Statement 2 is correct: Sikkim is the only Northeastern state which is not connected to a rail network. NH10 is the only road that connects the state with the rest of the country. The new rail line will be from Sevoke in West Bengal to Rangpo in Sikkim, a distance of 45 km.

[SOL] Recently, Discussions were on to link the e-Shram portal with the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana.

Statement 1 is not correct : The Ministry of Labour & Employment launched the eSHRAM portal for creating a National Database of Unorganised Workers (UWs) including construction workers, migrant workers, gig workers and platform workers, street vendors, domestic workers, agriculture workers, etc on 26th August 2021.

Statements 2 and 3 are correct : eSHRAM portal seeded with Aadhaar will be used to deliver all the social security benefits of the Central and State Governments for the unorganised workers.

- All eligible registered workers on eSHRAM portal get an Accidental Insurance cover of 2 Lacs under PMSBY from the date of issue of policy.
- It would allow the workers to get the direct benefit transfer (DBT) through the e-Shram unique

ID number.

6. [ANS] d

[SOL] Recently, The State of the World's Forests (SOFO) 2022 report has been released by The Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO).

Option d is correct: It is a specialised agency of the United Nations that leads international efforts to defeat hunger.

- The goal is to achieve food security for all and make sure that people have regular access to enough high-quality food to lead active, healthy lives.
- With 195 members: 194 countries and the European Union, FAO works in over 130 countries worldwide.

7. [ANS] b

[SOL] The Ukraine war casts shadow over Transnistria as security alerts sow fear.

Statement 1 is not correct : Transnistria lies between Moldova to its west and Ukraine towards its east.

• Often described as a "remnant of the Soviet Union"

• It declared independence like Moldova did soon after the break-up of the Soviet Union.

Statements 2 and 3 are correct : Transnistria is not recognised as independent even by Russia and its economy is dependent on Russia for subsidies and free gas.

- Most Transnistrians have dual citizenship of Russia and Transnistria or triple citizenship of Moldova, Transnistria, and Russia.
- Unlike the rest of Moldova, which speaks Romanian, the majority of people in Transnistria speak Russian and use the cyrillic script like Russians.
- It has its own government (which is pro-Russian), Parliament, armed force, constitution, flag, anthem, etc.

8. [ANS] d

[SOL] Recently the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) announced the end of operations of its observatory Stratospheric Observatory for Infrared Astronomy (SOFIA) mission.

Statements 1,2 and 3 are correct : SOFIA is a joint program between NASA and the German Aerospace Centre (DLR), and is a telescope capable of making observations from onboard an aeroplane.

- It is a 2.7-meter infrared telescope sitting inside a Boeing 747SP aeroplane, flying at an altitude of 38,000-45,000 feet above the surface.
- It is globally unique and, with the start of regular operations in 2014.
 - It has been successfully used for scientific research during a total of approximately 800 flights.
- It was designed to observe cosmic objects in far-infrared wavelengths.
 - \circ This allows researchers to watch star formation by looking through huge, cold clouds of gas \circ The project has generated 309 scientific studies.
 - \circ In 2020, SOFIA discovered water molecules (H2O) on the sun-facing side of the Moon.
 - In 2019, SOFIA also discovered helium hydride the first molecule formed in the Universe almost 14 billion years ago.
 - SOFIA also identified atmospheric circulation patterns in Jupiter.
 - It also mapped the magnetic field within G47, one of the Milky Way's spiral arms.

9. [ANS] d

[SOL] It is argued that India is at an inflection point vis-a-vis Centre-State relations owing to increasing asymmetry.

Statement 1 is not correct: The preamble does not mention India as a Federal state.

Statement 2 is not correct: Article 1 of the Indian Constitution states, 'India, that is Bharat, shall be a union of states'. The word federation is not mentioned in the constitution. This means India is a union comprising of various states which are an integral part of it. Here, the states cannot break away from the union.

