MICROFINANCE INSTITUTIONS (MFIs) TO PLAY LEADING ROLE IN INDIA'S ECONOMIC GROWTH

- Findings are part of a study by PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) and Association of Microfinance Institutions of India that also highlighted:
 - > MFIs offered credit to around 6 crore borrowers, from low-income households, in the last few years.
 - > Challenges faced by MFIs: diverse nature of customer segments such as small farmers, vendors and labourers; dependence on physical modes of interaction etc.
- Microfinance is a form of financial service which provides small loans and other financial services to poor and low-income households.
 - > Malegam Committee (2011) helped establish microfinance as a legitimate asset class.
- Microfinance Delivery Model in India includes:
 - > Scheduled commercial banks lending both directly as well as through business correspondents (BCs) and self-help groups (SHGs).
 - > Cooperative banks.
 - > Non-banking financial companies (NBFCs).
 - > MFIs registered as NBFCs as well as in other forms.
- Significance:
 - > Women's empowerment by routing credit directly to women, thereby enhancing their status within their families, community and society at large.
 - > Provision of credit to poor without need for collateral.
 - > Promote financial inclusion and Employment generation.
- Challenges: Over-indebtedness of borrowers, Comparative high-interest rate, Over-reliance on commercial banks for funds availability.

INDIA EYES ₹35KCR INVESTMENTS BY 2047 TO CREATE WATERWAYS NETWORK SAYS CHAIRMAN IWAI

- Chairman of Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI) stated that plan will include developing waterways and jetties to improve navigable capacity of Indian rivers.
- India has an extensive network of inland waterways in form of rivers, canals, backwaters and creeks that may supplement over-burdened railways and congested roadways.
 - ➤ To promote Inland Water Transport (IWT), 111 waterways have been declared as National Waterways (NWs) under National Waterways Act, 2016.
 - > Of these, 13 NWs are operational.
- Benefits of IWT: eco-friendly and cheaper (less fuel consumption per tonne-km), better connectivity to hinterland, require relatively less maintenance etc.

- Challenges faced in IWT: Decreased water flow due to industrial, agricultural and other uses, inadequate water channel depth, Excessive Siltation, low technology adaption etc.
- Other initiatives taken
 - > PANI (Portal for Asset & Navigation Information) provides detailed information on various waterways.
 - > CAR-D (Cargo Data) Portal, a web based portal for all cargo and cruise movement data of NWs.
 - > Ro-Ro/Ro-Pax Service Commenced in Various NWs.
- In a related development, **PM flagged off World's Longest River Cruise-MV Ganga Vilas** (From Varanasi, UP to Dibrugarh, Assam via Bangladesh) with an aim **to boost river cruise tourism.**





ASIAN WATERBIRD CENSUS (AWC) 2023 BEING CONDUCTED IN INDIA

- AWC, an annual event, is a citizen science programme supporting conservation and management of wetlands and waterbirds.
 - > AWC is part of global International Waterbird Census (IWC) coordinated by Wetland International (WI). It was initiated in 1987 in Indian subcontinent.
- In India, AWC is jointly coordinated by Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS) and WI (global not-for-profit organisation).
 - > BNHS, formed in 1883, is a non-governmental organization engaged in conservation of biodiversity research.
- > BNHS has been designated as a Scientific and Industrial Research Organization (SIRO) by Department of Science & Technology.
- AWC contributes to several conservation activities including:
 - > Convention on Migratory Species (CMS), also known as Bonn Convention, provides a global platform for conservation of migratory animals and their habitats.
 - > Implementation of East Asian-Australasian Flyway Partnership Initiative (EAAFP) and Central Asian Flyway (CAF) Action Plan.
 - EAAFP is an informal and voluntary initiative, to protect migratory waterbirds.
 - CAF covers area of Eurasia between Arctic and Indian Oceans and associated island chains. Geographically it covers 30 countries of North, Central and South Asia and Trans-Caucasus.
 - > BirdLife International's Important Bird Area Programme.
 - ➤ IUCN/BirdLife International's Global Species Programme (Red List).
 - > Wetlands International's Waterbird Population Estimates programme.

