable food items will be boosted by 30%, with 133new flights.
- The government also intends to build 33 new domestic cargo terminals, 15 new pilot training schools, more jobs, and a greater focus on the drone sector.

Union cabinet approves continuation of National AIDS and STD control programme till 2026

- Union Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has given its approval for the continuation of National AIDS (Acquired Immuno Deficiency Syndrome) and Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs) Control Programme (NACP) for 5 years from 1 April, 2021 to 31 March, 2026 with an outlay of Rs. 15,471.94 crore by approving phase-V of the programme.
- The Phase-IV (Extension) of National AIDS and STD Control Programme (NACP) was concluded on 31 March, 2021.
- The NACP Phase-V will work towards the attainment of United Nations' Sustainable DevelopmentGoals 3.3 of ending the HIV/AIDS epidemic as a public health threat by 2030 through

acomprehensive package of prevention, detection and treatment services.

Union cabinet approves MSP of raw jute for 2022-23

- The CCEA also approved an increase in the Minimum Support Price (MSP) of raw jute by Rs 250 to Rs 4,750 per quintal for the 2022-23 season to ensure a return of 60.53% over all India weighted average cost of production.
- The approval is based on recommendations of the Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices, and alsoon the lines of fixing the MSP at a level of at least 1.5 times all India weighted average cost of production asannounced by the Government in the Budget 2018-19. This assures a minimum of 50% as margin of profit.

Union MoS Jitendra Singh releases India's Arctic Policy in Delhi

Union Minister of State (MoS) for Earth Sciences,
 Dr Jitendra Singh released India's Arctic policy
 titled 'India and the Arctic: building a partnership

for sustainable development' in New Delhi. India is one of 13 nations holding Observer status in the Arctic Council.



- Thirteen Nonarctic States have been approved as Observers to the Arctic Council. They are France, Germany, Italy, Japan, The Netherlands, China, Poland, India, Republic of Korea, Spain, Switzerland, United Kingdom, Singapore.
- India's Arctic Policy is based on six pillars
 - Strengthening India's scientific research and cooperation,
 - Climate and environmental protection,
 - Economic and human development,
 - Transportation and connectivity,
 - Governance and international cooperation,
 - National capacity building in the Arctic region.

Indian Railways prepared National Rail Plan (NRP) for India- 2030

- For the development of a futuristic railway system by 2030, the Indian Railways has come up with 'National Rail Plan (NRP) for India-2030'. The information for the same was provided by Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, Ministry of Railways in a written reply to a question in Lok Sabha.
- Objectives behind NRP:
- i.To formulate strategies based on both operational capacities and commercial policy initiatives to increase modal share of the Railways in freight to 45%.
- ii.To create capacity ahead of demand, which in turn would also cater to future growth in demand right up to 2050.
- For the achievement of objectives, all financial models including Public Private Partnership (PPP) will be considered.

FSSAI To Start 'Health Star Rating System' for Packaged Foods

 The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) is set to introduce a new star rating system,

the "Health Star Rating System", for packaged foods. Under this, the packaged foods will display the number of stars on the Front Of Pack Label (FOPL), which indicates



how healthy or unhealthy they are depending upon the amount of salt, sugar, and fat they have.

- The Health Star Rating rates the overall nutritional profile of packaged food and assigns it a rating from ½ a star to 5 stars.5 Star means the food is healthy & the least(½) star means the food is unhealthy.
- The Health Star rating system is one of five types of labels that were considered, including Nutriscore,
- Warning Label, Multiple Traffic Lights (MTL) and Monochrome GDA.

Mumbai Becomes 1st South Asian City to Detail Net-Zero Carbon Emissions by 2050

- Mumbai, Maharashtra announced its detailed framework to 'zero out carbon emissions by 2050' and became the first city in South Asia to set such a target.
- Mumbai's target is 20 years ahead of India's target to reach net zero emissions by 2070.
- Targets also include a 30 per cent reduction in greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 2030 and 44 per cent reduction by 2040.
- Mumbai set several short-term goals for decarbonisation measures such as electrifying public transport, it plans to adopt 2,100 electric buses by 2023 at a cost of 130 billion rupees (USD \$1.7 billion).
- In 2019, Mumbai emitted an estimated 23.42 million tons of greenhouse gas or 1.8 tons per capita.

Mission Indradhanush: Odisha tops in full immunization with 90.5% coverage

- According to the National Family Health Survey (NFHS)-5, Odisha became top state in the list of full immunisation in India with 90.5 per cent coverage under Mission Indradhanush.
- Intensified Mission Indradhanush 4.0 (IMI) was rolled out on 7 March 2022, in Odisha to provide
- preventive health care for mothers and children and for boosting full immunization coverage.
- 20 districts of Odisha were found above 90 percent in full immunization and remaining 10 districts were less than 90 percent.
- The diseases included in full immunization are tuberculosis, polio, diphtheria, jaundice, tetanus, whooping cough, brain fever, HIV, measles, pneumonia, diarrhoea, rubella, Japanese fever, and others.
- Mission Indradhanush is a healthcare initiative of Government of India, launched on December 25, 2014.

STATES

Assam and Meghalaya signed a pact to resolve 5 decade old border dispute in six places

- On March 29, 2022, the Chief Minister of Assam Himanta Biswa Sarma and the Chief Minister of Meghalaya Conrad Sangma in the presence of Union Home Minister Amit Shah had signed a pact to resolve the protracted border dispute in six out of twelve places along the 884.9 Kilometre border between the two states.
- The First Phase of settlement covers 36 villages situated in six places (Hahim, Gizang, Tarabari, Boklapara, Khanapara-Pilingkata, Ratacherra) out of twelve covering an area of 36.79 square kilometres.
- According to which a joint final set of recommendations were made – out of 36.79 square kilometres of disputed area taken up for settlement, Assam will get full control of 18.51 square kilometres and Meghalaya would get 18.28 square kilometres.
- The next step will involve delineation and demarcation of the boundary by Survey of India in the presence of representatives from both governments. It will then proceed for Parliamentary approval.
- Assam shares a 2743 kilometre boundary with Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland and West Bengal.
- Assam has border disputes with Nagaland, Mizoram, Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh.

Maharashtra launches scheme to offer personal loans for prisoners

• The Maharashtra government has introduced a scheme that allows prisoners to obtain personal loans from banks of up to Rs. 50,000 to help their families improve their living conditions and meet expenses related to their legal matters. It will be a first of its kind initiative in our country.

- The Maharashtra State Co-operative Bank would provide loans up to 50,000 under the scheme at a 7% interest rate. The scheme would be implemented in Yerawada Central Jail in Pune, Maharashtra, on a pilot basis.
- It is the first innovative scheme in India that offers prisoners a loan based on the income earned while working in a prison. It needs no guarantor and will be disbursed on a personal bond.
- This type of loan is called a "khavti" loan, and benefits approximately 1,055 prisoners.

Pramod Sawant takes Oath as Goa's CM for 2nd consecutive term

 Pramod Sawant took oath as the Chief Minister (CM) of Goa, for a second consecutive term (2022-

2027) at the Dr Shyama Prasad Mukherjee stadium in Taleigao, Goa.



- The Governor of Goa, P S
 - Sreedharan Pillai administered the oath of office and secrecy to Pramod Sawant.
- In state Assembly elections 2022, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) emerged as the single largest party in Goa by winning 20 of the 40 seats in Goa.

Yogi Adityanath takes oath as Uttar Pradesh CM

 Yogi Adityanath took oath as the Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh (UP) for the second term in office.



Governor of UP, Anandiben Patel administered the oath of office and secrecy to Yogi Adityanath along with 52

ministers in the ceremony organized at Atal Bihari Vajpayee Ekana Stadium in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh.

- The Yogi Adityanath-led BJP (Bharatiya Janata Party) government created history with its second tenure as no other CM has been able to repeat a government in the state in 37 years.
- He has become the first such BJP leader to become the CM for the second consecutive term.
- The party secured more than 250 seats out of 403 in the state assembly elections 2022, and become the first party in over three decades to form a government for a second consecutive time in the state.
- Only five CMs, including Adityanath, have won a second consecutive term in UP ever. The four CMs before him to do so were Sampurnananda in 1957, Chandrabhanu Gupta in 1962, Hemwati Nandan Bahuguna in 1974 and Narayan Dutt Tiwari in 1985.

Kerala Tourism Dept. Launches 24/7 WhatsApp Chatbot 'Maya'

- The Tourism Minister of Kerala, P A Mohamed Riyas launched 'Maya', a 24×7 working WhatsApp chatbot to provide information and updates related to the tourism ecosystem in Kerala.
- Billed as the first such service in the country, Maya shares all information on destinations, experiences, stay, travel and a whole lot of details that will keep them updated about the places they travel through or stay in the State.

SIDBI accredits Odisha with Rs. 837 Crore for MSME Clusters

- The Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) has approved a Rs. 837 crore grant to the Government of Odisha under its SIDBI Cluster Development Fund (SCDF) to promote and develop 18 micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSME) infrastructure projects in Odisha.
- The projects include the development of five new MSME parks, the construction of 11 worker's hostels and two projects to support MSME infrastructure and will be implemented by the Odisha Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation (IDCO).

• It has also inked an agreement with the state to set up Project Management Unit (PMU) to design schemes and programmes that strengthens the MSME ecosystem. So far, SIDBI has signed Memorandum of Understandings (MoUs) with around 15 states to set up PMUs.

Pushkar Singh Dhami sworn in as 11th Chief Minister of Uttarakhand

 On 23, March 2022, Pushkar Singh Dhami, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader and son of an

ex-serviceman took oath as 11th Chief Minister of Uttarakhand for his second consecutive term in Dehradun's



Parade Ground administered by the Governor Lt Gen (retd) Gurmit Singh.

- Dhami lost the election to Congress's Bhuwan Kapri by 6,932 votes in Khatima constituency.
- He has to get re-elected from any of the constituencies of Uttarakhand within a period of six months post which he ceases to be a Minister (Article 164(4) of Indian Constitution).

Bihar became first state to implement dynamic map for villages to track land ownership

- Bihar as a part of its land reforms initiative, has introduced the concept of dynamic map for villages, which will get updated every time land ownership changes hands. The move is mainly aimed to curb the legal disputes regarding land.
- According to the Bihar government, the state has seen almost 37,000 cases of some land dispute since February 2021.
- The initiative is also in line with the mandate of Bihar Land Mutation Amendment Bill, 2021 which makes mutation of maps mandatory.
- The mutation process will now pass through three stages – first, a change in the text; second, a change in the land parcel; and third, a modification of the survey map.

Nagaland became first state to go paperless assembly proceeding under NeVA

- The North Eastern state of Nagaland became the first legislative state assembly in India to implement
 - paperless proceedings under National e-Vidhan Application (NeVA).
- The NeVA initiative encourages paperless operations and reflects the government's commitment towards Ashta Lakshmi.



- The Nagaland Assembly Secretariat has attached a tablet or e-book for all the 60 members of the State Assembly.
- The NeVA is used to handle diverse House Business smartly by enumerating details regarding member contact details, rules of procedure, list of business, notices, bulletins, bills, starred/unstarred questions and answers, papers laid, committee reports etc. in their handheld devices/tablets.
- National e-Vidhan Application (NeVA) Is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme by Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs with the funding ratio of 90: 10 by Centre and State respectively

Narasingapettai Nagaswaram a Music Instrument of Tamil Nadu gets GI tag

- The Narasingapettai Nagaswaram, a classical wind music instrument, hand crafted in Narasingapettai
- Village in Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu(TN) got the Geographical Indication (GI) Tag under the category of musical instruments of class 15 from Geographical Indications Registry.
- On behalf of Thanjavur Musical Instruments Workers Co-operative Cottage Industrial Society Limited, the application for receiving the GI tag for Narasingapettai Nagaswaram Dating back to the 13th century was filed by Tamil Nadu's Nodal Officer.

