

# MINISTRY OF POWER SEEKS COMMENTS ON DRAFT CARBON CREDIT TRADING SCHEME

- Earlier, Parliament cleared Energy Conservation (Amendment) Bill, 2022 with provisions to make use of clean energy mandatory and thereby paving way for setting up a carbon market.
  - Carbon markets are a tool for putting a price on carbon emissions— they establish trading systems where carbon credits or allowances can be bought and sold.
  - > A carbon credit is a kind of tradable permit that **equals one tonne of carbon dioxide removed, reduced, or sequestered from the atmosphere.**
- Types of carbon markets:
  - **Compliance markets:** created because of any national, regional and/or international requirement.
  - > Voluntary markets: Issuance, buying and selling of carbon credits, on a voluntary basis.
- Examples include EU's emissions trading systems (ETS), India's— Renewable Energy Certificates and Energy Savings Certificates, Clean Development Mechanism (CDM), adopted under Kyoto Protocol.
- Key provisions of draft scheme
  - Set up an Indian Carbon Market Governing Board (ICMGB) for administrative and regulatory functioning of the market.
  - Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE) would be the administrator for carbon market and operate as secretariat for ICMGB.
  - Central Electricity Regulatory Commission (CERC) as regulator of trading activities in carbon market.



# INDIA'S FIRST QUANTUM COMMUNICATION TELECOM NETWORK LINK MADE OPERATIONAL

- A highly secured link, developed by Centre for Development of Telematics (C-DOT), under Department of Telecommunications, was established for the first time in India.
- Quantum Communication refers to communication channels that leverage laws of quantum physics to protect data and make it more secure than traditional transmission.
  - > In traditional key-based cryptography, data and keys are sent as classical bits (representing 1 and 0) as a stream of electrical or optical pulses.
- However, in a quantum communication network, data is transmitted via qubits.
  - > Qubits are particles usually photons of light in a superposition state, meaning they can be in multiple states and represent numerous combinations of 0 and 1.
  - > If a hacker tries to read them in transit, super-fragile quantum state "collapses" to either 1 or 0 and attempt to hack will also be recorded eventually.
- This property has helped to create **networks for transmitting highly sensitive data based on** a process called **quantum key distribution**, or QKD.
  - > QKD involves transmission of encrypted data as classical bits while decryption key is encoded and transmitted in a quantum state using qubits.

# JAPAN TO CONNECT LANDLOCKED NORTH EAST REGION (NER) WITH BANGLADESH

- Northeast India may soon get a trade gateway through Matarbari deep seaport in Bangladesh.
- Japan is supporting Bangladesh in development of Matarbari port and improve connectivity in region through Bay of Bengal Industrial Growth Belt (BIG-B) initiative.
  - > BIG-B aims to accelerate industrial agglomeration along Dhaka-Chittagong-Cox's Bazar belt area and beyond, encompassing developing economic infrastructure, improving investment environment and fostering connectivity.
- Recently, Japanese PM while outlining Japan's Indo-Pacific strategy stated that Japan will promote Bay of Bengal-Northeast India industrial value chain concept to foster growth of entire region.
  - > Japan is also assisting in road connectivity in NER to connect to Japanese-assisted projects in Bangladesh.
- Japan has been working closely with India to support development of NER through India-Japan Act East Forum (AEF).
  - > AEF aims to promote connectivity within this region and between this region and Southeast Asia.
  - > Forum reflects synergy between India's Act East Policy and Japan's vision for a free and open Indo-Pacific.
- Other initiatives for NER
  - >Kaladan Multimodal Transit Transport Project for connectivity with Myanmar.
  - > Protocol on Inland Water Transit and Trade between India and Bangladesh.
  - > India-Myanmar-Thailand Trilateral Highway.

#### DON'T INTRODUCE LION IN SAME REGION AS CHEETAH: NATIONAL TIGER CONSERVATION AUTHORITY (NTCA)

- Supreme Court had in 2013 ordered to translocate Asiatic lions from Gujarat to Kuno National Park (KNP) in Madhya Pradesh.
  - Experts had recommended relocation of lions because Gir (Gujarat) was becoming crowded, and there was a risk of a disease decimating the entire population,
- However, NTCA has now stated that it is not appropriate to introduce lion in the same area as the cheetah as this would be detrimental to the survival of both species due to interspecies competition.
- > Recently, Cheetahs from Namibia and South Africa were introduced in KNP.
- Earlier, **Project Lion**, prepared by **Wildlife Institute of India** for Gujarat government, envisaged **landscape ecology based conservation** in Gujarat by integrating **conservation and eco-development**.
  - It also identified Barda (Gujarat) as a potential site where Asiatic lions can be introduced and populated.
- About Asiatic Lion
  - > Only found in India
  - > Habitat: Population limited to following protected areas in Gujarat Gir National Park, Gir Sanctuary, Pania Sanctuary, Mitiyala Sanctuary, and Girnar Sanctuary.
  - > IUCN status: Endangered.
  - Threat: Vulnerable to disease, genetic inbreeding, potential poaching, accidental deaths due to human causes etc.