NATION CELEBRATED VARIOUS HARVEST FESTIVAL **ON JANUARY 14TH**

- Makar Sankranti is major harvest festival celebrated across India and different states celebrate festival under different names, traditions and festivities.
 - > Festival is dedicated to Sun God, Surya and marks the first day of sun's transit into Makara (Capricorn).
 - > Makar Sankranti heralds end of winter and start of longer days as sun moves northward.

NEW STUDIES CONDUCTED TO UNDERSTAND MODERN FORM OF GLOBAL OVERTURNING **CIRCULATION (GOC)**

- GOC refers to equatorward transport of cold, deep waters and poleward transport of warm, near-surface waters.
 - > It is responsible for transport of carbon and heat among ocean basins and between ocean and atmosphere.
- GOC is a system of two connected overturning cells:
 - > Upper cell is linked to formation of North Atlantic Deep Water (NADW) and its shallower return flow to form Atlantic Meridional Overturning Circulation (AMOC).
 - > Lower cell (referred as Southern Ocean Meridional Overturning Circulation) is associated with formation of Antarctic Bottom Water (AABW) and its return flow as Pacific Deep Water (PDW).
- Studies have indicated that tectonically driven changes in ocean gateways such as closure of Central American Seaway (CAS), since late Miocene period, had impacted GOC.
 - > CAS is a **body of water** that once **separated** North America from South America.
- Now, National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research reconstructed Deep Circulation record of Indian Ocean and provided evidence in support of theory that closure of CAS led to evolution of modern form of GOC.
 - > Indian Ocean does not have any major deep-water formations of its own. It acts only as a host for both GOC components.





WORLD SOCIAL REPORT 2023: LEAVING NO ONE BEHIND IN AN AGEING WORLD RELEASED

- It is a flagship publication of Department of Economic and Social Affairs of United Nations Secretariat.
 - > Report builds on framework of Madrid International Plan of Action on Ageing (MIPAA) and explores social and economic opportunities and challenges that population ageing presents.
 - MIPAA was adopted at second World Assembly on Ageing in April 2002.

Key Findings

- ➤ Number of persons aged 65 years or older is **expected to double over next** three decades surpassing 1.6 billion in 2050 (accounting for more than 16% of global population).
- > Northern Africa and Western Asia and sub-Saharan Africa are expected to experience fastest growth.
- > Poverty levels at older ages are typically higher among women, due to lower levels of participation in formal labour markets, shorter working careers and lower wages compared to men.

Recommendations

- > Promote labour market participation, increase productivity, uphold good health and prevent poverty throughout people's lifetimes.
- > Policies to reduce inequality and promote economic security at older ages in a fiscally sustainable manner.
- Other global initiatives for Older people
 - > UN Principles for Older Persons, 1991
 - > UN designated 2021- 2030 as Decade of Healthy Ageing

Initiatives launched to assist the Global South

- PM unveiled following initiatives:
 - > Aarogya Maitri project to provide medical supplies to any developing country hit by natural disasters or humanitarian crisis.

INITIATIVES TAKEN IN INDIA

- > Global South Science and Technology initiative will be launched to share expertise in areas such as space technology and nuclear energy.
- > Global South Centre of Excellence will be established for research on development solutions to be implemented around the world.
- > Global-South Young Diplomats Forum, to connect youthful officers of foreign ministries.
- > Global-South Scholarships for students from developing countries to pursue higher education in India.



China, Bhutan boundary talks

- Both sides agreed to push forward a three-step roadmap for Expediting China-Bhutan **Boundary Negotiations.**
- Since 1984, China-Bhutan border dispute largely focused on two areas:
 - > Western Areas of Bhutan, including Doklam and other areas at tri-junction border of India, China and Bhutan.
 - Northern Areas of Bhutan including Jakarlung and Pasamlung valleys.
- More recently, China has also laid claims to Bhutan's Eastern Sakteng region including Bhutan Sakteng wildlife sanctuary.
- Significance for India: Strategic threat to Siliguri corridor (also known as Chicken's Neck), Bhutan's eastern sector proximity to Arunachal Pradesh etc.