Kerala becomes first state to introduce carbon-neutral farming

- Kerala became the first state in India to introduce carbon-neutral agricultural practices in select locations for better soil health.
- The Kerala Government in its Budget 2022-23, allocated ₹6 crore for introducing Carbon-neutral farming methods in the state.
- In the first phase, the Agriculture Department will implement the carbon-neutral farming in 13 farms including in tribal areas and steps were also taken to convert the State Seed Farm at Aluva to a carbonneutral farm.
- In the second phase, model carbon-neutral farms will be developed in all the 140 Assembly constituencies.
- Carbon-neutral farming is the technique of decreasing carbon emissions and aid carbon storage in the soil, through techniques such as Integrated farming methods, Crop rotation, Fertigation, Precision Farming methods, Shifting how the soil is irrigated, and restricting the haphazard use of Fertiliser application.

N Biren Singh sworn in as Manipur CM for Second Term

• On March 21, 2022, Nongthombam (N) Biren Singh, sworn in as the Chief Minister of Manipur

the for second consecutive term. The oath of office was administered by Manipur Governor Ganesan at the Raj Bhawan in Imphal, Manipur.He is the 12th CM of



Telangana becomes first state in India to implement Crop Diversification Index

- Telangana turned out to be the first state in India to adopt the Crop Diversification Index (CDI) by way of recording their crop diversification pattern in the form of an index.
- According to the CDI, Telangana grows 77 varieties of crops, out of which only 10 crops (mostly grains) are chosen for crop diversification.
- The districts of Nirmal, Vikarabad, and Sangareddy emerge as the most



diverse, ranking in the top 3 in the state.

 The least diversified districts (bottom 3) in the state in terms of crop diversification would be Peddapalli, Karimnagar, and Suryapet, where paddy is the most cultivated crop, showing a decrease in the cropping areas of maize and an increase in the cropping areas of cotton.

About Crop Diversification Index (CDI):

- All the areas under the 77 different crops, which include food, non-food, and cash crops, as well as the areas under floriculture practices, have been considered to calculate the index.
- The index has a starting value of ONE representing the percentage of total cultivated area devoted to a single crop.
- Many districts in the state have index values ranging from 0 to 5, and the higher the value, the greater the agricultural diversification.
- The index would serve as the baseline for future crop diversification in the state.
- Next to paddy and maize, which are the traditionally grown crops in the state, pulses were the most preferred crops by the farmers.

West Bengal Celebrates 'Dol Utsav' Welcoming Spring Season

- On 18 March 2022, West Bengal celebrated the 'Dol Utsav' or 'Dol Jatra', the festival of colors, marking the onset of spring season.
- The festival is dedicated to Lord Krishna and Radha and celebrated on the full moon day.
- It also marks the last festival of the year as per the Bengali calendar.
- The majestic festival is celebrated by throwing 'gulaal' or 'aabir' on others and by singing and dancing in cultural programs.
- In Eastern region of India, the festival of spring is celebrated as Dol Jatra, Dol Purnima, Dol Utsav and Basanta Utsav.

- The oath taking ceremony was attended by Delhi CM and AAP national convener Arvind Kejriwal, deputy CM Manish Sisodia, and others.
- The AAP in Punjab won 92 seats out of 117 seats in the Punjab Assembly elections 2022.
- Bhagwant Singh Mann was a former actor, comedian and satirist.

Karnataka launches India's 1st ever Digital Water Databank 'AQVERIUM'

- The Information Technology (IT) Minister of Karnataka, Chikkakalya Narayanappa (CN) Ashwath Narayan launched India's first ever digital water databank 'AQVERIUM' in Bengaluru, Karnataka.
- AQVERIUM is an initiative of the Bengaluruheadquartered Digital Startup – AquaKraft Digital Ventures Pvt Ltd, a newly formed subsidiary of AquaKraft Projects Private Limited, the flagship company of AquaKraft Group Ventures.

AP's FM Buggana Rajendranath Presented Rs 2.56 lakh cr State Budget for 2022-23

 On March 11, 2022, the Finance Minister (FM) of Andhra Pradesh (AP), Buggana Rajendranath, presented AP's Budget for 2022-23 with a proposed expenditure of Rs 2.56 lakh crore and a projected revenue deficit of Rs 17,036 crore. After that, Kurasala Kannababu, AP's Agriculture Minister presented the State's Agriculture Budget for 2022-23 with an outlay of Rs 43,052.78 crore.

Financial Parameters:

- i.The projected revenue deficit is Rs 17,036 crore i.e. 1.27% of GSDP (Gross State Domestic Product)
- ii.The fiscal deficit in FY23 is expected to be Rs 48,724 crore i.e. 3.64% of the GSDP.
- iii.The total public debt of the state is projected to increase up to Rs 4,39,394.35 crore in 2022-23.
- iv.A sum of Rs 21,805 crore has been earmarked for debt servicing in FY23.

Tripura Govt. announces Mukhyamantri Chaa Srami Kalyan Prakalpa for tea workers

- As a step towards bringing the 7000 tea garden workers of Tripura under social security net, the Tripura Government has announced a special scheme 'Mukhyamantri Chaa Srami Kalyan Prakalpa', allotting Rs. 85 crores for its implementation.
- About 75% of the 7000 tea garden workers are women and they produce nearly 90 lakh kilograms of tea through 54 tea estates & 21 tea processing factories across the state. The tea production is mainly distributed in North Tripura, Sepahijala, Unakoti and West Tripura districts.
- This special scheme would ensure housing, rations and financial support to the tea garden workers by integrating the facilities that are entitled to them, by the state government and the central government.

Karnataka Govt. Introduces W@W Programme to Integrate Women into Workforce

The Government of Karnataka launched Women@Work (W@W) Programme, as an attempt to create an equitable, inclusive and equal world for women in workplaces at an even organized jointly by the Karnataka Digital Economy Mission (KDEM), KTECH and the Karnataka Skill Development Corporation.

ECONOMY AND BANKING

Cabinet approves USD 808 million for Raising and Accelerating MSME Performance

- The Union Cabinet approved USD 808 million (Rs 6,062.45 crore) for a new World Bank (WB) assisted scheme 'Raising and Accelerating MSME Performance (RAMP)' which will probably be initiated in FY23 to directly or indirectly benefit all 63 million MSMEs.
- Out of the total amount, Rs 3,750 crore (\$ 500 million) will be a loan from WB, and the rest Rs 2,312.45 crore (\$ 308 million) will be funded by the government of India.
- RAMP was formulated on the lines of the recommendations made by Upendra Kumar (UK) Sinha
- Committee, Kundapur Vaman (KV) Kamath Committee and Economic Advisory Council to the PrimeMinister (PMEAC).
- It is premised upon two areas viz. strengthening institutions and governance of the MSME programme, and support to market access, firm capabilities and access to finance.

Cabinet approves release of an additional instalment of DA due from Jan 01, 2022

- To compensate for the price rise, the Union Cabinet also gave its approval to release an additionalinstalment of Dearness Allowance (DA) to Central Government employees and Dearness Relief (DR) topensioner's w.e.f. January 1, 2022 representing an increase of 3% to 34% from the existing rate of 31% of the Basic Pay/Pension.
- This increase is in accordance with the accepted formula, which is based on the recommendations of the 7th Central Pay Commission.
- The combined cost on account of both DA and DR will be Rs.9,544.50 crore per annum for the Central Government.

- This will benefit about 47.68 lakh Central Government employees and 68.62 lakh pensioners.
- In October 2021, the Cabinet had hiked the two allowances by 3% to 31% w.e.f. July 1, 2021.

Govt. of India Extends Scope of ECLGS for MSMEs for 1 Year till March 31, 2023

- The National Credit Guarantee Trustee Company Limited (NCGTC) has extended the **EmergencyCredit** Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) for 1 yearfrom March 2022, to March 31,2023,in response to Union Finance & Corporate Affairs Minister NirmalaSitharaman's announcement in the Union Budget 2022-23.
- It has also increased the total amount to be sanctioned under the scheme from Rs 4.5 lakh crores to Rs 5lakh crores.
- The NCGTC has issued modifications to the operational guidelines for ECLGS 3.0, following thesuggestions received in the post Budget consultations held by the Finance Minister and extendedrelief to hospitality, civil aviation and related enterprises under the scheme.

Rs 40,009 crore released under Jal Jeevan Mission in 2021-22; Rs. 60,000 crore budget allocated for 2022-23

- As per the government data, Rs. 40,009 crore grant was released to States/ UTs under Jal Jeevan Mission in the financial year 2021-22. The total allocation under the scheme in FY2021-22 was Rs 50,000 crore.
- Further, the Cenral Government has enhanced the budget under Jal Jeevan Mission for financial year 2022-23 to Rs. 60,000 Crore.
- Since the launch of Jal Jeevan Mission on August 15, 2019, more than 6 Crore households have been provided with tap water connections, so far.

 The Jal Jeevan Mission was launched to provide safe and adequate drinking water through individual household tap connections by 2024 to all households in rural India.

Government keeps interest rates on small savings schemes unchanged for Q1 of 2022-23 (April-June 2022)

- The Ministry of Finance has decided to keep the interest rates unchanged on small savings schemes or post office schemes for the Quarter -1 of FY2022-23 (April-June 2022).
- The interest rates on the various instruments for April-June 2022 range from 4.0 percent to 7.6 percent.
- It must be noted that the Government notifies the Interest rates for small savings schemes on a quarterly basis.
- This is the eighth consecutive quarter when the interest rates on small savings instruments remained unchanged.

- Tech giant Google Pay has launched 'Tap to Pay for UPI', a new functionality to bring the seamless convenience of Tap to Pay to Unified Payments Interface (UPI).
- The initiative has been launched in collaboration with Pine Labs.So far, Tap to Pay facility was only available for cards.

CBDT signed 62 Advance Pricing Agreements (APAs) in FY 2021-22

- The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) signed 62 Advance Pricing Agreements (APA) with Indian taxpayers in FY 2021-22.
- This included 13 Bilateral APAs (consequent to Mutual Agreement between India and its treaty partners) and 49 Unilateral APAs.
- With this, the total number of APAs has gone up to 421, since inception of the APA program.
- In the previous two years, total APAs signed included 31 APAs in FY 2020-21 and 57 APAs in FY 2019-20.

 An advance pricing agreement (APA) is a multilateral or bilateral agreement between a tax authority and a taxpayer on transfer pricing methodology (TPM), for a set of international transactions issued for multiple years.

ADB and HSBC India partners to establish \$100 million Partial Guarantee Program for Microfinance in India

- Manila-based Asian Development Bank (ADB) has signed an agreement with HSBC India to establish a USD 100 million partial guarantee programme to support micro-borrowers with special weightage to women-run micro-enterprises across India.
- Under the deal, HSBC will expand its lending to microfinance institutions (MFIs) and non-bank finance companies, while multilateral funding agency, ADB will provide partial guarantee to the loans.
- The initiative will support more than 4 lakh borrowers.
- It has also been decided that an aggregated financing equivalent to \$30 million will be disbursed to three MFIs across India by April 2022.

Microsoft launches 'Startups Founders Hub' platform to empower startups in India

- Tech giant Microsoft launched a new digital and inclusive platform for startup founders in India on March 31, 2022.
- The platform called as 'Microsoft for Startups Founders Hub' in India, will support startup founders in India at every stage of their startup journey.
- This platform will offer over USD 300,000 worth of benefits and credits to startups, including free access to the technology, tools, and resources from the tech giant and partners.
- The initiative will help the Startups to gain mentorship and skilling opportunities with industry experts and Microsoft Learn.

Mortgage lender HDFC to merge with HDFC Bank

 Mortgage lender HDFC has announced merger with HDFC Bank. The merger of two financial

Ltd and HDFC
Bank comes

speculation around
the same and has
set the stage for



one of the biggest deals in the Indian financial sector.

- As per the deal, HDFC Ltd with AUM of Rs 5.26 trillion will merge with HDFC Bank with market cap pf Rs 8.35 trillion.
- All shareholders of HDFC Limited will receive 42 shares of HDFC Bank for every 25 shares of HDFC Ltd.
- Following the execution of the transaction, any shareholding of HDFC Ltd in HDFC Bank will be dissolved and the Bank will become a 100% publicly owned entity. Existing share holders of HDFC Ltd will own 41% stake / shares of HDFC Bank.