10. [ANS] c

[SOL] The recent remarks by a Hindi actor to the effect that Hindi is the national language of India sparked a controversy over the status of the language under the Constitution. Languages mentioned in the Eighth Schedule

11. [ANS] a

[SOL] According to the latest available data compiled by the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) for 2020, about 76% of all prison inmates in the country were undertrials, of which about 68% were either illiterate or school dropouts.

Statement 1 is correct : Prisons'/'persons detained therein' is a State subject under Entry 4 of List II of the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution of India.

Statement 2 is not correct : Administration and management of prisons is the responsibility of respective State Governments.

• However, the Ministry of Home Affairs provides regular guidance and advice to States and UTs on various issues concerning prisons and prison inmates.

12. [ANS] d

[SOL] Recently ,French company Naval Group announced that it is unable to participate in India's P-75I project due to conditions mentioned in the request for proposal (RFP) related to the Air Independent Propulsion (AIP) system.

Statements 1,2 and 3 are correct :

• AIP is a mechanism that allows the batteries to be charged even while the boat is submerged.

- \circ However, even with AIP, the submarine needs to surface every three weeks or so.
- It offers the possibility of increasing underwater endurance by a factor of up to 3 or 4, which reduces the indiscretion ratio significantly".
- It has a force multiplier effect on lethality of a diesel electric submarine as it enhances the submerged endurance of the boat several fold.
 - Fuel cell-based AIP has merits in performance compared to other technologies.
- It helps to make the diesel generator less dependent on surface air.
- India has been working to develop AIP technology indigenously as well.
 - There are different types of AIP mechanisms available and India is looking for the P-75I project is AIP based on fuel cells.
 - These cells convert chemical energy into electrical energy, recharging the batteries of the submarine.

[SOL] In the absence of statehood for Delhi, there has been a prolonged confrontation on the relative powers of the elected governmentand the Lieutenant Governor/ Union government. Doctrine of purposive construction:

- It is the modern version of mischief rule. It is actually more flexible compared to literal rule and golden rule which tends to concentrate more on the meaning of individual words or phrases. This looks for the purpose of the law.
- This rule allows judges to add or ignore any of the words in the statute while interpreting in order to protect the purpose of creating that law and give fair and equal justice to everyone.

14. [ANS] b

[SOL] Recently, the Central government sought more time to file a reply in plea challenging constitutional validity of the sedition charge under Section 124A of the Indian Penal Code (IPC).

Statement 1 is not correct: Sedition is a non-bailable, cognizable offence, which can invite imprisonment upto three years, or for life, and a fine as imposed by the court in session

Statement 2 is correct: Section 124A of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), which deals with sedition, was drafted by Thomas Babington Macaulay and included in the IPC in 1870. It defines Sedition as every speech or expression that "brings or attempts to bring into hatred or contempt, or excites or attempts to excite disaffection towards the government established by law in India".

15. [ANS] d

[SOL] Recently, India and Denmark agreed to further strengthen the Green Strategic Partnership with a focus on green hydrogen, renewable energy and wastewater management.

Option d is correct: India and Denmark both have ambitious goals within the climate agenda.

- India is the world's third largest CO2 emitter and by 2030, the country is expected to have doubled its carbon emissions.
- Denmark has an ambition to reduce CO2 emissions by 70 per cent by 2030 and aims to undertake international leadership on SDG 7 on affordable and clean energy.
- By partnering, India and Denmark will demonstrate to the world that delivering on ambitious climate and sustainable energy goals is possible.
- The Green Strategic partnership builds on and consolidates the existing agreement establishing a Joint Commission for Cooperation between India and Denmark.
- Joint action plan for five years from 2021 to 2026 for the implementation of the "green strategic partnership that was firmed up.

16. [ANS] d

[SOL] Bhopal, Surat, Bhubaneswar, Udaipur, Ahmedabad, Varanasi and Indore are set to be declared India's 'first set of smart cities'.

Statements 1,2 and 3 are correct : Smart Cities Mission (SCM) is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme launched in 2015.