Small Magellanic Cloud (SMC)

- NASA's James Webb telescope has found a star formation (Called NGC 346) in a dynamic cluster that lies within SMC.
- Visible to naked eye from southern hemisphere, SMC is smaller of the two irregular galaxies that make up tMagellanic Clouds.
 - > These two galaxies orbit the Milky Way once every 1,500 million years, and each other once every 900 million years.
- Magellanic Clouds were formed at about same time as Milky Way Galaxy, approximately 13 billion years ago.

Articles 38 (1), 39 (e), 41 and 46 makes it incumbent on state to make provision for public assistance in old age.

Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007

Various schemes like Atal Vayo Abhyudaya Yojana, National Programme for the Health Care of Elderly, Pradhan Mantri Vaya Vandana Yojana etc.

India is a signatory to International **conventions** on ageing like MIPPA, UN Decade of Healthy Ageing etc.









Financial Services Institutions Bureau (FSIB)

- FSIB recommended MDs for Bank of Baroda and Bank of India.
- FSIB is set up, under Department of Financial Services (DFS), Ministry of Finance, for:
 - > Recommending whole-time directors and non-executive chairpersons on Boards of financial services institutions.
 - > Advising on certain other matters relating to personnel management in these institutions.
- FSIB replaced Banks Board Bureau.
- Composition of FSIB:
 - **Chairperson** to be nominated by Central Government.
 - > Ex officio members: Secretary in charge of DFS, Department of Public Enterprises, Chairperson of IRDAI, Deputy Governor of RBI.
 - > Several part-time members with subject matter knowledge.



Neelakurinji (Strobilanthes kunthiana)

- Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF) has listed Neelakurinji Schedule III of Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, including it on list of protected plants.
- About Neelakurinji
 - > It is a **shrub that grows in the shola forests of Western Ghats** in South India.
 - Neelakurinji flowers bloom once every 12 years.
 - > Plant is named after the famous Kunthi River which flows through Kerala's Silent Valley National Park, where plant occurs abundantly.
 - Eravikulam National Park, near Munnar, is known for widespread blooming of kurinji.
 - > Blue colour of Kurinji has given Nilgiri hills its name, literally meaning Blue Mountains.



Deployment of innovative 5G use cases

- Vidisha (Madhya Pradesh) became the first ever district in India for on ground deployment of **innovative 5G use cases** offered by startups.
 - > Department of Telecommunications, Under Telecom Startups & MSMEs Mission (TSuM) & 5G Vertical Engagement Partnership Program (VEPP) have been facilitating collaborations of Digital Communication Tech - startups & SMEs to potential user communities viz. State governments, Smart cities etc.
- 5G use cases include
 - > Superceuticals: 5G/4G Enabled smart health kiosk.
 - > Ambupod: 5G/4G Enabled Auto Ambulance.
 - > Dvara- Surabhi: For Unique Biometric muzzle identity of cattle.



First Constitution literate district

- Kollam district (Kerala) has become India's first Constitution literate district.
- As part of campaign called 'the Citizen' around 16.3 lakh people in district above the age of 10 have been educated on various aspects of the Constitution.
- Kollam has a varied colonial past under Portuguese, Dutch and British.
- Kollam has been centre of cashew industry in Kerala from time of the Portuguese and still continues to be largest processed cashew exporter in India.



Places in News

- Peru (Capital: Lima)
- Peru has declared a state of emergency in the capital of Lima and several other regions.
- Political Boundaries
 - Location: On West Coast of South America, bordered by Pacific Ocean.
 - > Bordered by Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, and Ecuador.
- Geographical features
 - > Terrain: Western coastal plain (costa), high and rugged Andes in center (sierra), eastern lowland jungle of Amazon Basin (selva).
 - > Highest Point: Nevado Huascaran.
 - > Major rivers: Amazon, Purus, Jurua etc.