Central govt sets Rs 1-trillion infrastructure lending target for NaBFID

 Central Government has set a target of Rs 1-trillion for the new Development Finance Institution (DFI)

namely 'National Bank for Financial Infrastructure and Development (NaBFID)' for sanctioning loans to the infrastructure sector in FY23. NaBFID will get a



10-year tax concession so that it can provide longterm funds at an affordable cost to the infrastructure sector.

 In October 2021, the government hadappointed Kundapur Vaman Kamath as the chairman of NaBFID

Central Bank of India ties up with Kwik.ID to digitize customer onboarding

- Central Bank of India (CBI) partnered with Kwik.ID to implement digital Know Your Customer (KYC), video KYC and eKYC for its network across India.
- The partnership will support the implementation of its digital transformation agenda and also help in digital finance initiatives.
- Kwik.ID is India's fastest and first ever AI-based fully compliant Video KYC solution and a flagshipproduct by Think360.ai. It has the target to digitize 10 million customers' onboarding annually and streamline their end-to-end processes.
- Earlier, it collaborated with Bank of Baroda, RBL Bank, Bajaj Finserv and Spice Money, among others.

Central Govt's total liabilities rise to Rs 128.41 lakh cr in Q3FY22

- In accordance with the latest public debt management report by the Ministry of Finance, the Central Government's total liabilities rose to Rs 128.41 lakh crore in December quarter (Q3FY22) from Rs 125.71 lakh crore in Q2FY22. This increase reflects a quarter-on-quarter increase of 2.15%.
- In absolute terms, the total liabilities, including liabilities under the 'Public Account' of the government, jumped to Rs 1,28,41,996 crore in Q3FY22 as compared to Rs 1,25,71,747 crore in Q2FY22.
- Public debt accounted for 91.60% of the total outstanding liabilities in Q3FY22. Nearly 25% of the outstanding dated securities had a residual maturity of less than 5 years.
- The yields on the 10-year benchmark security increased from 6.22% in Q2FY22 to 6.45% in Q3FY22.
- The ownership pattern of the central government securities indicates that the share of commercial banks stood at 35.40% in Q3FY22, lower than 37.82% in Q2FY22.

India's 2022 GDP Growth Downgraded to 4.6% amid Ukraine-Russia War: UNCTAD Report

- The United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) in an update to its Trade and Development report published March 24, 2022 titled 'Tapering in a time of conflict' has downgraded India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth for 2022 by -2.1% to 4.6% from 6.7% amid ongoing Ukraine-Russia War.
- On the global front, it also declined the economic growth projection for 2022 by -1% to 2.6% from 3.6%.

Bank of India invests Rs 108.81 crore in NARCL

- The Bank of India(BoI) has invested around Rs 108.81 crore in National Asset Reconstruction Company Limited(NARCL), under the preferential share issue. Following this, BoI's shareholding in NARCL is set to become 9% as of 21st March 2022.
- NARCL is an asset reconstruction company backed by the government, Incorporated in July 2021.

HDFC Mutual Fund to launch HDFC Defence Fund, India's first Defence Fund

- HDFC Mutual Fund has filed a scheme information document (SID) with the Securities and Exchange Board of India(SEBI) to launch HDFC Defence Fund, India's first Defence Fund.
- This open-ended equity scheme will be investing in defence & allied sector companies (aerospace, explosives, shipbuilding, industries /stocks present on the SIDM (Society of Indian Defence Manufacturers) list).
- This will offer Units for Sale / Switch-in and Redemption / Switch-out on every Business Day at NAV based prices when the Scheme re-opens for ongoing transactions (after the NFO).
- This fund will be benchmarked to the recently introduced Nifty India Defence Index TRI (Total Returns Index).

SIDBI Inks MoU with Meghalaya to Develop MSME Ecosystem

- The Small Industries Development Bank of India Memorandum (SIDBI) has signed a Understanding with Meghalaya (MoU) Infrastructure Development Finance and Corporation Limited (MiDFC), Government of Meghalaya.
- Under the MoU, SIDBI and the Government of Meghalaya will work in tandem to facilitate the development of the Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) ecosystem in Meghalaya.
- SIDBI also encourages the Government of Meghalaya to make use of the low-cost financing available for the development of the MSME infrastructure in the state under the SIDBI Cluster Development Fund (SCDF).

SBI signs co-lending pact with 5 HFCs for affordable housing

- State Bank of India (SBI), India's largest lender, has entered into a co-lending partnership with five Housing Finance Companies (HFCs) to provide affordable housing loans to the underserved and unserved sections of society as per Reserve Bank of India (RBI) guidelines.
- The five HFCs are: PNB Housing Finance, IIFL Home Finance, Shriram Housing Finance, Edelweiss Housing Finance, and Capri Global Housing Finance.
- This tie-up will help to accelerate effective and affordable credit to economically weaker sections (EWS) and the informal sector & contribute to the Government of India's vision of 'Housing for All by 2024'.

Airtel Payments Bank partners with ICICI Lombard for smartphone insurance

 Airtel Payments Bank signed an agreement with ICICI Lombard General Insurance Company (ICICI Lombard) to provide smartphone insurance which offers financial protection against damages. It will boost the mobile insurance industry in India.

- .Under the agreement, the mobile insurance amount equal to the purchase price of the smartphones will be provided.
- The smartphone price under the range of Rs 10,000 to Rs1,00,000 will be considered. The customers have to pay a monthly premium of Rs 1,299 through the Airtel Thanks App and they will get the insurance on their own within 10 days of making the purchase.

India's merchandise exports touched new peak of \$400 billion in FY22

- The merchandise exports sector of India successfully met the \$400 billion target which was set for 2021-22 (FY22), nine days ahead of schedule, which translated into a 37% increase over exports worth \$292 billion in FY21.
- The exports in India contracted almost 7% in FY21 from a year before to \$292 billion, due to Covid outbreak. Later with the drastic increase in demand and advanced economies the export sector recovered itself.
- The highest merchandise export of \$330 billion was achieved in FY19. It witnessed the fluctuations between \$250 billion and \$330 billion a year since FY11.
- The services exports are also estimated to exceed the target of \$250 billion.
- The target for Services exports was to achieve \$206 billion in FY21 and \$225 billion for FY22.
- .The significant increase is witnessed in the various sectors such as engineering goods, petroleum products, garments and textiles, and chemicals.

NABARD allocates Rs. 4,013 crore financial assistance to Odisha

• The National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) has sanctioned a financial assistance of Rs. 4,013 crores to Odisha under the Rural Infrastructure Development Fund (RIDF) for the financial year 2021-2022, and Odisha has got a major share of NABARD's infrastructure funds, the highest in India.

- With this the total sanction has crossed Rs 32,100 crore for Odisha since the inception of the RIDF.
- The RIDF is classified under three broad categories: Agriculture and related sector; Social sector; and Rural connectivity.
- Out of the total fund allocated under the RIDF, about Rs 2,568 crore is allotted for construction of rural roads and bridges.
- It involves the creation or upgrading of roads for 2000 km and bridges for a length of 17.13 km, which would benefit around 10 lakh people.
- The implementation of nine mega piped water supply projects worth Rs. 840 crores will bring clean, treated, and safe drinking water to almost 17 lakh rural inhabitants in Odisha.
- A total of Rs 605 crore has been allocated for the development of infrastructure in the agriculture, related, and irrigation sectors. It includes the Kusumi irrigation project; livestock vaccine production unit, cluster lift irrigation and flood protection projects.

Rupeek, NAPS Partners to launch of 'Rupeek Academy' to build gold appraisers

- Rupeek (Rupeek Fintech Pvt Ltd.), India's leading asset-backed digital lending platform announced the launch of 'Rupeek Academy' in collaboration with the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS), an initiative by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC). This aims to attract young talent who are looking for a career opportunity in the gold loan industry of India.
- The Rupeek Academy programme developed with NSDC is a first of its kind upskilling programme in the industry.
- 1-year comprehensive programme aims to create a centre for excellence in developing and managing talent for gold appraisers, to balance the demand against the availability of talent issues.
- India has USD 2 trillion worth of gold assets and the programme aims to monetize them by employing gold appraisers.

Fitch declines India's Growth Forecast for FY23 to 8.5% from 10.3%

- On March 22, 2022, Rating agency Fitch in its 'Global economic Outlook-March 2022' declined India's growth forecast for FY23 (2022-2023) by 1.8 percentage points (pp) to 8.5% from 10.3% due to high energy prices amid Russia-Ukraine war.
- On the other hand, for FY22, the agency has increased the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth by 0.6 pp to 8.7% from 8.1%.
- For 2023-24, it is estimated at 7 per cent.
- Global Scenario: For FY22, the agency declined the world GDP growth forecast by 0.7 pp to 3.5% from 4.2%.
- For FY23, it also revised down world growth by 0.2pp to 2.8% from 3%.

NPCI to launch 'On-Device Wallet-UPI Lite for small value transactions' in offline mode

- The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) will launch On-Device Wallet i.e. 'UPI Lite' for UPI users which will enable small value transactions in an offline mode. UPI stands for (Unified Payments Interface).
- This functionality enables transactions without additional factor authentication (AFA) or a UPI PIN (Personal Identification Number).
 Limits in UPI Lite:
- Upper Limit of payment transaction- Rs 200
- Total limit of balance for an On-Device Wallet- Rs 2,000 at any point of time
- Reasons behind this launch: As per various studies, about half the UPI transactions have a transaction value of up to Rs 200, and about 75% of the total volume of retail transactions (including cash) in India are below Rs 100. Also, in January 2022, Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) notified a framework for facilitating small value digital payments in offline mode. So, catering to both scenarios, this development has been made.

SBI to Grant USD 1 billion credit line to Sri Lanka to recover from economic crisis

- In light of the country's deteriorating economic circumstances, India announced a USD 1 billion Line of Credit (LOC) to Sri Lanka as part of its financial assistance to deal with its economic crisis.
- An agreement extending the LOC was signed between SBI and Government of Sri Lanka for the procurement of food, medicine, and other essential items.
- Previously, the Export-Import Bank of India (EXIM Bank) had extended an LOC of USD 500 million to Sri Lanka, which is in the midst of a financial crisis, to finance the purchase of petroleum goods.

Kotak Mahindra Bank becomes 1st Indian Bank to sign MoU with **Business France**

- On 16 March, Kotak Mahindra Bank Ltd (KMBL) signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Business France, a French National agency involved in exports and international investments in France, to provide support to companies in the Indo-French corridor.
- The KMBL became the first Indian bank to sign a MoU with Business France.
- The agreement ceremony held in France was chaired by Eric Fajole, Regional Director, French Embassy in India and Sudha Balakrishnan, Business Head, MNC Banking Group, Kotak Mahindra Bank.

SBI to set up Innovation, Incubation **Acceleration** Centre and at Hyderabad, Telangana

- The State Bank of India (SBI) will set up an Innovation, Incubation and Acceleration Centre (IIAC) at
- Hyderabad, Telangana which will be operational in six to nine months of on-boarding a consultant.
- This Centre will be the bank's in-house capability to enhance its current performance and drive higher top-line growth through innovation.

It will help the bank to develop a set of technologies, knowledge, and skills for the introduction of new products and services.

India Ranks 5th in Terms of Market Cap. Enters World's Top 5 Club for the 1st Time

- As per Bloomberg's recent data on Market capitalization, for the 1st time, India's equities market has entered the world's top 5 in terms of market capitalization. India is ranked 5th with an overall market capitalization of USD 3.21 trillion.
- The US tops the ranking with an overall market cap of USD 47.32 trillion, followed by China (USD 11.52 trillion), Japan (USD 6 trillion) and Hong Kong (USD 5.55 trillion). The total world market cap stands at USD 109.22 trillion.
- India has climbed two positions, despite a 7.4% drop in its market cap.
- India's market cap has surpassed the United Kingdom (UK) ranked 6th with M-Cap of USD 3.19 trillion, Saudi Arabia ranked 7th with M-Cap of USD 3.18 trillion. Canada ranked 8th with M-Cap of USD 3.18 trillion, France ranked 9th with M-Cap of USD 2.89 trillion and Germany ranked 10th with M-Cap of USD 2.29 trillion.