- It will cover 100 cities and is being implemented by the Ministry of Urban Development (MoUD) and all state and union territory (UT) governments.
 - Of the 100 cities, the seven have taken a lead with most projects completed. Bhopal has completed 92% projects, Surat 82.44%, Udaipur 78%, Bhubaneswar 76%, Indore, Varanasi and Ahmedabad 70%.
- It aims to 'smarten up' cities with eco-friendly hi-tech solutions to urban problems.
 - \circ The mission period ends in June 2023.

17. [ANS] d

[SOL] Recently ,the Defence Ministry introduced a portal, System for Pension Administration (Raksha) (SPARSH), to directly transfer pensions to pensioners. It is an initiative of the Ministry of Defence which aims at providing a comprehensive solution to the administration of pension to the defence pensioners in line with the vision of the government of India of Digital India, Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) and "Minimal Government, Maximum Governance".

- It is established with the objective of empowering a Defence Pensioner with regard to his pension account.
- It will initially cater to the new retirees on roll out and subsequently be extended to cover the existing defence pensioners.

18. [ANS] a

[SOL] Election Commission sent notice to Jharkhand C.M for allotment of mining lease to himself over Office-of-Profit charge.

Statement 1 is not correct: The office of profit has been interpreted as a position that brings to the office-holder some financial gain, remuneration or benefit. The amount of such profit is immaterial. The intent is to avoid the conflict of interests between the duties and interests of an elected member. The constitution does not explicitly define the phrase. However, it has evolved over decades with subsequent judicial pronouncements.

- whether the government is the appointing authority
- whether the government has the power to terminate the appointment
- whether the government determines the remuneration
- what is the source of remuneration
- the power that comes with the position.

Statement 2 is correct: Provisions of Articles 102(1)(e) and 191(1)(e) also protect a legislator occupying a government position if the office in question has been made immune to disqualification by law.

- Article 102 (1): A person shall be disqualified for being chosen as a member of either House of Parliament if he holds any office of profit under the Government of India or the Government of any State, other than an office declared by Parliament by law not to disqualify its holder.
- Article 191 (1): A person shall be disqualified for being chosen as, and for being, a member of the Legislative Assembly or Legislative Council of a State if he holds any office of profit under the Government of India or the Government of any State specified in the First Schedule, other than an office declared by the Legislature of the State by law not to disqualify its holder.

19. [ANS] d

[SOL] Recently, experts stated that the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI)'s star ratings for food products may mislead consumers.

Statement 1 is correct: The rating will be the first such in India, a country burdened with lifestyle diseases. It aims at guiding consumers to opt for healthy food.

Statement 2 is correct: It rates the overall nutritional profile of packaged food and assigns it a rating from half a star to five stars. The decision was based on an Indian Institute of Management (IIM)-Ahmedabad study commissioned by the FSSAI.

Statement 3 is correct: The Health Star Rating (HSR) format ranks a packaged food item based on salt, sugar and fat content and the rating will be printed on the front of the package.

20. [ANS] c

[SOL] Recently, the Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI) in partnership with the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) commenced the International Conference on Disaster Resilient Infrastructure 2022.

Statement 1 is correct: India initiated CDRI as a global partnership of 27 countries in 2019. It launched a programme to help small island states develop resilience to climate crises at the 2021 UN Climate Change Conference (COP26) in Glasgow in November.

Statement 2 is correct: CDRI works on infrastructure and not disaster risk management in general. While CDRI is closely tracking the impact of heatwaves and other extreme events on infrastructure systems, it is not specifically looking at mortality alone. CDRI is working on a range of things in India including:

- Resilience of power systems to extreme temperatures and extreme events, extreme rainfall, etc.
- In multiple sectors, CDRI is looking at how to engage different states in making them disaster and climate-resilient.
- It is monitoring disasters like the heat waves in India.

21. [ANS] a

[SOL] Jog Falls project suffers setback as Centre asks Karnataka about impact assessment. Statements 1 and 2 are correct : Jog Falls is created by the Sharavathi River falling from a height of 253 m (830 ft), making it the second-highest plunge waterfall in India.

