SUPREME COURT (SC) CONSTITUTION BENCH QUESTIONS UTILITY OF ADVANCE MEDICAL DIRECTIVE (AMD) OR LIVING WILL

- Hearing the **petition seeking modification of its guidelines for Living Will**, laid down in Common Cause v Union of India (2018), **SC stated:**
 - AMD** can be **applied only in narrow area** where patients become so terminally ill that they are **not in a position** to say that **treatment must stop**.
 - AMD or Living Will is a **legal document** that specifies **type of medical care** that an **individual does or does not want** in the event they are **unable to communicate their wishes**.
 - Guidelines lack utility** as in India a person is **anyway free to refuse invasive treatment and accept death**.
 - Legislature** is much **more endowed** with **skills and sources of knowledge** to enact a relevant law.
- In 2018, SC **upheld legality of passive euthanasia** and laid down **procedure for living wills** in India.
 - Euthanasia** is practice of ending life of a patient to limit the patient's suffering.
 - It can be **active** (killing a patient by active means) or **passive** (intentionally letting a patient die by withholding artificial life support such as a ventilator or feeding tube).
- Accordingly, **AMD** can be effectuated under **three cases** (refer image).

- 01 When a person is suffering from a terminal condition
- 02 When a person is in a persistently unconscious condition
- 03 When the person is suffering from an end-stage condition

- Important judgements/reports related to Euthanasia**
 - P. Rathinam Case (1994):** struck down section 309 of Indian Penal Code (attempt to suicide) as unconstitutional.
 - Gian Kaur case (1996):** both assisted suicide and euthanasia were unlawful.
 - Aruna Shanbaug Case (2011):** SC allowed passive euthanasia for the first time.
 - Law Commission's 241st report** on Passive Euthanasia (2012) also recognized individual autonomy and the need for euthanasia in certain cases.

PURANA QILA: ARCHAEOLOGICAL SURVEY OF INDIA (ASI) REOPENS TRENCHES EXCAVATED EARLIER TO FIND FIRST OCCUPANTS

- ASI undertook **excavations in 1969-73, 2013-14 and 2017-18**.
 - Identified as ancient settlement of Indraprastha (capital of Pandavas), **a continuous habitation of 2,500 years was established in earlier excavations**.
- Findings from earlier excavation include:**
 - Painted grey ware** from 900 BC, an **earthen pottery sequence** from Maurya to Shunga, Kushana, Gupta, Rajput, Delhi Sultanate, and Mughal periods.
 - Artefacts** such as sickles, parers, terracotta toys, kiln-burnt bricks, beads, terracotta figurines, and seals.
- Purana Qila was **built by Mughal Emperor Humayun as a part of his new city of Dinpanah** in the 16th century.
 - Apart from archaeology, **textual sources such as Ain-i-Akbari of Abul Fazal** (16th century), mention that fort was built at site of Indraprastha.
- Architectural features of Purana Qila Complex**

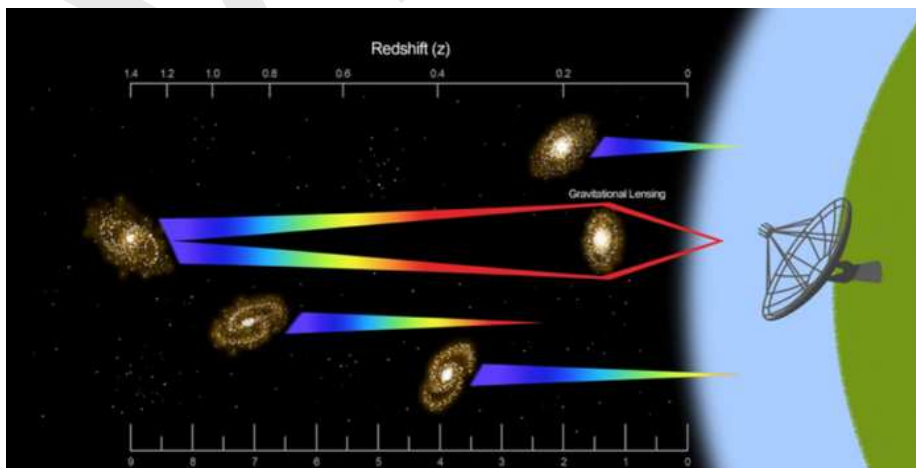
Qila-e-Kuhna mosque	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Built by Sher Shah. It reflects a transitional stage between architecture of Lodhis and Mughals.
Sher Mandal	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Built by Sher Shah, an octagonal structure built in red sandstone and decorated with white and black marble inlay. Humayun made it into a library and died after falling from the steps of this structure.
Other structures	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A Baoli for managing water supply and a hammam (bathhouse) is present. Lal Darwaza and Khairul Manazil are considered part of this complex. Three majestic Gateways: Bada Darwaza, Humayun Darwaza, and Talaqi Darwaza. Wide moat linked to river Yamuna.