NSE, IBJA partner to set up 1st **Domestic Bullion Spot Exchange** under SEBI

- National Stock Exchange of India Ltd (NSE) and India Bullion and Jewellers Association Ltd (IBJA) have joined hands to launch the Domestic Bullion Spot Exchange in line with SEBI (Securities and Exchange Board of India) guidelines. This will be for the first time that a domestic bullion spot exchange is being set up under the aegis of SEBI.
- This exchange is conceptualized taking into consideration the industry requirements and shall integrate transactions of bullion dealers, jewelers, retailers and consumers on one single platform.
- India is the second-largest consumer of gold.

EPFO sets its interest rates on PF for 2021-22 at the lowest level

- The Employees' Provident Fund Organization (EPFO) has set the interest rate on Provident Fund Deposits for 2021-22 at 8.1%, up from 8.5% in the previous fiscal year 2020-21
- This decision was taken by the Central Board of Trustees (CBT), the apex decision-making body of the EPFO, and will be sent to the Ministry of Finance for consensus. The EPFO provides the rate of interest only after it has been ratified by the government through the Finance Ministry.
- The EPF interest rate stood at 8 per cent in 1977-78, and this 8.1% is the lowest it has been in more than four decades. This interest rate was set by the retirement fund body for its approximately 50 million subscribers for the current fiscal year ending March 31.
- The possible reason behind this decision is the low earnings of EPFO due to the COVID-19 pandemic. It delayed its payments for 2019–20 and paid the interest in two instalments, deriving from two sources of its investments—8.15% from debt investments and 0.35% from the equity portfolio.

IIFL Securities launches India's 1st primary markets investment platform, OneUp

- On March 11, 2022, the IIFL Securities Limited (Formerly India Infoline Limited) launched India's first primary markets investment platform, 'OneUp' for investing in initial public offerings (IPOs), nonconvertible debentures (NCDs) and sovereign gold bonds (SGBs), among others.
- It enables buyers to analyse, transact and handle new investment alternatives, all on one single platform. The benefits of the platforms can be utilized by IIFL Securities and non-IIFL Securities clients with none signup necessities.

CRISIL Retains India's GDP Growth at 7.8% in FY23

 CRISIL Ratings Limited, a domestic rating agency and a subsidiary of CRISIL Limited has reiterated its december 2021 forecast of India's Gross

- Domestic Product (GDP) at 7.8% for FY23 despite the Russia-Ukraine war.
- The war is pushing the oil and commodity prices upwards which affects global growth and also India's growth. The Brent crude has been traded as high as USD 139 per barrel and as low as USD 105 per barrel recently.
- CRISIL also highlighted that the average Consumer Price Index (CPI) based inflation will be at 5.4% in FY23 if the price of crude oil averages USD 85-90per barrel.

LivQuik becomes 1st PPI issuer to achieve RBI's PPI interoperability guidelines

- LivQuik becomes the first Prepaid Payment Instrument (PPI) issuer to have achieved full interoperability as mandated by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for their PPIs.
- RBI, in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 18 read with Section 10(2) of the Payment and Settlement Systems Act, 2007 (PSS Act) mandated all PPI Issuers to facilitate interoperability for full-KYC (Know Your Customers) wallets by March 31, 2022.
- LivQuik has partnered with Chennai (Tamil Nadu) headquartered M2P Fintech to enable UPI on PPI.

RBI bars Paytm Payments Bank from Onboarding New Customers

- On March 11, 2022, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in exercise of its powers under section 35A of the Banking Regulation (BR) Act, 1949 bars Paytm Payments Bank Limited (PPBL) from onboarding new customers with immediate effect due to material supervisory concerns.
- PPBL was also directed by the apex bank to appoint an IT audit firm to conduct a comprehensive audit of its IT (Information Technology) system.
- PPBL will be allowed to make new customers subject to specific permission from the RBI after reviewing the IT auditor's report.
- In 2021, PPBL received RBI's approval to function as a scheduled payments bank.

RBI UPDATES

RBI established Varnika Ink Manufacturing Facility in Mysuru, Karnataka

- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta
 Das has dedicated the Varnika ink manufacturing
 facility at Mysuru in Karnataka. The facility is a
 unit of Bharatiya Reserve Bank Note Mudran
 Private Limited (BRBNMPL), a wholly owned
 subsidiary of the RBI.
- As a push towards the "Make in India" strategy, "Varnika" is established with a 1,500 Metric Ton(MT) annual ink manufacturing capacity to improve bank note security and ensure that all banknote printing inks are manufactured indigenously.
- He has also placed the foundation stone for for BRBNMPL's Learning and Development Centre (LDC) inMysuru, which would help India's currency production eco-system strengthen human resource capabilityand become a global centre of excellence.

RBI extends timeline for banks to use lockable cassettes in ATMs by a year to March 31, 2023

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) had advised banks to consider using lockable cassettes in their ATMs, which shall be swapped at the time of cash replenishment.
- Banks were directed to implement the lockable cassette swap in a phased manner, such that at least one-third ATMs operated by them is covered every year, while all ATMs achieve cassette swap by March 31, 2021.
- However, this deadline was later extended to March 31, 2022.
- Further, upon receiving representations from various banks for facing difficulties in meeting the timeline, RBI has further extended the timeline for implementation of cassette swap in all ATMs by a year till March 31, 2023.

RBI set WMA Limit for Govt. of India for the first half of the FY2022-23 at Rs 1,50,000 crore

- The Reserve Bank of India has set the limit for Ways and Means Advances (WMA) for Central Government for the first half of the financial year 2022-23 (April 2022 to September 2022) at Rs. 1,50,000 crore.
- The Reserve Bank may trigger fresh floatation of market loans when the Government of India utilises
 75 per cent of the WMA limit.
- The interest rate on WMA/Overdraft will be:
- WMA: Repo Rate
- Overdraft: Two percent above the Repo Rate

RBI releases framework for geotagging payment system touchpoints

- On March 25, 2022, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued a framework for geo-tagging of payment system touch points/acceptance infrastructure under Section 10 (2) read with Section 18 of Payment and Settlement Systems Act, 2007 (Act 51 of 2007).
- This system will be deployed by banks / non-bank Payment System Operators (PSOs) to ensure proper monitoring of the availability of payment acceptance infrastructure.
- The framework was issued on the lines of the Monetary Policy Statement 2020-21 of October 08, 2021

Key Features of Framework:

- All banks / Non-bank PSOs will maintain a registry with accurate location of all payment touch points across the country, including Merchant-related information and Payment acceptance infrastructure details.
- Geo-tagging information in respect to PoS terminals and Paper-based/Soft QR (Quick

Response) Codes should be submitted to the Reserve Bank.

 All banks / Non-bank PSOs should report information on payment touch points to the RBI through its' Centralised Information Management System (CIMS) in .txt / CSV file format.

RBIH launched in Bengaluru; Kris Gopalakrishnan is 1st Chairman of RBIH

- On March 24, 2022, the Governor of Reserve Bank of India (RBI), Shaktikanta Das, inaugurated the Reserve Bank Innovation Hub (RBIH) in Bengaluru, Karnataka. It has been set up as a Section 8 company under Companies Act, 2013, with an initial capital contribution of Rs 100 crore; and wholly owned subsidiary of the RBI.
- Senapathy (Kris) Gopalakrishnan, co-founder and former co-Chairman, Infosys, was earlier appointed as RBIH 1st Chairman.
- It will encourage financial innovation through an institutional set-up. The hub aims to promote innovation across the financial sector by leveraging technology
- The RBIH will be guided and managed by a Governing Council (GC) led by a Chairman. There will be 9 other eminent persons from industry and academia as its members. Click Here to Read
- It promotes access to financial services and products for the low-income population in the country.

RBI unveils framework for microfinance lenders

• On March 14, 2022, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued 'RBI (Regulatory Framework for Microfinance Loans) Directions, 2022' which will be effective from April 01, 2022. These directions are issued by the apex bank by exercising its powers conferred by Section 21, Section 35A and Section 56 of the Banking Regulation (BR) Act, 1949; Chapter IIIB of the RBI Act, 1934; and Sections 30A and Section 32 of the National Housing Bank (NHB) Act, 1987.

 Under the directions all collateral-free loans, irrespective of end use and mode of application/ processing/ disbursal (either through physical or digital channels), provided to households having annual income up to Rs 3 lakh is to be considered micro finance loans.

RBI issues guidelines for extended interest equalisation scheme for export credit

- On March 8, 2022, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued modified norms on 'Interest Equalisation Scheme (IES) on Pre and Post Shipment Rupee Export Credit-Extension' after the extension of the scheme till March 31, 2024 by the Central Government w.e.f. October 1, 2021.
- The extended scheme will not be applicable to the ones availing benefit under any Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme of the Central Government.
- The telecom instrument sector having six HS (Harmonised System) lines will not be included, except for MSME (Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises) manufacturer exporters.
- Revised interest equalisation rates under the scheme will now be 3% for MSME manufacturer exporters exporting under any HS lines and 2% for manufacturer exporters and merchant exporters exporting under 410 HS lines (after excluding 6 HS lines of the telecom sector).
- To ensure transparency, banks while issuing approval to the exporter will furnish the prevailing interest rate.
- From October 1, 2021, to March 31, 2022, banks will identify the eligible exporters as per the scheme, credit their accounts with the eligible amount of interest equalisation and submit a sectorwise consolidated reimbursement claim to the RBI by April 30, 2022.
- With effect from April 1, 2022, banks will reduce the interest rate charged to the eligible exporters as per the guidelines and submit the claims in original within 15 days from the end of the respective month, with the bank's seal, and signed by the authorised person, in the prescribed format.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

WB Governor Inaugurates Petascale Supercomputer PARAM Shakti

- WB Governor Inaugurates Petascale Supercomputer PARAM Shakti Jagdeep Dhankhar, Governor of West Bengal(WB), inaugurated the Petascale Supercomputer PARAM Shakti under the National Supercomputing Mission (NSM) – a joint initiative of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) and the Department of Science and Technology (DST) at Indian Institute of Technology(IIT) Kharagpur in West Bengal.
- Petascale computing refers to computing systems capable of calculating at least 10^15 floating-point operations per second (1 petaFLOPS).

India successfully tests fired the surface to surface BrahMos Supersonic Cruise missile

- India successfully tests fired a surface-to-surface 'BrahMos' supersonic cruise missile from Andaman and Nicobar Island. It is an extended range missile that has a 290 km missile range and a top speed of Mach 2.8, nearly three times the speed of sound.
- It is jointly developed by Russia's Federal State Unitary Enterprise NPO Mashinostroyenia (NPOM) and India's Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).

DRDO successfully test fires two medium range surface to air missile

• DRDO successfully test fired two Indian Army versions of Medium Range Surface-to-Air Missiles (MRSAMs) from the Integrated Test Range at chandipur, off odisha coast. Medium Range Surface-to-Air Missile (MRSAM) tests were carried out as part of live firing trials against high-speed aerial targets which were successfully intercepted and destroyed at long range.

HAL introduces a 19-seater civil aircraft to be deployed under UDAN Scheme

- Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) Indian stateowned aerospace and defence company, introduced a 19-seater aircraft 'Hindustan 228' in a first of its kind attempt to develop small civil transport aircraft under the UDAN (Ude Desh Ka Aam Naagrik) Scheme.
- The design of Hindustan 228 is based on the Germany based Dornier GmbH Aircraft. In 1983, Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) acquired a production licence for the Dornier 228 and manufactured the aircraft for the Asian market.

NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory confirms 5,000 exoplanets beyond our solar system

- The National Aeronautics and Space Administration's (NASA) Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) has confirmed the existence of 5,000 plus exoplanets beyond our solar system.
- It includes 30% Gas giant (many times larger than Jupiter or Saturn, and even hotter than some stars),
 31% Super earth (Large rocky sized earth), 35%
 Neptune like (similar in size of Neptune or Uranus),
 4% terrestrial (small rocky planet similar to earth).