• It is also called by alternative names of Gerusoppa falls, Gersoppa Falls and Jogada Gundi. Statement 3 is not correct : Located near Sagara, Shimoga District of Karnataka state.

22. [ANS] b

[SOL] The Kerala health department identified Shigella bacteria as the cause for the food poisoning incident in Kasaragod.

Shigella is a bacterium that belongs to the enterobacter family -- a group of bacteria that reside in the intestine, not all of which cause disease in humans.

• It cause an infection called shigellosis

- It mainly affects the intestine and results in diarrhoea, sometimes bloody, stomach pain, and fever.
- There are four types of Shigella bacteria that affect humans.
 - These are Shigella sonnei, Shigella flexneri, Shigella boydii, and Shigella dysenteriae.
 - The fourth type causes the most severe disease because of the toxin it produces.
- It is a food- and water-borne infection, and can happen when someone consumes contaminated food.

23. [ANS] b

[SOL] Recently, the Supreme Court Collegium led by the Chief Justice of India has recommended two names for appointment as apex court judges.

Statement 1 is not correct: There is no such law or constitutional provision that mentions or defines the collegium system.

Statement 2 is correct: In The Supreme Court Advocates-on-Record Association Vs Union of India, 1993, a nine-judge Constitution Bench overruled the decision and devised a specific procedure called 'Collegium System' for the appointment and transfer of judges in the higher judiciary.

[SOL] Option A is correct: In simple terms, the current account measures the flow of goods, services, and investments into and out of the country. It represents a country's foreign transactions and, like the capital account, is a component of a country's Balance of Payments (BOP). The Current Account Deficit (CAD) is the shortfall between the money flowing in on exports, and the money flowing out on imports. Current Account Deficit and Fiscal Deficit (also known as "budget deficit" is a situation when a nation's expenditure exceeds its revenues) are together known as twin deficits and both often reinforce each other, i.e., a high fiscal deficit leads to higher CAD and vice versa.

25. [ANS] c

[SOL] The commission set up by the Union Government submitted its final report for the delimitation of Assembly and parliamentary constituencies in Jammu and Kashmir.

Statement 1 is not correct: Delimitation is the act or process of fixing limits or boundaries of territorial constituencies in a country or a province having a legislative body for electoral purposes. The job of delimitation is assigned to the Delimitation Commission or a Boundary Commission.

- The Delimitation Commission is appointed by the President of India includes following members:
 - Retired Supreme Court judge
 - Chief Election Commissioner
 - Respective State Election Commissioners.

Statement 2 is not correct: The Delimitation Commission in India is a high-power body whose orders have the force of law.

- Its orders cannot be called in question before any court.
- These orders come into force on a date to be specified by the President of India on this behalf.

26. [ANS] c

[SOL] Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is working on an orbiter mission to Planet Venus.

Option c is correct: Venus is Earth's closest planetary neighbour which is similar in structure but slightly smaller than Earth, it is the second planet from the sun. Thus, Venus has been called Earth's twin.

- Venus is wrapped in a thick, toxic atmosphere filled with carbon dioxide that traps in heat.
- The temperature of Venus is too high, and its atmosphere is highly acidic, just two of the things that would make life impossible.
- Surface temperatures reach a scorching 880 degrees Fahrenheit (471 degrees Celsius), hot enough to melt lead.
- It has no moons and no rings.
- It spins from east to west, the opposite direction from all other planets in our solar system but the same as Uranus.
- Venus' solid surface is a volcanic landscape covered with extensive plains featuring high volcanic mountains and vast ridges.

27. [ANS] c

[SOL] Birth anniversary of India's first Nobel Award winner Rabindranath Tagore was observed recently.

Rabindranath Tagore was born on 7 May 1861 to Debendranath Tagore and Sarada Devi in Kolkata (Calcutta).

- He is popularly known as 'Gurudev'.
- He was primarily known as a writer, poet, playwright, philosopher and aesthetician, music composer, choreographer, and painter.

