Option B is correct: As stated above, Core Deep Ocean Mission is an initiative of India under the Ministry of Earth Sciences. It has twin aims of Surveying Ocean Bed Resources and Biodiversity for economic prosperity and environmental conservation.

The two major minerals found in the ocean bed are:

- Polymetallic Nodules (PMNs): rich in Ferric Minerals with traces of rare minerals.
- Gas Hydrates: Methane frozen in ice and water crystals.

[SOL] In News- Finance minister in her budget speech has proposed a glide path for fiscal consolidation to bring down the fiscal deficit to 4.5% of GDP by FY26. She proposed to introduce amendments to the FRBM Act to make necessary changes in the fiscal consolidation roadmap.

Statement 1 is not correct: The Union Budget defines Fiscal Deficit as the difference between the Revenue Receipts plus Non-debt Capital Receipts (NDCR) and the total expenditure. In other words, it is reflective of the total borrowing requirements of the Government.

Statement 2 is not correct: In the economy, there is a limited pool of investible savings. These savings are used by financial institutions like banks to lend to private businesses (both big and small) and the governments. If the FD ratio is too high, it implies that there is a lesser amount of money left in the market for private entrepreneurs and businesses to borrow.

It is believed to make up more than 95% of all the universe. Its gravitational force prevents stars in our Milky Way from flying apart. Called dark matter-Because unlike normal matter (i.e. stars and galaxies), dark matter does not interact with the electromagnetic force.

Stardust 1.0 is a launch vehicle suited for student and budget payloads. It will help to launch small satellites called CubeSats into space in a way that is relatively cheaper than using traditional rocket fuel and is less toxic for the environment.

Under the scheme, each MP has the choice to suggest to the District Collector for works to the tune of Rs.5 Crores per annum to be taken up in his/her constituency.

Statement 2 is not correct: The funds released under the scheme are non-lapsable. This means that if the funds for a particular is not spent in that year, it will be carried forward.

Statement 2 is not correct: The Ministry of Statistics and Programme has issued the guidelines on MPLADS Scheme including implementation and monitoring of the scheme. The Department has initiated all necessary steps to ensure that the scheme is successfully implemented in the field.

[SOL] In News- The United States has extended the New START nuclear disarmament treaty with Russia for five years.

Statement 1 is not correct: It is a nuclear arms reduction treaty between the United States and the Russian Federation. It is a successor to the START framework of 1991 (at the end of the Cold War) that limited both sides to 1,600 strategic delivery vehicles and 6,000 warheads.

Statement 2 is correct: It is the formal name of Measures for the Further Reduction and Limitation of Strategic Offensive Arms. The number of strategic nuclear missile launchers will be reduced by half.

Option C is correct: The incident occurred at Chauri Chaura in the Gorakhpur district of the United Province, (modern Uttar Pradesh) in British India on 4 February 1922. During this incident, a large group of protesters, participating in the Non-cooperation movement, clashed with police, who opened fire. Mahatma Gandhi, who was strictly against violence, halted the Non-cooperation Movement at the national level on 12 February 1922, as a direct result of this incident. Option C is correct: The 15th Finance Commission has recommended that states, along with Ladakh and Jammu and Kashmir, be given 42 per cent share in the divisible tax pool of the centre during the period 2021-22 to 2025-26. Option A is correct: The Pradhan Mantri Matritva Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) was launched in 2016 as a flagship maternity benefits programme of the Government of India. The scheme is aimed at pregnant or lactating women aged 19 years or above for the first live birth. The programme provides partial compensation for wage loss during childbirth and afterwards during childcare. It also aims to provide information on good feeding and nutrition for mother and child pursuant to the National Food Security Act, 2013. Pregnant/Lactating Mothers except those who are employed with the Central Government, Public Sector Units or State Governments or those who receive similar benefits from similar laws for the time being. [SOL] In News- At least 800 Olive Ridley sea turtles died since January 2021 across the **Gahirmatha marine sanctuary** of Odisha.

Statement 1 is not correct: Their **scientific name** is **Lepidochelys olivacea** and they are also known as the **Pacific ridley sea turtle.** They are the **smallest** and **most abundant** of all sea turtles found in the world. They are found in warm waters of the Pacific, Atlantic and Indian oceans. They are vulnerable according to the IUCN Red List.

Statement 2 is not correct: They are not herbivores, these are carnivores and feed mainly on jellyfish, shrimp, snails, crabs etc.