North Korea's 'monster missile': ICBM Hwasong – 17

- North Korea has test fired its biggest Intercontinental Ballistic Missile (ICBM), Hwasong- 17 at the command of its Supreme leader, Kim Jong-un.
- The missile flew 1,090 km (681 miles) at a maximum altitude of 6,248.5 km (3,905 miles) and hit a target in the Sea of Japan after travelling 67.5 minutes in air.
- Its predecessor, the Hwasong-15, tested in November 2017 reached an altitude of about 4,475 km and covered 950 km over 53 minutes.

ISRO successfully tested solid fuelbased booster stage of SSLV

- Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) has successfully completed the ground test of the solid fuel-based booster stage (SS1) of its new Small Satellite Launch Vehicle (SSLV) at Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC), Sriharikota at Andhra Pradesh. It completes the ground testing of all three stages of the launch vehicle. The vehicle is now ready for its first development flight, which is scheduled for May 2022.
- Other stages of SSLV like SS2 & SS3 have successfully undergone necessary ground tests and are ready for integration. At present, the launch of small satellites has been dependent on 'piggy-bank' rides with big satellite launches on the PSLV (Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle) of ISRO, which has completed around 50 successful launches.

ISRO organized Young Scientist Programme "YUVIKA" for students

- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is organizing a special programme for school children called "YUva VIgyani KAryakram" (YUVIKA) or "Young Scientist Programme". Aimed at creating awareness about emerging trends in science and technology, this programme is expected to encourage more students to pursue research and a career in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM).
- The ISRO Young Scientist Programme is a residential programme and will span over two weeks during the summer vacations from May 16, 2022, to May 28, 2022.
- This program includes invited talks, experience sharing by eminent scientists, experimental demonstrations, facility and lab visits, exclusive sessions for discussions with experts, practical and feedback sessions.
- A total of 150 class 9 students across the country will be selected for the programme.
- The programme is planned at five centres of ISRO i.e. Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre, U.R. Rao Satellite Centre, Space Application Centre, National

- Remote Sensing Centre, Hyderabad and North-East Space Application Centre.
- Students will be taken to visit Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota, towards the end of the project.

India's first-of-its kind Artificial Intelligence& Robotics Technology Park launched inBengaluru

- India's first Artificial Intelligence RoboticsTechnology Park (ARTPARK) for creating a betterworld through an inclusive Artificial Intelligence (AI) & Robotics revolution has been inaugurated at IndianInstitute of Science (IISc) Karnataka.It waslaunched by the Bengaluru, Government of Karnataka's Ministerfor Information. Biotechnology, Science and and Technology, Dr. C.N. Ashwath Narayan.
- It is a joint initiative of IISc Bengaluru and AIFoundry, Bengaluru in a publicprivate collaborative model to promote technology innovations in the field of AI & Robotics

India – Singapore MoU on cooperation in Science, Technology and Innovation

- During the inaugural event of India Singapore Technology Summit 2022, a MoU on cooperation in the fields of Science, Technology and Innovation was signed between the Department of Science & Technology, Government of India and Ministry of Trade & Industry, Government of Singapore.
- This Memorandum will remain in effect for a period of 5 years and will be automatically extended for a successive period of 5 years.
- This MoU will also encourage, develop and facilitate cooperation between India and Singapore in other fields like Agriculture, Food Science & Technology, Advanced Manufacturing & Engineering, Green Economy, Energy, Water, Climate & Natural Resources, Data Science, Emerging Technologies, Advanced Materials, And Health & Biotechnology

Defence Minister inaugurates DRDO's FlightControl System Integration complex in Bengaluru

- The Defence Union minister. Rainath Singhinaugurated a new Flight Control System (FCS) integration complex the AeronauticalDevelopment Establishment (ADE), BengaluruKarnataka. The seven storey FCS Integration building was constructed by Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) with the help of Larsen & Toubro (L&T) in an area of 1.3 lakh square feet with the record of 45 days in Bengaluru, Karnataka.
- It will be used as the research anddevelopment (R&D) activities to develop theavionics for fighter aircraft and FCS for the fifth generation Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA).

NASA Rolls Out Integrated SLS Rocket &Orion spacecraft of Artemis-1 Moon Mission for the 1st Time

- On 17th March 2022, for the first time, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) rolled out the integrated Space Launch System (SLS) rocket and Orion spacecraft (crew capsule) of Artemis 1, the first mission of NASA's Artemis Program at NASA's Kennedy Space Center (KSC), Florida, United States of America (USA).
- The SLS rocket and Orion capsule were hauled out from the KSC Vehicle Assembly Building to Pad 39B on NASA's giant crawlertransporter 2 (CT-2).

Axiom Mission 1

- : The first all-private astronaut mission to the International Space Station is scheduled for launch from NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida on April 6, 2022. The historic mission is a joint collaboration between Axiom Space, SpaceX and NASA.
- The four-member Ax-1 crew will become the first all-private astronaut team ever flown to the space station. The crew will travel to the space station on the SpaceX dragon endeavour spacecraft. SpaceX's

- Falcon 9 rocket will be used for the launch of the spacecraft.
- The Axiom Mission 1 will spend 8 days on the International Space Station, conducting scientific research, outreach and commercial activities. The total duration of the mission will be 10 days.
- The Axiom Mission 1 will carry a former NASA astronaut and three US crew members.
- The mission will be commanded by retired NASA astronaut Michael Lopez-Alegria, who will be making his 5th visit to space and third visit to the space station.
- The other crew members include mission pilot Larry Connor and Mission Specialists Eytan Stibbe and Mark Pathy.
- NASA has concluded the flight readiness review for the Ax-1 mission and the teams are proceeding toward the launch of the first private astronaut mission to the ISS.
- The purpose of the review was to assess the readiness of the ISS to execute the AX-1 mission including arrival, docking and in-orbit operations and undocking.
- The Axiom Mission 1 crew will be sharing workspace with seven regular crew members of the ISS, including three US astronauts, three Russian astronauts and one German astronaut.

ESA Introduced a New One-of-a-KindMission: ESA Vigil, Earth's Solar Defender

- On 10th February 2022, The European Space Agency(ESA) introduced its new one-of-a-kind mission named "Vigil", which is meant to protect the Earth from its nearest star (sun). 'Vigil' is derived from the Latin word 'vigilia' meaning wakefulness, while 'vigilis exceptus' means sentry, or guard.
- The mission was previously named "Lagrange"after the location the mission spacecraft willbe sent but later the name has been changedto 'Vigil'.
- The Vigil spacecraft will be launched to the fifth Lagrange (L5) point which is 150 million kilometres from both Earth and the sun.

DEFENCE

Indian Ocean Naval Symposium (IONS) Maritime Exercise 2022 (IMEX-22) held at Goa

- The First edition of Indian Ocean Naval Symposium (IONS) Maritime Exercise 2022 (IMEX-22) was heldin the Arabian sea and Goa port from 26 March to 30 March 2022. The exercise aimed to provide interoperability in Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) operations among member navies.
- IMEX-22 consists of two phases, Harbour Phase and Sea Phase
- <u>Harbour phase</u> the harbour Phase was held at Mormugao port in Goa from 26 to 27 March 22.
- <u>Sea Phase</u> the sea phase was held in the Arabian Sea from 28 to 30 March 22.
- Navies of Bangladesh, France, India and Iran participated in IMEX-22 with warships, Maritime Reconnaissance aircraft, Amphibious Assault Ship, Frigates, Fleet Support Ship, Destroyer and helicopters.
- Apart from that, 22 Observers from 15 IONS member navies, namely Australia, Bangladesh, France, India, Indonesia, Maldives, Mauritius, Mozambique, Oman, Qatar, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand, UAE and UK also participated in the exercise.
- <u>IONS Members and Observers</u> 25 Member Nations and 8 Observers (Qatar was included as 25th nation in July 2021).

Indian Navy Commissions Second P-8I squadron INAS 316 'Condors' at INS Hansa, Goa

Chief of Naval Staff (CNS) Admiral Radhakrishnan Hari Kumar commissioned a second P-8I aircraft squadron of four aircraft named 'Indian Naval Air Squadron (INAS) 316' at the INS (Indian Naval Ship) Hansa Naval air base in Goa. INAS 316 has been christened 'The Condors', one of the world's

- largest flying birds with a large wingspan. It will operate four P-8I aircraft procured as part of the optional clause in 2016 in a deal worth over USD1 bn
- The new air squadron will be commanded by Cdr Amit Mohapatra, an accomplished Boeing P-8I pilot.
- United States (US)-based aerospace company Boeing has developed 10-year Communication, Navigation and Surveillance/Air Traffic Management (CNS/ATM) modernisation roadmap' for the Airports Authority of India (AAI) to modernise its air traffic management

Amit Shah attended CRPF's 83rd Raising Day Parade in Jammu

- Amit Shah, Union Minister for Home Affairs attended the 83rd Raising Day parade of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) held at Maulana Azad Stadium in Jammu, Jammu and Kashmir(J&K) as Chief Guest.
- The 83rd CRPF Raising Day was observed on 27th July 2021. This is the first time that CRPF Raising Day celebrations is conducted outside Delhi.

Ministry of Defence Signs a Rs. 887 Crore Contract with L & T for MPVs

- The Ministry of Defence (MoD) signed a contract with Larsen and Toubro (L & T) Limited to purchase two Multi-Purpose Vessels (MPVs) for the Indian Navy at a total cost of Rs.887 Crore under the "Buy-Indian" Category.
- The MPVs will be the first of their kind and will be built at L & T shipyard in Kattupally (Chennai), with deliveries starting in May 2025.

Chief of the Army Staff presents 'President's Colours' to two battalions of Dogra regiment

 General Manoj Mukund Naravane, Chief of the Army staff presented the prestigious 'President's Colours' also known as 'Nishaan' to two battalions

- of the Dogra Regiments namely 20 DOGRA and 21 DOGRA during a colour presentation parade held at the Dogra Regiment Centre, Faizabad Uttar Pradesh.
- General Nirmal Chander Vij (retd) former Chief of the Army Staff & Honorary Colonel of The Dogra Regiment was also attended the Colour Presentation Parade.

20th India-France Bilateral **Exercise 'VARUNA -2022**

The 20th edition of the Bilateral Naval Exercise between the Indian Navy and French Navy named 'VARUNA' is being conducted in the Arabian Sea from March 30 to April 03, 2022. The Bilateral Naval Exercises between the two Navies is being held since 1993 and the exercise was christened as 'VARUNA' in 2001. Various ships, submarines, maritime patrol aircraft, fighter aircraft and helicopters of the two navies will be participating in the VARUNA-2022 exercise.

President Kovind presents **President's Colour to INS Valsura**

- President of India, Ram Nath Kovind has presented the prestigious President's Colour to Indian Naval Ship (INS) Valsura at Jamnagar in Gujarat. The 'Nishan Adhikari' Lt Arun Singh Sambyal received the President's Colour on behalf of the unit, for its 80 years of exceptional service. INS Valsura is a premier training facility of the Indian Navy established on December 05, 1942, in Jamnagar of Gujarat, to provide training in the domain of Torpedo handling (Underwater missile) operations.
- The President's Colour is bestowed upon a military unit in recognition of exceptional service rendered to the Nation, both in peace and in war. The Indian Navy was the first Indian Armed Force, to get President Colour by then President Dr Rajendra Prasad on 27 May 1951.

US, Philippines kick off 'Balikatan 2022' largest-ever military drills

The United States military and the military of the Philippines kicked off the military drill Balikatan

- 2022. The Philippine-led annual exercise will take place across Luzon in the Philippines region near Taiwan, from March 28 to April 8, 2022. Around Filipino and American troops participating in the military drill, making it the largest Balikatan military exercise ever.
- According to the military, the drills will focus on "maritime security, amphibious operations, live-fire training, urban operations, aviation operations, counterterrorism, and humanitarian assistance and disaster relief". The Visiting Forces Agreement (VFA) gives US troops a legal basis to be in the Southeast Asian country for bilateral exercises and governs the conduct of American armed force personnel.