- He was influenced by the classical poetry of Kalidasa and started writing his own classical poems.
- He released his first collection of poems under the pen name 'Bhanusimha' at 16 years of age.
- He published several books of poetry in the 1880s and completed Manasi (1890), a collection that marks the maturing of his genius.
- He wrote the National Anthems of India and Bangladesh.
- He wrote the song Banglar Mati Banglar Jol (Soil of Bengal, Water of Bengal) to unite the Bengali population after the Bengal partition in 1905.
- He also wrote the famed 'Amar Sonar Bangla' which helped ignite a feeling of nationalism amongst people.
- In 1913, he became the first Indian to receive a Nobel Prize in Literature for his novel 'Geetanjali

[SOL] The Supreme Court said it will look into the issue of "sealed cover jurisprudence" which is adopted by government and prosecuting agencies by handing over "confidential" documents to the court in a sealed cover.

Statement 1 is correct but statement 2 is not correct : Sealed cover jurisprudence is a practice used by the Supreme Court and sometimes lower courts, of asking for or accepting information from government agencies in sealed envelopes that can only be accessed by judges. While a specific law does not define the doctrine of sealed cover, the Supreme Court derives its power to use it from Rule 7 of order XIII of the Supreme Court Rules and Section 123 of the Indian Evidence Act of 1872.

29. [ANS] b

[SOL] Besides France, five Nordic countries comprising Norway, Finland, Denmark, Iceland and Sweden have affirmed their support for India's permanent seat at the United Nations Security Council (UNSC).

Option b is correct: Uniting for Consensus (UfC), nicknamed the Coffee Club, is a movement that developed in the 1990s in opposition to the possible expansion of permanent seats in the United Nations Security Council.

- Under the leadership of Italy, it aims to counter the bids for permanent seats proposed by G4 nations (Brazil, Germany, India, and Japan) and is calling for a consensus before any decision is reached on the form and size of the Security Council.
- It is an informal group comprising 40-odd member states, mostly middle-sized states who oppose bigger regional powers grabbing permanent seats, has been instrumental in holding back reforms to the United Nations Security Council over the past six years.

30. [ANS] a

[SOL] Statement 1 is correct: Sea surface with a temperature higher than 27° C provides a continuous source of water to the storm leading to formation and intensification of tropical cyclone storms.

Statement 2 is correct: Coriolis force is formed due to the rotation of the Earth on its axis. It deflects bodies towards their right in the Northern hemisphere and towards their left in the Southern hemisphere. Coriolis force provides circular movement to the cyclone.

Statement 3 is not correct: Small differences in the vertical wind speed is required for formation and intensification of tropical cyclone storms.

Statement 4 is not correct: Cyclones are characterised by a low pressure area at the Centre, which is called the Eye of the Cyclone. Therefore, a pre-existing low pressure area is conducive to the formation of a cyclone.

31. [ANS] b

[SOL] In News: PM paid tributes to Gopal Krishna Gokhale on his birth anniversary.

Option b is correct: Gokhale founded the Servants of India Society(SIS) in Maharashtra's Pune on June 12, 1905. The SIS launched campaigns for the promotion of education, health care and sanitation. It also made efforts to eradicate social evils such as untouchability and oppression of women. He started an English weekly newspaper, The Hitavada (The people's paper). He was a mentor to both Mahatma Gandhi and Mohammed Ali Jinnah. Gandhi Ji, in his autobiography, described Gokhale as "pure as crystal, gentle as a lamb, brave as a lion and chivalrous to a fault and the most perfect man in the political field."

• Similarly, Jinnah was so inspired by Gokhle that his aspiration, during the early years of his political life, was to become a "Muslim Gokhle".

32. [ANS] c

[SOL] Recently, the Vice President of India called for renewed thrust to implement reforms in police forces.

Statement 1 is correct: The Indian Police Service (IPS) constituted under Article 312 of the Constitution of India, is one of the three All India services, the other two being the Indian Administrative Service (IAS) and Indian Forest Service (IFS).

Statement 2 is correct: The Indian Police Service (IPS) replaced the Indian (Imperial) Police in 1948, a year after India's Independence.

