 - o When education was the privilege of the social elites, his **Pallikkoodam movement** (setting up schools in church premises) enabled **universal access to education.**
 - He ordered that schools be set up on **all church premises and threatened** to close down those that failed to comply.
 - He also started free mid-day meals and provided clothes and books to reduce drop-outs among the poor and Dalit students.
 - o In 1846, Saint Chavara established a **Sanskrit school in Mannanam in Kerala**, that enabled ordinary people to study the sacred Hindu literature in Sanskrit.
- □ In 1831, **he founded the first indigenous religious congregation for men**, now known as the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI).

- □ In 1846, with the permission of Swathi Thirunal, the maharajah of Travancore, Saint Chavara founded a printing press in Mannanam and published educational materials and books to promote social harmony.
- **The first religious congregation for women (CMC-CTC) he founded in 1866.**
 - o He was well-versed in Malayalam, Sanskrit, Latin and Syriac.
- □ His poem Anasthasyayude Rakthasakshyam (The Martyrdom of Anastasia, 1862) is considered the first minor epic in Malayalam.

[SOL] Statement 1 is correct: Western Disturbance (WD is an **extra-tropical storm** that originates in the **Mediterranean region**.

- o The disturbance travels from the **"western" to the eastern direction and** gradually travel across the middle-east from Iran, Afghanistan and Pakistan to enter the Indian sub-continent.
- Disturbance means an area of "disturbed" or reduced air pressure.
- Equilibrium exists in nature due to which the air in a region tries to normalize its pressure.
 - o In the term "extra-tropical storm", the storm refers to low pressure.
- "Extra-tropical" means outside the tropics (as WD originates outside the tropical region).

Statement 2 is not correct: The WD is not always the harbinger of good weather and Sometimes, they can cause extreme weather events like floods, flash floods, landslides, dust storms, hail storms and cold waves killing people, destroying infrastructure and impacting livelihoods.

[SOL] Statement 1 is not correct: The Index of Industrial Production (IIP) is an index for India which details the growth of various sectors in an economy such as mining, electricity and manufacturing.  - o It covers up to **3 days of pre-hospitalization and 15 days of post-hospitalization expenses** such as diagnostics and medicines.

Statements 2 and 3 are correct: There is no restriction on the family size, age or gender.

- o The RSBY had a family cap of five members.
- o All pre-existing conditions are covered from day one.
- The households included are based on the deprivation and occupational criteria of Socio-Economic Caste Census 2011 (SECC 2011) for rural and urban areas respectively.
- □ The coverage mentioned under PM-JAY, therefore, also includes families that were covered in RSBY but are not present in the SECC 2011 database.

 - o A print above **50 means expansion** while a score **below 50 denotes contraction**.
 - o A reading at **50 indicates no change.**

- o If the previous month PMI is higher than the current month PMI, it represents that the economy is contracting.
- To provide **information about current and future business conditions** to company decisionmakers, analysts, and investors.
 - o The index helps in determining whether the market conditions, as seen by purchasing managers, is expanding, contracting or staying the same

[SOL] Statement 1 is correct: The Parliament amended the Constitution of India (103rd Amendment) Act, 2019 to provide for a 10% reservation in education and government jobs in India for a section of the General category candidates.

Statement 2 is not correct: The amendment introduced economic reservation by amending Articles 15 and 16. It inserted Article 15 (6) and Article 16 (6) in the Constitution to allow reservation for the economically backward in the unreserved category.

- The **Nilachakra** or the Blue wheel perched on top of the temple is made of eight metals or ashtadhatu.

- He played an important role in introducing the philosophies of Yoga and Vedanta to the West.
- He preached '**neo-Vedanta**', an interpretation of Hinduism through a Western lens and believed in combining spirituality with material progress.
- He is best known for his speech at the Parliament of the World's Religions in Chicago in 1893.
 - After coming back to India, he formed the Ramakrishna Mission in 1897.
- In **1899**, he established the **Belur Math**, which became his permanent abode.

[SOL] Option a is correct: Adi Shankara composed texts like Shankarasmrithi, which seeks to establish the social supremacy of Nambuthiri Brahmins.

 - He began delivering lectures at various places in the US and UK and became popular as the 'Messenger of Indian Wisdom to the Western World'.

- His followers were pledged to nonviolence, and they derived their popular title from the red colour of their shirts.
- He started the Pakhtun, a monthly journal in Pushtu.

 - It may pose a threat to humans in future.
- The World Health Organization (WHO) still needs to study whether it poses threats for humans.
- Infection with NeoCov could not be **cross-neutralised by antibodies targeting SARS-CoV-**2 or MERS-CoV.

[SOL] In News: Recently, the Prime Minister of India paid **tribute to Pandit Jasraj** on the occasion of the Jayanti of the doyen of Indian Classical Music.