Western Naval Command conducts security exercise 'Prasthan' Mumbai Offshore

- The Western Naval Command of the Indian Navy organised an offshore security exercise, 'Prasthan' in the Offshore Development Area (ODA) off Mumbai. This exercise is conducted after every six months, to ensure offshore security. Apart from the Naval forces, the exercise saw participation from the Indian Air Force, Coast Guard, ONGC, Mumbai Port Trust, Jawahar Lal Nehru Port Trust, Customs. state fisheries department, Mercantile Marine Department and the Marine Police.
- The day-long exercise resulted in improving standard operating procedures (SOPs) response-actions to a number of contingencies in the Offshore Defence Area off Mumbai.

Malaysia host 4 nations for to Shield 2022 **Bersama** military exercise

Malaysia will host armed forces from 4 nations namely, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore and the United Kingdom in the annual Bersama Shield 2022 training exercise. The exercise, referred to as BS22, is conducted within the framework of the Five Power Defense Arrangements (FPDA) - a series of bilateral and multilateral defence agreements established in 1971. Bersama means together in Malay.

• The exercise will involve sea and air drills, mostly in international waters but also in part of Malaysia's exclusive economic zone in the South China Sea. The exercise, referred to as BS22, is conducted within the framework of the Five Power Defense Arrangements (FPDA). The FPDA is the oldest defense arrangement in the region and includes counter-piracy operations as well as disaster relief and humanitarian assistance.

Indian Army with Maharashtra Police conducted "Suraksha Kayach 2" Exercise

• Indian Army's "Agnibaaz Division" organized a joint exercise "Suraksha Kavach 2" with Maharashtra Police at Lullanagar, Pune. The exercise aimed to counter any terrorist actions in Pune. The exercise involved the participation of the Counter-Terrorism Task Force (CTTF) of the Indian Army, Anti-Terrorism Squad of Maharashtra Police along with Quick Reaction Teams (QRTs), Dog Squads, and Bomb Disposal Teams of both agencies. The exercise aimed to harmonize the drills and procedures undertaken by Army and Police to counter-terrorism.

5th in the series of Offshore Patrol Vessels "ICGS Saksham" commissioned

- Defence Secretary of India, Dr Ajay Kumar has commissioned the Indian Coast Guard Ship (ICGS) Saksham. The fifth in the series of 105-metre Offshore Patrol Vessels (OPVs) class, at Goa. The first four of the five ICGS which have already been commissioned in 2020 are ICGS Sachet (1st); ICGS Sujeet (2nd); ICGS Sarthak (3rd); and ICGS Sajag (4th) in 2021.
- The Indigenous Offshore Patrol Vessel Project was launched by the Prime Minister of India in 2016 under which five Offshore Patrol Vessels (OPV) for the Indian Coast Guard (ICG) were planned to be launched.

About the Ship

 Goa Shipyard Limited designed and built the 105meter OPV, which is equipped with advanced

- technology, navigation and communication systems, sensors, and machinery.
- The ship will be based in Kochi once it joins the Indian Coast Guard (ICG) force. Ship will be used extensively for surveillance in Exclusive Economic Zones (EEZs) and other missions mandated by the Coast Guard charter.

EX-DUSTLIK between Indian and Uzbekistan armies held at Yangiarik, Uzbekistan

• The 3rd edition of the joint training exercise named EX-DUSTLIK between the Indian army and Uzbekistan army held at Yangiarik, Uzbekistan from 22 to 31 March 2022. The last edition of DUSTLIK was conducted in Ranikhet (Uttarakhand) in March 2021. The Indian contingent will be represented by the Grenadiers Regiment and will join the Uzbekistan Army contingent represented by troops of the North-Western Military District.

9th India-Seychelles Joint Military Exercise 'LAMITIYE-2022'

• The 9th edition of the Joint Military Exercise 'LAMITIYE-2022' between the Indian Army and Seychelles Defence Forces (SDF) was held from March 22 to 31, 2022 at Seychelles Defence Academy (SDA), Seychelles. The Indian Army contingent were represented by the 2/3 GORKHA RIFLES group (PIRKANTHI Battalion).

Indian Air Force to conduct Exercise Vayu Shakti at Pokharan range, Rajasthan

Australia posted a record of 356 on the board. In reply, Nat Sciver waged a lone battle and remained unbeaten on 148 but it was not enough as England was bowled out for 285 in 43.4 overs.



- Alyssa Healy of Australia scored 170 runs in the match, the highest individual score made by any cricketer, male or female, in the World Cup Final. She was also the leading run-scorer in the tournament with 509 runs.
- The Player of the Tournament went to Alyssa Healy. Sophie Ecclestone of England was the leading wicket-taker in the tournament, with 21 dismissals. The 2022 ICC Women's Cricket World Cup was the 12th edition of the Women's Cricket World Cup. The tournament was held in New Zealand from 4 March to 3 April 2022.

Championship. The 2022 edition of the international football competition

for women's under-18 national teams was held in

Jharkhand at JRD Tata Sports Complex, Jamshedpur. The valuable player of the tournament and the highest goal scorer was Lynda Kom who scored five goals in total.

 Although India lost to Bangladesh, 0-1 in the final league match, but still emerged champions of the tournament on account of better goal difference.
 India enjoyed a better goal difference of +11 in comparison to +3 of Bangladesh.

Swiss Open Badminton title 2022: PV Sindhu wins women's singles title

• India's P.V. Sindhu has defeated Busanan Ongbamrungphan of Thailand to win the women's

singles title at the Swiss Open Super 300 badminton tournament. Playing her second successive final in the tournament,



Sindhu, a double Olympic medallist, took 49 minutes to get the better of the fourth-seeded Busanan 21-16, 21-8 at the St. Jakobshalle.

• In the men's singles title of the Swiss Open Super 300 badminton tournament, Indian badminton player HS Prannoy lost to Jonatan Christie (Indonesia). However, Prannoy suffered a 12-21, 18-21 defeat against Asian Games gold medallist and fourth seed Jonatan Christie of Indonesia in a 48-minute summit clash to finish runner-up.

World tennis No.1 Ashleigh Barty announces retirement

 Australian female tennis player Ashleigh Barty has announced retirement from tennis at the age of 25 years. She has won three Grand Slam singles titles

— the French Open in 2019, Wimbledon in 2021 and the Australian Open in 2022. Apart from playing tennis, she has



also played semi-professional cricket during her break from tennis between 2014-2016.

- Barty is retiring after winning three major singles titles on three different surfaces – the 2019 French Open, the 2021 Wimbledon and, back in January, the Australian Open.
- In the video interview with her former doubles partner Casey Dellacqua, Barty explained that the decision to retire came after achieving her "true dream" of winning the Wimbledon Championships in July 2021 and taking the top prize at the Australian Open in January.

BNP Paribas Open Tournament 2022

- Earlier in the day, India's Gurpreet Singh, Anish Bhanwala, and Bhavesh Shekhawat were defeated 7-17 by Germany in the gold medal match of the men's 25m rapid fire pistol team competition.
- India won their third World Cup gold on Sunday, defeating Singapore 17-13 in the women's 25m pistol team event final. In the gold medal match, Rahi Sarnobat, Esha Singh, and Rhythm Sangwan defeated the Singaporean trio of Xiu Hong, Shun Xie, and Ling Chiao Nicole Tan.
- Esha Singh had won the women's 10m air pistol team event in addition to the silver she had earned in the women's 10m air pistol individual event, making this her second gold and third medal of the World Cup.
- Saurabh Chaudhary won India's first gold medal in Cairo last week. In the gold medal match of the Men's 10m Air Pistol event, the 19-year-old Indian defeated Michael Schwald of Germany 16-6.

S Sreesanth quits from all forms of first-class cricket

 India pacer S Sreesanth has announced his retirement from all forms of domestic cricket.

Sreesanth played 27 Tests and 53 ODIs for India, taking 87 and 75 wickets respectively. He has also taken seven wickets in 10 T20



Internationals. The temperamental pacer was also popular for his exuberant celebrations after taking wickets but his life and career went downhill after the spot-fixing scandal.

Priyanka Nutakki becomes the 23rd Woman Grandmaster of India

 19-year-old Priyanka Nutakki has secured her final WGM-norm at MPL's forty-seventh National



Women Chess Championship. She became India's twenty-third Woman Grandmaster. She is from Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh. Priyanka Nutakki

scored her first WGM-norm in January 2019 and crossed the 2300 rating criteria in the next two months. However, much like a lot of players, the Covid-19 pandemic delayed her title hopes.

India's S L Narayanan wins Grandiscacchi Cattolica International Open Chess Tournament

In Chess, Indian Grandmaster, S L Narayanan was declared the winner in the Grandiscacchi Cattolica International Open, held in Italy. Meanwhile, his compatriot R Praggnanandhaa came second. Though Narayanan and six others, including Praggnanandhaa, finished equal first with 6.5 points after nine rounds. But, Narayanan took the top spot on the basis of a better tie-break score. The 24-year old S L Narayanan from Thiruvananthapuram earned the title of Grandmaster in 2015 and is the 41st Grandmaster from India.

 Shahabuddin Ahmed, the former President of Bangladesh has passed away at the age of 92 in Dhaka, Bangladesh. He was the interim head of




state as the consensus nominee of all parties amid a mass upsurge in 1990 to topple exmilitary dictator HM Ershad. Shahabuddin

- India's horticulture output is likely to drop marginally by 0.4% to 333.25mt in 2021–22 from theprevious year (2020–21) as production of vegetables, spices, and plantation crops is set to decline.
- Among the key essential items, while potato and tomato production are expected to decline, onion production is expected to increase.
- <u>Vegetable Production:</u> Vegetable production in Uttar Pradesh is estimated to be 29.58 million tonnes (mt) in the 2021–22 crop
- year (July–June), down from 29.16 mt in 2020–21, while West Bengal output is expected to dip to 28.23 mtin 2021-22 from 30.33 mt in 2020-21.
- Other top producers of vegetables as per the data in the current year 2021-22 include Madhya Pradeshat 20.59 mt, Bihar at 17.77 mt and Maharashtra at 16.78 mt.
- <u>Fruit Production</u>: In 2021–22, Andhra Pradesh is expected to produce 18.01 million tonnes of fruit, up from 17.7 milliontonnes in 2020–21.
- Maharashtra is anticipated to produce 12.3 million tonnes of fruit, up from 11.74 million tonnes in 2020–21.

• Other top producers of fruits are Uttar Pradesh at 11.26 mt, Karnataka at 8.55 mt, and Gujarat at 8.24mt. Incidentally, Gujarat's production has remained unchanged from 2020-2021.

India TB cases up 19%: India TB Report 2022; Delhi tops in TB Prevalence: National TB Prevalence Survey in India 2019-2021

 According to the 'India TB Report 2022 – Coming Together to End TB Altogether', India has recorded

a 19% increase in Tuberculosis (TB) cases in 2021 over 2020 & as per 'National TB Prevalence

2019-2021' Report, Delhi has topped the TB Prevalence in India(among the population aged above 15 years and among all age groups) with 534 cases per 1 lakh population and 747 per 1 Lakh population (highest in India) respectively.

- The report was released by Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya during the "STEP Up to End TB 2022" Summit organised on the occasion of World TB Day 2022.
- Highlights of India TB Report 2022:
- More than 19.3 lakh new and relapsed TB patients were notified in 2021 against the 16.3 lakh in 2020. In 2020, deaths due to TB have increased to 4.93 lakh (excluding the HIV patients who died due to TB). In 2020, deaths due to TB have increased by 13%, compared to 2019.
- Between 2019 and 2020, the mortality due to all forms of TB has increased by 11%.
- India aims to eliminate TB by 2025 according to the National Strategic Plan for Elimination of Tuberculosis (NSP 2017- 25) and 18 States have committed to Ending TB by 2025 by formally implementing State-specific Strategic Plans.