33. [ANS] c

[SOL] The Ministry of Information and Broadcasting announced a total budget of Rs 597 Crore towards large scale preservation of films under the National Film Heritage Mission.

Both the statements are not correct: The National Film Heritage Mission is an important initiative to preserve and conserve the country's cinematic heritage.

- Launch year: It was launched by the Information & Broadcasting Ministry in the year 2016.
- Nodal Agency: National Film Archive of India (NFAI) is the nodal organization for the implementation of this project.
- Objectives:
 - ➤ Undertake film condition assessment
 - ➤ Preventive conservation of around 150,000 film reels
 - ➤ Digitization of around 3500 films, picture
 - > Sound restoration of around 2000 landmark films of Indian cinema
 - > Construction of Preservation and Conservation facilities (vaults), training and workshops
 - ➤ Creating a comprehensive Web-based End to End IT solution.

National Film Archive of India (NFAI)

• Established in 1964 under the aegis of the I&B Ministry, the National Film Archive of India aims to trace, acquire and preserve the heritage of national cinema and a representative collection of world cinema.

34. [ANS] a

[SOL] Statement 1 is correct: India and Pakistan were made members in 2017.

Statement 2 is not correct: Turkmenistan is not a party to SCO.

Statement 3 is not correct: The SCO's official languages are Russian and Chinese.

• It currently has 8 members with the latest being India and Pakistan who were made members in 2017. Note: Turkmenistan is not a party to SCO.

[SOL] Statement 1 is correct: An Electoral Bond is like a promissory note that may be purchased by a person who is a citizen of India or incorporated or established in India.

Statement 2 is not correct: One can purchase these bonds only digitally or through cheques. As of now, only SBI is authorised to issue the Electoral Bonds.

Statement 3 is not correct: Only the Political Parties registered under Section 29A of the Representation of the People Act (RPA), 1951 (43 of 1951) and which secured not less than one per cent of the votes polled in the last General Election to the House of the People or the Legislative Assembly of the State, shall be eligible to receive the Electoral Bonds.

36. [ANS] b

[SOL] In Context: The La Nina is being blamed this year for worsening the longest spell of heat waves in north, west and Central India.

Statement 1 is not correct: El-Nino: It leads to warming in surface temperature of the eastern Pacific Ocean region. This is associated with an increase in rainfall along the western coast of South America and a decrease in rainfall over the Indian subcontinent. It also leads to westerly winds, instead of the generally occurring easterly winds.

Statement 2 is correct: La-Nina: It is the reverse phenomenon of El-Nino. The temperatures over the eastern Pacific Ocean increases, along with a decrease in rainfall. Also, the rainfall over the Indian subcontinent increases, along with augmentation of the strength of surface-level easterly winds.

El-Nino causes higher temperatures and lesser rainfall over the Indian subcontinent, during the monsoon season. On the other hand, la-Nina increases the rainfall and decreases the temperature. Therefore, it is the La-Nina which is (ironically!) much warmly welcomed in the Indian subcontinent.

While El-Nino leads to drought events in the subcontinent, La-Nina is primarily associated with flood events. These disasters affect the socio-economic status of the affected communities.

37. [ANS] a

[SOL] Statement 1 is correct: It was fought in the year 1576 between Maharana Pratap and Mughal forces led by Raja Man Singh of Amber (general of the Mughal emperor Akbar). Maharana Pratap bravely fought the war but eventually lost it. According to some mythological texts, Chetak who was Maharana Pratap's loyal horse, also gave up his life when Maharana Pratap was leaving the battlefield. Maharana re-gathered his forces, fought and won against the Mughals after six years in 1582.

- The pardoning powers defined in the Constitution
 - Pardon: it means completely absolving the person of the crime and letting him go free. The pardoned criminal will be like a normal citizen.
 - Commutation: it means changing the type of punishment given to the guilty into a less harsh one, for example, a death penalty commuted to a life sentence.
 - Reprieve: it means a delay allowed in the execution of a sentence, usually a death sentence, for a guilty person to allow him some time to apply for Presidential Pardon or some other legal remedy to prove his innocence or successful rehabilitation.