Option c is correct: Pandit Jasraj was Born on January 28, 1930, in the Hissar district of Haryana.

- He had the mastery over **shuddha madhyam notes** and his ability to play **with light and heavy and popular** and rare ragas like **Durga, Jog and Abeer Todi with equal felicity.**
- He created a **unique form of jugalbandi called Jasrangi**, in which a male and a **female singer sing different ragas** in their respective scales to merge their **individual displays into one unified performance**.
- He was also a master of haveli sangeet.
 - He was a recipient of several prestigious awards including **Padma Shri**, **Padma Bhushan** as well as Padma Vibhushan.
 - Minor Planet named 'Panditjasraj'- In 2019, the International Astronomical Union had named a minor planet after Pandit Jasraj.
- The minor planet is located between Mars and Jupiter.

[SOL] In News: A key proposal announced in this year's (2021) Budget, a bad bank to deal with stressed assets in the loss-laden banking system, has received all regulatory approvals.

Option a is correct: The K V Kamath Committee helped the RBI with designing a one-time restructuring scheme. - It is a **social species, living and travelling mainly in flocks**. Spot-billed pelicans are not graceful on land, but fly well and are strong swimmers.

- SSLV is perfectly suited for launching multiple microsatellites at a time and supports multiple orbital drop-offs.

- Hyder Ali joined forces with the Marathas in 1780 and again devastated Karnataka.
- The tide was turned by the dispatch of British help from Calcutta (now Kolkata) and by the death of Hyder Ali in December 1782.
- French help came too late to affect the issue. Peace was made with Hyder Ali's son Tippu Sultan by the **Treaty of Mangalore (1784)**.
- In this war, Tipu defeated Col. John Brathwaite on the banks of the Kollidam (Coleroon) River, with the help of his rockets. This was the first defeat of the British in India.
- Tipu's rockets are all preserved in England.

Statement 2 is correct: Third Anglo-Mysore War (1790-92)

- In 1789, he provoked the British invasion by attacking their ally, the raja of Travancore.
- Consequently, in 1790, Governor-General Lord Cornwallis dropped his name from the list of the company's "friends", leading to this war.
- Tipu held the British at bay for more than two years, but by the **Treaty of Seringapatam** (March 1792) he had to cede half his dominions.

- The Blue Nile flows for about 1,400 km to Khartoum from Lake Tana which is 1,800 meters above sea level in the Ethiopian mountains.
- The White Nile and Blue Nile **merge near Khartoum**, becoming the proper Nile.

[SOL]In News: The Prime Minister of India lauded the first-ever goods train that reached Rani Gaidinliu Railway Station in Manipur's Tamenglong district.

- Rani Gaidinliu was born on January 26, 1915, in the present-day **Tamenglong district of Manipur and died in 1993.**
- She was the Naga spiritual and political leader who belonged to the Rongmei tribe (also known as Kabui).
 - She led an armed uprising against the British in Manipur, Nagaland and Assam
- In 1927, at the age of 13, Gaidinliu, along with her cousin Haipou Jadonang, joined the Heraka movement, which aimed at the revival of the Naga tribal religion and establish self-rule of the Nagas (Naga Raj) ending the British rule.
- Jawaharlal Nehru called her the "Daughter of the Hills" and gave her the title "Rani" or queen acknowledging her role in the struggle against the British,
- In 1972, she was awarded Tamara Patra by the Government of India for her contribution to the freedom movement.
- She also received the Padma Bhushan in 1982.
- In 1996, the Union government issued a commemorative postage stamp in her honour.
- Vivekananda Sewa Summan in 1983, and Stree Shakti Puraskar in 1991.
- She posthumously was awarded the **Bhagwan Birsa Munda Puraskar in 1996**.
 - The Government of India also issued a commemorative stamp in her honour in the same year.
- The Centre also released a Rs 100 commemorative coin in 2015 on the occasion of her 100th birth anniversary.
- The Indian Coast Guard commissioned a Fast Patrol Vessel "ICGS Rani Gaidinliu" in 2016.

- The parasitic flowering plants have a **modified root structure spread** on the stem of the tree and are anchored inside the **bark of the host tree.**
- The name **Septemeranthusis** derived from the Latin word 'septem' meaning 'seven', referring to the arrangement of flowers.
- The genus belongs to the family Loranthaceae, a hemiparasite under the sandalwood order Santalales and is of widespread importance.
 - Loranthaceae is currently **represented by nine genera and are found all across the country.** The plant was found on the **periphery of the tropical forest** in one of the biodiversity hotspots referred to as the Nicobar group of islands separated from the Andaman group of Islands by a wide gap of 160 km with heavy tidal flows.
- it is endemic only to the Nicobar group of islands

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