& Phelps Report: Cricketer Virat Kohli ranked India's Valued Celebrity 2021

According to the Celebrity Brand Valuation Report 2021 (7th Edition) titled "Digital Acceleration 2.0."

released by Duff & Phelps (Now Kroll). Indian Cricketer Virat Kohli was ranked as India's most celebrity valued for the 5th consecutive time



in 2021. The brand value of Virat Kohli has dropped from USD 237.7 million in 2020 to USD 185.7 million in 2021

Former Indian cricket team captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni (MS Dhoni) is ranked 5th with a brand value of USD 61.2 million. His brand value has increased from USD 36.3 million in 2020 to USD 61.2 million in 2021.

UNEP's Annual **Frontier** Report ranks Moradabad 2nd most polluted city globally

According to the recent Annual Frontier Report 2022, titled 'Noise, Blazes and Mismatches'



published by the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP), Moradabad in Uttar Pradesh

is the second most noise polluted city with a maximum recorded noise pollution level of 114 decibels (dB).

- As per the report, the Most polluted city is Dhaka, Bangladesh's capital records the noise pollution level of 119 decibels, Pakistan's capital city Islamabad ranked Third.
- .3 Indian cities are among the top 15 most noise polluted cities in the world.They are

- Moradabad(UttarPradesh), Kolkata(West Bengal), and Asansol(West Bengal).
- The UNEP report found that Irbid (Jordan) at 60 dB is the world's quietest city, followed by Lyon (France),
- Madrid (Spain), Stockholm (Sweden), and Belgrade (Serbia).
- Among the 61 cities in the report, 13 cities were from South Asian region, out of which five cities (Moradabad, Asansol, Kolkata, Jaipur, & Delhi) are from India.
- The report is prepared based on three chapters:-
 - Listening to Cities: From Noisy Environments to Positive Soundscapes
 - · Wildfires Under Climate Change: A Burning Issue
 - · Phenology: Climate Change Is Shifting the Rhythm of Nature
- The noise pollution figures given in the report are drawn during daytime traffic or vehicles, the World Health Organisation's (WHO) prescribed limit for the noise pollution on the road is at 53 decibels in 2018. As per the Guidelines for community Noise 1999, the World Health Organisation (WHO) recommends 55 decibel standard for residential areas and 70 decibels for traffic and business sectors.

NITI Aayog releases 2nd Edition of Export Preparedness Index 2021; Gujarat tops overall ranking

National Institution for Transforming India (NITI Aayog), in partnership with the Institute of Competitiveness,

released the 2nd edition of the **Export** Preparedness Index (EPI) 2021. Gujarat has



retained the top position in the overall ranking with its total share in exports accounting for 20.83% as of 2020-2021.

The index was released by Dr Rajiv Kumar, Vice-Chairman of NITI Aayog in the presence of Amitabh Kant, CEO of NITI Aayog and BVR Subrahmanyam. Secretary. Department Commerce, Ministry of Commerce and Industry (MoCI).


- The top six states in India Maharashtra, Gujarat, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Telangana and Haryana contribute 75% of India's overall exports.
- Gujarat, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu have become the flag bearer of export lead growth. Gujarat has been leading the export contribution in India, with its total share accounting for 20.83% as of 2020-2021.
- Gujarat has emerged as the top-performing state in the 'Coastal States' category, followed by Maharashtra and Karnataka. Most of the coastal states are among the best performers.
- In the category of Landlocked States, Haryana was the best-performing state, followed by Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, Telangana.
- Among the Himalayan States and UT, Uttarakhand and Delhi are the top-performing respectively.
- EPI 2021 brings out 3 major challenges to export promotion of India, they are,
 - · Intra- and inter-regional differences in export infrastructure:
 - Weak trade support and growth orientation across
 - Lack of Research and development (R&D) infrastructure to promote complex and unique exports.
- The Economic Survey 2022 stated that India has already attained more than 75 % of its ambitious export target of USD 400 billion set for 2021-22.

UR for Persons of 15 years and above in Urban Areas declined to 9.8% in Q2-2021: 12th PLFS by NSO

In accordance with the 12th Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) by the National Statistical Office (NSO), Unemployment Rate (UR) for persons of age 15 years and above in urban areas dipped to 9.8% in July-September (Q2) 2021 from 13.2% in Q2-2020. It was 12.6% in April-June 2021.

- UR is defined as the percentage of unemployed persons in the labour force.
- UR among females also declined to 11.6% in July-September 2021 from 15.8% a year ago. It was


14.3% in April-June 2021. Among males, the UR also declined to 9.3% in July-September 2021 compared to 12.6%



- Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR) in CWS (Current Weekly Status) was 46.9% in the July-September 2021, down from 47.2% in the same period a year ago. It was 46.8% in April-June 2021.
- Worker Population Ratio (WPR) in CWS stood at 42.3% in July-September 2021, up from 40.9% in the same period a year ago. It was 40.9% in April-June, 2021.

Delhi becomes polluted most capital in world: 2021 **World Air Quality Report**

The 2021 World Air Quality Report released by the Swiss organization IQAir reveals that the National



Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi, India, is the most polluted capital in the world for the fourth consecutive year in 2021.

The report finds that only 3% of cities and no single country met the

Health Organization's (WHO) World Particulate Matter (PM) 2.5 annual air quality guidelines. The new guideline was released in September 2021 and cut the existing annual PM2.5 guideline value from 10 µg/m3 to 5 µg/m3.

Dhaka, the capital of Bangladesh was second on the list of capital cities in terms of annual average PM2.5 concentrations, while N'Djamena, the capital of Chad, was third.

- Previously, Delhi topped a list in 2020, 2019, and 2018.
- India was placed 5th in the Most Polluted countries in the word whereas Bangladesh was placed in 1st followed by Chad and Pakistan.
- No country met the latest WHO air quality guideline for PM2.5 in 2021.
- India houses 11 of the 15 most polluted cities in Central and South Asia in 2021.
- Delhi saw a 14.6% increase in PM2.5 concentrations in 2021 with levels rising to 96.4 μg/m3(micrograms per cubic meter) from 84 μg/m3 in 2020. No cities in India met the WHO air quality guideline of 5μg/m3.

India is on the rise with 222% growth in open access solar installations: Mercom India Report

- According to Mercom India Research's newly released report titled "Mercom India Solar Open Access Market Report Q4 & Annual 2021," India has added 1.2 Giga Watts (GW) of new solar open access capacity in the calendar year (CY) 2021, marking a growth of 222% during the year.
- As of December 2021, the cumulative installed solar capacity in the open access market was over 5 GW, whereas in the year 2020, India had an installed open access solar capacity of 383 Mega Watts (MW), which shows that there is a growth in the demand for open access solar installations.
- The top 3 states in installation of open access solar capacities of the CY 2021 are Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra respectively. India added 298 MW of solar operations capacity in Q4 2021 and installations were 75% more compared to 2020.
- Uttar Pradesh had the maximum installations with 113 MW and accounted for 38% of the total capacity additions in Q4 2021.

Progressive Reduction of MMR in India: Kerala outperforms India's achievement in reducing MMR

 The Registrar General of India has released a Sample Registration System (SRS) special bulletin

- on Maternal Mortality Rate (MMR) for 2017–2019. India's MMR has reduced to 103, a decrease of 10 points, when compared to the previous data of 113 in 2016–2018, a decline of about 8.8%
- Since India is showing a persistent decline in MMR from 130 in 2014–2016, 122 in 2015–17, 113 in 2016–18, and 103 in 2017–19, it will soon achieve below
 - National Health Policy (NHP) target for MMR of 100/lakh live births by 2020.
 - United Nations (UN) Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) target for MMR of 70/lakh live births by 2030.
- Kerala had recorded the lowest MMR of 30/lakh live births when compared to India's MMR of 103, putting it far ahead of the nation.
- Seven states have achieved SDG's MMR target (70/lakh live births by 2030): Kerala (30), Maharashtra (38), Telangana (56), Tamil Nadu (58), Andhra Pradesh (58), Jharkhand (61), and Gujarat (70).
- Nine states have achieved NHP's MMR target (100/lakh live births by 2020): the above seven and the states of Karnataka (83) and Haryana (96).
- Five states have MMR in between 100-150: Uttarakhand (101), West Bengal (109), Punjab (114), Bihar (130), Odisha (136) and Rajasthan (141).
- Four states have MMR above 150: Chhattisgarh (160), Madhya Pradesh (163), Uttar Pradesh (167), also showed an encouraging decline of 30 points and Assam (205).
- Three states such as Kerala, Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh have shown a remarkable decline of more than 15% in their MMR.
- Six states namely, Jharkhand, Rajasthan, Bihar, Punjab, Telangana, and Andhra Pradesh have shown a decline between 10-15% in their MMR.
- Besides, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Odisha and Karnataka showcased a decline between 5-10% in their MMR.
 - Four states namely West Bengal, Haryana, Uttarakhand and Chhattisgarh have shown an increase in MMR.

UN World Happiness Report 2022: India Ranks 136 out of 146; Finland Tops

- As per the 10th United Nations' World Happiness Report 2022, India's rank has been improved by 3 spots to 136 out of 146 countries from 139 in 2021 with a score of 3.777
- For the 5th year in a row, Finland continues to occupy the top spot being the happiest country in the world.
- Afghanistan was ranked as the unhappiest nation, followed by Lebanon, Zimbabwe, Rwanda and Botswana.
- Bhutan was not included in the world happiness report 2022

- Elon Musk co-founder and Chief Executive Officer(CEO) of Tesla has topped the Billionaires list as the World's richest person for the 2nd consecutive year with USD 205 billion(bn).
- The 2022 M3M Hurun Global Rich List ranks 3381 billionaires from 2558 companies and 69 countries.
- At present India has 249 billionaires which include 215 billionaires living in India and 34 billionaires of Indian origin living outside India.
- India secured 3rd spot with 215 billionaires, which
 is 38 more than 2021 and Healthcare, Consumer
 Goods and Chemicals sectors tops the list with 46,
 29 and 23 billionaires each.

SIPRI Report: India Largest Importer of Major Arms in 2017-21

 According to the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute(SIPRI) Fact Sheet March 2022 –

"Trends In International Arms Transfers, 2021", India remained the largest importer globally even though Indian



arms imports have decreased by 21% between 2012-2016 and 2017-2021.

- India has accounted for 11% of global arms imports in 2017-2021, which was around 14% in 2012-2016.
- The Main suppliers of India in 2017-2021 are Russia(46%), France(27%), and the United States of America (USA)(12%).
- The total volume of the international transfer of major arms in 2017-2021 was 4.6% lower than 2012-2016 but higher than 2007-2011.
- The 5 largest arms imports in 2017-2021 are India, Saudi Arabia, Egypt, Australia and China. These countries account for around 38% of the total imports in 2017-2021.

- The 5 largest arms exporters in 2017–21 are the USA, Russia, France, China and Germany. These countries account for around 77% of the total arms exports in 2017-2021.
- The arms exports of France increased 59% between 2012-2016 and 2017-2021. It accounts for 11% of the global total.

Investment in care services can generate 234 million jobs for women by 2035: ILO

The International Labour Organization (ILO) report
 "Care at Work: Investing in Care Leave and

Services for a More Gender Equal World of Work" was released on March 7, 2022, ahead of



International Women's Day, and was based on an ILO legal survey of 185 countries. The report highlights eight key messages.

- This report stipulates a global overview of national laws and practices regarding care policies, such as maternity protection, paternity, parental and other care-related leave policies, in addition to childcare and long-term care services.
- It exposed that persistent and significant gaps in care services and policies have left hundreds of millions of workers with family responsibilities without adequate protection and support.
- By investing in universal childcare and long-term care services, about 299 million jobs can be generated by 2035. Women will receive 234 million (78%) of these funds.

RailTel Ranks 124 in 2022 Fortune India the Next 500 list

 RailTel Corporation of India Limited(RailTel), owned by the Indian Railways, Ministry of Railways, has ranked 124th in the Fortune India The Next 500 (2022 edition) of top midsize companies operating in India. It is the only Telecom

- Public Sector Undertakings (PSU) of the Government of India(GoI) on the list.
- RailTel has made improvements and jumped 67
 positions up compared to its 2021 ranking (197) as
 a recognition of its improved and consistent
 performance.
- Apart from RailTel, Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation(IRCTC) (ranked 309) is the only Railway PSU featuring on the list.