- Respite: it means reducing the quantum or degree of the punishment to a criminal given some special circumstances, like pregnancy, mental condition etc.
- Remission: it means changing the quantum of the punishment without changing its nature, for example reducing twenty-year rigorous imprisonment to ten years.

- Chief Election Commissioner can be removed by the president on the basis of a resolution passed to that effect by both the Houses of Parliament with the special majority, either on the ground of proved misbehaviour or incapacity. Thus, he does not hold his office till the pleasure of the president, though he is appointed by him.

How do we prevent inflation?

- Change the monetary policy: The primary strategy is to change the monetary policy by adjusting the interest rates. Higher interest rates decrease the demand in the economy. This results in lower economic growth and therefore, lowers inflation.
- Controlling the money supply can also help in preventing inflation.

- Invest in long-term investments: When it comes to long-term investments, spending money now for investments can allow you to benefit from inflation in the future.

Statement 1 is correct: Muslims, Sikhs, Christians, Buddhists, Zoroastrians (Parsis) and Jains have been notified as minority communities under Section 2 (c) of the National Commission for Minorities Act, 1992.

Statement 2 is not correct: Naya Savera: Free Coaching and Allied Scheme for the candidates/students belonging to Minority Communities. Padho Pardesh: Scheme of Interest Subsidy on Educational Loans for Overseas Studies for the Student belonging to Minority Communities.

- Initially, SDR was defined as equivalent to 0.888671 grams of fine gold, which at the time, was also equivalent to one U.S. dollar but after the collapse of the Bretton Woods system, the SDR was redefined as a basket of five currencies namely the U.S. dollar, the Euro, the Chinese Renminbi, the Japanese Yen, and the British Pound Sterling.

[SOL] Option c is correct: There are many reasons for the formation of monsoons in India.

- The presence of the high-pressure area, east of Madagascar, approximately at 20°S over the Indian Ocean. The intensity and position of this high-pressure area affects the Indian Monsoon.
- The Tibetan plateau gets intensely heated during summer, which results in strong vertical air currents and the formation of low pressure over the plateau at about 9 km above sea level. Hence, statement 1 is incorrect.

Following are a few more reasons for the formation of monsoons in the Indian Subcontinent:

1. The differential heating and cooling of land and water creates low pressure on the landmass of India while the seas around experience comparatively high pressure.

2. The shift of the position of the Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in summer, over the Ganga plain (this is the equatorial trough normally positioned about 5°N of the equator. It is also known as the monsoon trough during the monsoon season).

- IMF and the World Bank are also known as the Bretton Woods twins because both were agreed to be set up at a conference in Bretton Woods in the US.
- It is governed by and accountable to the 190 countries that make up its near-global membership. • India became a member in December 1945.
- Aim: To ensure the stability of the international monetary system (the system of exchange rates and international payments) which enables countries and their citizens) to transact with each other.

• Its mandate was updated in 2012 to include all macroeconomic and financial sector issues

that bear on global stability.

- Financing: The IMF's resources mainly come from the money that countries pay as their capital subscription (quotas) when they become members.
 - Each member of the IMF is assigned a quota, based broadly on its relative position in the world economy.
 - Countries can then borrow from this pool when they fall into financial difficulty.
- Publications:
 - World Economic Outlook
 - Global Financial Stability Report
 - Fiscal Monitor
 - \circ Global Policy Agenda

[SOL] Statement 1 is not correct: IMO is the United Nations specialized agency (not an Entity) with responsibility for the safety and security of shipping and the prevention of marine and atmospheric pollution by ships.

Statement 3 is correct: The International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (MARPOL) convention was adopted at IMO to prevent and minimize pollution from ships - both accidental pollution and that from routine operations.

It has a distinct odour similar to turpentine but it does not burn.

Endosulfan was used widely on crops like cashew, cotton, tea, paddy, fruits and others. The most important congenital anomalies are those associated with the brain, like mental retardation and also cerebral palsy. And this is due to the exposure of the parents of these children to endosulfan. Hence, statement 2 is correct.