#### INDIA METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (IMD) TO ISSUE HEAT INDEX (HI) READING

- IMD, in addition to giving out day's maximum and minimum temperatures, will soon issue a HI- a reading that gives estimation of what temperature actually feels like.
  - It factors day's relative humidity, wind speed, maximum temperature, and cloud cover.
  - > A colour-based warning will also be issued, based on the expected HI, listing precautions people can take.
- Calculation of HI will help states in formulating better Heat Action Plans (HAPs) for heatwave assessment, forecast, preparedness and mitigation.
  - Heat wave is considered if maximum temperature of a station reaches at least 40°C for Plains and at least 30°C for Hilly regions.
- Recently, an assessment of HAPs across states by Centre for Policy Research (CPR) highlighted that:
  - Humid heat spells are not being considered in making HAPs.
  - > Most HAPs are not built for local context and have an oversimplified view of the hazard.
  - > HAPs fail to identify vulnerable groups.
- Recommendations by CPR on HAPs
  - > Incorporation of climate projections, and localisation of heat hazard definition.
  - Incorporate vulnerability assessments and holistic risk assessments.
  - Create mechanisms for inter- and intra-state sharing of knowledge and best practices.

# FAME II SUBSIDY FOR ELECTRIC VEHICLES (EVs) AT ONLY 52% OF THE TARGET

- Findings are part of a parliamentary standing committee report highlighting issues and suggesting ways to improve implementation of Faster Adoption & Manufacturing of Electric (& Hybrid) Vehicles (FAME) Scheme.
- Issues highlighted
  - > Lacklustre progress in both physical and financial targets.
  - > Only few cities were covered for e-Buses.
  - > EV charging stations sanctioned only for a few cities.
  - Varying utilization of subsidies across EV segments. While target for e-buses was achieved but in three-wheelers just 15.17% of the target has been reached.
- Recommendations
  - > Scheme should be extended further with new targets, incentives, and measures.
  - > Place greater **emphasis on implementation and extend subsidy to private vehicles,** along with exemption from road tax, registration fee, etc.
  - > Boost to charging infrastructure.
- Ministry of Heavy Industries launched FAME scheme in 2015 under National Electric Mobility Mission Plan (NEMMP) to encourage electric and hybrid vehicle purchase by providing financial support.
  - **FAME Phase I,** functional till 2019, had **four focus areas** i.e., technological development, demand generation, pilot project and charging infrastructure components.
  - > FAME-II was launched in 2019 and will continue till March 2024 focusing electrification of public & shared transportation.

Open ballot system	• Supreme Court (SC) dismissed a PIL seeking to allow secret ballot in polls for Rajya Sabha and state legislative councils.

	• Currently, a borrower account is declared as fraud based on the findings of a forensic report where the loan has become a non-performing asset (where interest or principal payment is overdue for 90 days).
before fraud tag	> A 2016 circular by RBI allowed banks to classify wilful defaulters as 'fraud'.
Index Providers	• Government has put onus of regulating the Index Providers on SEBI.
	<ul> <li>Index providers are those institutions that formulate and manage indices.</li> </ul>
	> Their function is to classify and define markets or a proportion of a market and provide a <b>benchmark of performance</b> for that market.
	> An index allows investors and other stakeholders to get a snapshot of the market.
	• In India, it is <b>carried out by subsidiaries of stock exchanges</b> , as a joint venture between the exchange and an index provider.
	• Ex. Nifty50 by NSE Indices, and Sensex by a venture of S&P Dow Jones and BSE.
	<ul> <li>Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs is evaluating proposals from several states for creation of new cities.</li> </ul>
	• XV Finance Commission had recommended a performance-based challenge fund of ₹ 8,000 crore to States for incubation of new cities.
Incubation of New cities	> Amount available for each proposed new city is ₹ 1,000 crore and a State can have only one new city.