Knight Frank: India Placed 51st in Global House Price Index Q4 2021

- India has improved its rank by five spots to be placed at 51st position in the 'Global House Price Index Q4 2021' released by property consultant Knight Frank. India was placed at 56th position in Q4 of 2020. India witnessed a 2.1 per cent annual appreciation in housing price rates during the October-December quarter of 2021 against Q4 of 2020.
- Globally, Turkey saw the highest annual price growth rate by 59.6 per cent in Q4 2021.
- New Zealand (22.6 per cent), Czech Republic (22.1 per cent), Slovakia (22.1 per cent) and Australia (21.8 per cent) are among the top 5 countries respectively in the latest research report.
- Malaysia, Malta and Morocco markets recorded a decline in housing prices by 0.7 per cent, 3.1 per cent and 6.3 per cent, respectively, in the year 2021.

India adds record 1,700 MW Rooftop Solar Capacity in 2021: Mercom India Report

- According to a Mercom India Research report title "Mercom India Rooftop Solar Market Report Q4 and Annual 2021", India set a new record of installed 1,700 megawatt (MW) of rooftop solar capacity in 2021, registering a 138 % rise annual basis compared to 719 MW of rooftop solar capacity in 2020.
- The record 1.7 GW of rooftop solar capacity in 2021 is the highest ever in a year.

- In 2021, the residential and commercial segments accounted for 35% and 33% of installed rooftop solar capacity, respectively.
- Industrial rooftop solar installations constituted 26 %, and the remaining 6% was from the government segment.
- Gujarat with 27% share was the leading state for cumulative rooftop solar installations followed by Maharashtra (14%) and Rajasthan (10%).

V-Dem's Democracy Report 2022: India ranked 93rd & Sweden tops

 According to the Swedish based V-Dem (Varieties of Democracy) Institute report titled, 'Democracy Report 2022: Autocratisation Changing Nature', India has been ranked among the top ten autocratic

countries in the world and has been ranked 93rd on the Liberal Democracy



Index (LDI) out of 179 countries

- Top 5 LDI Countries sweden , Denmark, Norway, Costa rica and new Zealand
- Most autocratic countries Afghanistan, Belarus,
 China, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Sudan and Venezuela are among the most autocratic in the world.
- India is one of the top ten 'autocratisers' in the world, which indicates that India is autocratic rather than a democracy that it can more suitably be indicated as electoral autocracy.
- India is in the bottom 40% to 50% of countries on V-Dem's Liberal Democracy Index (LDI).
- In South Asia, India is ranked below Sri Lanka (88), Nepal (71), and Bhutan (65) and above Pakistan (117) in the LDI.
- The world has 89 democracies and 90 autocracies, electoral autocracy remains the most common regime type, accounting for 60 countries and 44% of the world population or 3.4 billion people.

India Ranks 2nd for Global Investment in Digital Shopping in 2021, US Tops: Bengaluru tops among cities

- According to the London & Partners (the Mayor of London's international trade and investment agency) analysis of Dealroom.co investment data, India secured the 2nd largest global venture capital investment hub for digital shopping companies, growing up to 175 percent from USD 8 billion in 2020 to USD 22 billion in 2021.
- The analysis relating to investment into digital shopping companies is based on Dealroom.Co's definition of online marketplaces, which supplied the Venture Capital investment data as of 15th February 2022.
- Within India, Bengaluru, Karnataka topped with USD 14 billion worth of Venture Capital (VC) investments in digital shopping in 2021.
- Bengaluru almost tripled its investments from USD 5 billion in 2020 to attain the top position, ahead of other leading cities in the world New York City (2nd), San Francisco (3rd), London (4th) and Berlin (5th).
- Within India Gurugram, Haryana placed at seventh position with USD 4 billion and Mumbai, Maharashtra at tenth position with USD 3 billion.

India slips 3 spots to 120 on 17 SDG Goals: DTE's 9th State of India's Environment Report 2022

- As per the report, India has slipped three spots to 120 from 117 in 2021 on the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) adopted as a part of the 2030 agenda by 192 United Nations member states in 2015.
- India's overall SDG score was 66 out of 100.
- CSE is a not-for-profit public interest research and advocacy organisation.
- The report focuses on climate change, migration, health systems, forest & wildlife, energy, industry, habitat, pollution, waste, agriculture & rural development.
- AAD is an annual conclave of journalists. AAD 2022 saw the participation of over 60 journalists across India.
- As per report, on the state-wise preparedness to meet the SDGs by the target year 2030, Kerala ranked 1st, followed by Tamil Nadu (TN) and Himachal Pradesh (HP) in the 2nd position.
- The 3rd position was shared by Goa, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh and Uttarakhand.
- Jharkhand and Bihar are the least prepared to meet the SDGs by the target year 2030.
- Among the Union Territories (UTs), Chandigarh was ranked 1st, followed by Delhi, Lakshadweep and Puducherry in the 2nd place and the Andaman and Nicobar Islands on the 3rd.
- With the latest rankings, India is now behind all south Asian nations except Pakistan, which stands at 129.
- The south Asian countries ahead of India are Bhutan ranked 75, Sri Lanka (87), Nepal (96) and Bangladesh (109).
- The key reason behind a drop in India's ranking major challenges in 11 SDGs including zero hunger, good health and wellbeing, gender equality and sustainable cities and communities.
- India also performed poorly in dealing with quality education and life on land aspects.

- The Summit was hosted by the Government of Sri Lanka, which was the chair nation of BIMSTEC.
- The theme of the Summit was "Towards a Resilient Region, Prosperous Economies, Healthy People"
- At the conclusion of the Summit, Thailand took over as chair nation of BIMSTEC.
- 2022 marks the 25th year of the establishment of BIMSTEC.
- During the Summit, leaders witnessed the signing of three BIMSTEC agreements
 - 1. BIMSTEC Convention on Mutual Legal Assistance in Criminal Matters
 - 2. BIMSTEC Memorandum of Understanding on Mutual Cooperation in the field of Diplomatic Training
 - 3. Memorandum of Association on Establishment of BIMSTEC Technology Transfer Facility
- Adoption and signing of the BIMSTEC Charter, which would lead to putting in place s set of rules, a framework and long-term goals. This will help to streamline the operations of BIMSTEC and allow the organisation to enhance its potential.
- Adoption of the 'Master Plan for Transport Connectivity' which lays out a guidance framework for connectivity related activities in the region in the future.
- Modi announced that India will provide USD 1 million to the BIMSTEC secretariat to increase its operational budget.

5th UN Environment Assembly concludes in Nairobi with 14 resolutions

- The 5th United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA-5) was held on a hybrid format in Nairobi from 28 February to 02 March 2022.
- The theme for UNEA-5 was "Strengthening Actions for Nature to Achieve the Sustainable Development Goals".
- The assembly concluded with 14 resolutions to strengthen international action for climate, nature and a pollution-free planet to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals.
- The biennial UNES is hosted by the UN Environment Programme (UNEP) to bring together representatives of the 193 Member States of the UN, businesses, civil society and other stakeholders to address the world's most pressing environmental challenges.

2nd India Australia Virtual Summit 2022

- On March 21, 2022, the 2nd India-Australia Virtual Summit was held between the Prime Minister (PM)
 ofIndia Narendra Modi, and Australian PM Scott John Morrison where both sides reaffirmed their commitment to the India-Australia Comprehensive Strategic Partnership (CSP).
- The first virtual summit was held between India and Australia, both members of the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue, or Quad, on June 4, 2020.

14th India-Japan annual summit 2022

- The Prime Minister of Japan, Fumio Kishida, was on a two-day visit to India to attend 14th India-Japan summit 2022 on March 19-20,2022 in New Delhi. He was invited by the Indian PM Narendra Modi.
- This was Fumio Kishida's first visit to the country since he took charge of the office last year, and also his first meeting with Prime Minister Narendra

- Modi.The last India-Japan summit took place in 2018 in Tokyo.
- During the summit, Japan has raise its investment target in India to 5 trillion yen which is around USD 42 billion (Rs 3.20 lakh crore) over the next five years.
- The investment target of 3.5 trillion Japanese yen (\$29 billion) announced in 2014 has been achieved in 2014-2019.

2nd India-Indonesia Security Dialogue held in Jakarta, Indonesia

- On 17th March 2022, the second India-Indonesia Security Dialogue (IISD) was held in Jakarta, Indonesia.
- The 2nd IISD was co-chaired by Ajit Doval, National Security Adviser (NSA) of India and Mohammad Mahfud, Coordinating Minister for Political, Legal and Security Affairs of Indonesia.
- Both have signed a MoU for Security Dialogue between the Coordinating Ministry for Political, Legal, and Security Affairs of Indonesia and the National Security Council Secretariat of India.
- The first IISD, held in 2018 in New Delhi, Delhi, was led by Ajit Doval, NSA of India and H Wiranto Coordinating Minister for Political, Legal and Security Affairs of Indonesia.

DefExpo 2022 Postponed Due to Logistics Problems

- The 12th edition of DefExpo-2022, Naval & Homeland Security Systems Exhibition, India's flagship defence exhibition, which was proposed to be held in Gandhinagar, Gujarat from 10th to 14th March 2022, has been postponed. The reason for the postpone is the logistics problems experienced by participants, and the new dates will be announced later.
- The Defence Exhibition Organisation (DEO), under the Ministry of Defence, is the organiser of the exhibition.
- The theme of DefExpo 2022 is "India-The Emerging Defence Manufacturing Hub".

36th edition of the International Geological Congress was held in New Delhi

- On a virtual platform, the 36th International Geological Congress (IGC was held in New Delhi from March 20 to 22, 2022, with the topic Geosciences: The Basic Science for a Sustainable Future. The 36th International Geophysical Congress is a collaboration between the Ministries of Mines and Earth Sciences, the Indian National Science Academy, and the Science Academies of Bangladesh, Nepal, and Sri Lanka.
- Union Minister of Coal, Mines and Parliamentary Affairs Shri Pralhad Joshi and Minister of State Science & Technology; Minister of State Earth Sciences; MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space Dr Jitendra Singh are expected to inaugurate the Congress.
- On the occasion of the 36th IGC, three commemorative Postage Stamps will be issued, as well as a First Day Cover. India held the 22nd session of the IGC, which was the first IGC on Asian land, 58 years ago.

3rd National Youth Parliament Festival

- The 3rd edition of the National Youth Parliament Festival (NYPF) was organised jointly by the Lok Sabha Secretariat and the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports on March 10 and 11, 2022, in the Central Hall of Parliament, New Delhi. Union Sports Minister Anurag Thakur will address the inaugural session of NYPF on March 10, while the Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla will address the valedictory function on March 11.
- The objective of the NYPF is to hear the voice of the youth, between 18 and less than 25 years of age, who will join various careers in the coming years, including public services. The top three National level youth winners will get an opportunity to speak before the Lok Sabha Speaker during the valedictory function.

decided to extend the tenure of Jens Stoltenberg.

 Jens Stoltenberg, a former Prime Minister of Norway, took the office of Secretary General in October 2014. In September 2021, his term was set to end.

Assam CM Himanta Biswa Sarma Re-elected as President of BAI

 Himanta Biswa Sarma, Chief Minister of Assam was re-elected as the President of the Badminton



Association of India(BAI) for a period of 4 years from 2022 to 2026 during the General Body Meeting held Guwahati, Assam.

He has been serving as the President of BAI since 2017 and he is also

the Vice President of Badminton Asia and a member of the Executive Council of Badminton World Federation (BWF).

ILO elected Gilbert Houngbo as its 11th Director-General

- The International Labour Organization (ILO) elected Gilbert Fossoun Houngbo from Togo as its next Director-General (DG). He will take office on 1st October 2022 for five years. He will succeed Guy Ryder from the United Kingdom (UK), who has held the office since 2012.
- ILO Headquarters-Geneva, Switzerland