[SOL] According to the Places of worship Act no person can convert any place of worship of any religious denomination or any section into a place of worship of a different section of the same religious denomination or of a different religious denomination or any section.

• Exemptions to the Act:

• If any place of worship is disputed, in August 1947, or is pending in court will be exempted

from the provisions of this act and no suit shall lie in any court with respect to the conversion of the religious character of a place of worship, as existing on that date. Hence option 3 is correct.

- Country specific data: Singapore was the topmost investor in India accounting for 27% of the FDI, followed by the US at 18% and Mauritius at 16%.
- Significance: India is rapidly emerging as a preferred country for foreign investments in the manufacturing sector.
 - The country's foreign investment inflows increased 20-fold since the financial year 2003-04 when it recorded mere \$4.3 billion.
- Parliament had passed the Insurance Amendment Bill 2021 to increase the FDI limit in the insurance sector to 74% from 49%.

- \circ It is led by the World Economic Forum and the US government.
- It was launched at COP26 as a flagship public-private partnership to clean up the most carbon-intensive sectors.
- Aim:
 - To create early markets for clean technologies through policy measures and private sector engagements.
 - The coalition's members have committed to purchasing out of their total industrial materials and long-distance transport spending a percentage from suppliers using near-zero or zero-carbon solutions, despite the premium cost.

• Target:

• It is a global initiative aimed at decarbonising the heavy industry and long-distance transport sectors responsible for 30 percent of global emissions.

- The First Movers Coalition targets sectors, including aluminium, aviation, chemicals, concrete, shipping, steel and trucking.
 - A proportion expected to rise to over 50 percent by mid-century without urgent progress on clean technology innovation.
- The coalition also announced two new target sectors: carbon dioxide removal and aluminium, which join the four existing sectoral pledges (aviation, shipping, steel and trucking) launched at COP26.
- Participation:
 - Besides India, Denmark, Italy, Japan, Norway, Singapore, Sweden and the United Kingdom have also joined the US as government partners to create early markets for clean technologies.
 - \circ India, along with Japan and Sweden, has also joined the steering board of the coalition.

[SOL] Localisation will make it mandatory for companies collecting critical consumer data to store and process it in data centres present within India's borders. Cost issues:

- According to Facebook's parent company Meta Platforms, requiring local storage and processing of data or similar requirements could increase the cost and complexity of delivering their services. Hence statement 1 is incorrect.

 Indigenous components:
 - The majority of the components used to build this system have been manufactured and assembled within the country.
 - It contains an indigenous software stack developed by C-DAC, in line with the Make in India initiative.

 - He started one of the most powerful social reform movements against untouchability in India", built Patit Pavan Mandir in the Ratnagiri district to allow entry to all Hindus, including Dalits. "He was the first to envision a casteless India"
 - He established a secret organisation called Abhinav Bharat Society in 1904 with his brother, Ganesh Damodar Savarkar.

- \circ He was associated with India House and founded student societies like Free India Society.
- \circ He wrote 'The Indian War of Independence, 1857' during his jail time.

- Aim: The platform aims to create new opportunities, curb digital monopolies and by supporting micro, small and medium enterprises and small traders and help them get on online platforms.
- It will be launched in five cities: Delhi NCR, Bengaluru, Bhopal, Shillong and Coimbatore.
- Potential benefits of ONDC
 - Access to more buyers
 - Better discoverability of products and cost
 - Autonomy on terms because of multiple choices for being digitally visible
 - Lower cost of doing business
 - More options for value chain services like logistics and fulfilment
- These are not the features of ONDC
 - A government regulatory body
 - A super aggregator application or a platform
 - A central intermediary
 - A medium to help digitise business

- The Saptakoshi crosses into northern Bihar, India where it branches into distributaries before joining the Ganges near Kursela in Katihar district.
- The river basin is surrounded by ridges which separate it from the Yarlung Tsangpo River in the north, the Gandaki in the west and the Mahananda in the east.

Statement 2 is not correct :Kosi River is one of the largest tributaries of the Ganges.
