The world's oldest water has been explored by a geochemist Dr Barbara Sherwood Lollar at the University of Toronto's isotope Geochemistry.It was found at a depth of 2.4 kilometres at the Kidd Creek mine, located on the 2.7 billion-year-old **Canadian Shield** which is one of the world's largest continental shields

The eight Core Industries in decreasing order of their weightage: Refinery Products> Electricity> Steel> Coal> Crude Oil> Natural Gas> Cement> Fertilizers.

They are vulnerable according to the IUCN Red List. **Statement 2 is not correct:** They are not herbivores, these are carnivores and feed mainly on jellyfish, shrimp, snails, crabs etc.

Statement 3 is correct: These are best known for their unique mass nesting called Arribada, where thousands of females come together on the same beach to lay eggs. One unique feature about females is that they return to the very same beach from where they first hatched, to lay their eggs. The eggs hatch in 45 to 60 days, depending on the temperature of the sand and atmosphere during the incubation period.

SDRF shall be used only for meeting the expenditure for providing immediate relief to the victims. The Central Government contributes 75% of SDRF allocation for general

Statement 1 is correct: The location of the poles is not fixed, however, as the axis moves due to changes in how the Earth's mass is distributed around the planet. Thus, the poles move when the axis moves, and the movement is called "Polar Motion".

Statement 2 is correct: Normally, it is caused by changes in the hydrosphere, atmosphere, oceans or solid Earth. Faster ice melting under global warming and unsustainable consumption of groundwater for irrigation and for other anthropogenic activities also contribute to it, according to latest studies.