UPDATED DRAFT AMENDMENTS TO IT (INTERMEDIARY GUIDELINES AND DIGITAL MEDIA ETHICS CODE) RULES (IT RULES), 2021

- IT Rules, 2021 were **framed by Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology** (MeitY), exercising power under Information Technology Act, 2000, to:
 - **Protect constitutional rights of citizens** under Article 14, 19 and 21 by pushing for open, safe and trusted, and accountable internet.
 - **Regulate online intermediaries** (e.g. social media) who facilitate flow of data on internet.
- Updated Draft amendments **have provision for content takedowns by empowering state agencies to instruct intermediaries** to take down content deemed inaccurate or unfit.
 - E.g. online platforms will **remove fake content flagged by fact-checking unit** at Press Information Bureau (PIB).
- Earlier, Meity released draft amendments to include regulations for online gaming platforms with provisions like
 - **Including online gaming companies** offering one or more online games as an intermediary.
 - Also, online gaming intermediary **will observe some additional due diligence**. E.g. Registration of games with the self-regulatory body; risk of financial loss, Know-your-customer procedure etc.
 - **A Self-regulatory body to certify games** and ensure that online games operating in India follow rules and regulation.
 - **A mandatory know-your-customer (KYC) verification** for online games.
 - **Appointment of a compliance officer, nodal officer and grievance officer.**

RADIO SIGNAL DETECTED IN DISTANT GALAXY USING GIANT METREWAVE RADIO TELESCOPE (GMRT)

- **Astronomers** from McGill University (Canada) and Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru **used data from GMRT** to detect a radio signal **originating from atomic hydrogen** in an extremely **distant galaxy at redshift $z=1.29$** .
 - Redshift represents **signal's wavelength change depending on the object's location and movement**.
 - **A greater value of z indicates a farther object.**
- **Atomic hydrogen** is the basic **fuel required for star formation in a galaxy**.
 - When **hot ionised gas from surrounding medium** of a galaxy falls onto universe, gas **cools and forms atomic hydrogen**.
 - This then **becomes molecular hydrogen** and eventually **leads to formation of stars**.
- **Detection was made possible by gravitational lensing phenomenon**.
 - In gravitational lensing, **light emitted by source is bent due to presence of another massive body** between target galaxy and observer, effectively **resulting in magnification of signal**.
- **About GMRT**
 - It is an instrument **for studying astrophysical phenomena**, ranging from **nearby Solar system to edge of observable Universe**, at low radio frequencies.
 - It is **operated by National Centre of Radio Astrophysics (NCRA)**, which is part of Tata Institute of Fundamental Research.



ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (AI) CAN HELP FIGHT WILDFIRES: WORLD ECONOMIC FORUM (WEF)

- A recent report by WEF highlighted that its **FireAid initiative was helpful in managing wildfire** in several regions of Turkey.
 - In 2021, **average annual global cost of wildfires was around \$50 billion and released an estimated 6,450 megatonnes of CO₂ into atmosphere**.
- Launched in January 2022, **FireAid project** (using AI system) **aims to allow better prediction of wildfires** and more **efficient use of resources** during firefighting operations.
 - FireAid predictions **reduced both response time and risk to firefighters**.
- AI was used to develop a **digital twin for fire management**, which helped firefighters in **testing hypotheses of intervention measures and observing their outcomes in simulations**.
 - A digital twin is a **virtual representation of an object or system**, is updated from real-time data, and **uses simulation, machine learning and reasoning to help decision-making**.
- **AI and machine learning role in combating wildfires**
 - **Refinements in AI**, real-time maps for **wildfire prediction and risk mapping**.
 - **Sensors** with inbuilt AI can collect **acoustic information or operate as smoke detectors for alerting authorities**.
 - **Digital simulations** can better plan **efficient responses** based on predicted outcomes.
 - UAVs can provide **live images** and help **firefighters plan their response**.



BACKING SRI LANKA, INDIA SENDS FINANCING ASSURANCES TO INTERNATIONAL MONETARY FUND (IMF)

- Facing its worst economic crisis since independence, **financing assurances from creditors is critical for Sri Lanka** to get the **\$2.9 billion loan from IMF** to put its economy on track.
 - It is facing multiple challenges such as **shortage of dollars, runaway inflation and a steep recession**.
 - **India, Japan, and China** are Sri Lanka's **three largest bilateral lenders**.
- **IMF was established** (in 1944) to provide **emergency financing to countries hit by crises** and help them to stabilize their economies.
 - Unlike development banks, **IMF does not lend for specific projects**. It also **provides precautionary financing** to help prevent crises.
- **Crises can occur** due to **domestic or/and external factors** and can take many different forms such as **Balance of Payment issue, illiquid or insolvent financial institutions**, excessive deficits and debt etc.
- **Lending instruments of IMF include**
 - **General Resources Account** on non-concessional terms (market-based interest rates).
 - Concessional financial support (currently at zero interest rates) through **Poverty Reduction and Growth Trust**, which is better **tailored to needs of low-income countries**.
 - **Resilience and Sustainability Trust** to help low-income and vulnerable middle-income countries.

UNSC (United Nations Security Council) Sanctions Committee

- **ISIL and Al Qaida Sanctions Committee** of the UNSC has placed Lashkar-e-Taiba's (LeT) Makki on its sanctions list.
- UNSC Sanctions Committee is subsidiary organ of UNSC to support or implement UNSC decisions.
 - **UN Charter authorizes UNSC** to use a variety of measures **to enforce its decisions**.
 - E.g. The **ISIL and Al Qaida Sanctions Committee** was established pursuant to UNSC resolutions **1267** (1999), **1989** (2011) and **2253** (2015).
 - It can also use **Panels/Groups of Experts** or other mechanisms **to monitor implementation** of the sanctions.



Bhopal Declaration

- It was **released after Think20 (T20) meeting**, official engagement **group of G20 which brings together leading think tanks and research centers** worldwide.
- **Key highlights of Bhopal Declaration**
 - Appeal to all stakeholders to **focus more on inclusive development care** for welfare of every section of society in comparison to GDP.
 - Encourage model of **development led by women**.
 - **Bridge the gap between North and South**.
 - **Promoting traditional medicine systems** like AYUSH.



Sainya Ranakshetram 2.0 Hackathon

- **Indian Army conducted** the **second edition** of Hackathon.
- Its **objective is to seek solutions to operational cyber challenges** and to **reduce development time for innovative solutions** in the field of Cyber Security.

- **Germany** has pointed towards **fulfilling Ukraine's request** for a fleet of **modern Leopard 2 tanks**.
- **Other Modern Tanks:** Challenger 2 (UK), M1 ABRAMS (US), AMX 10-RC (France).

- It is a **rare species of duck** (locally known as Sadangman) that was **recently sighted in Loktak lake** (Manipur) after a **gap of over 90 years**.
 - Loktak lake is **famous for Keibul Lamjao National Park and Sangai, the dancing deer**.
- Greater Scaup is a **migratory bird widely distributed across Arctic and Subarctic regions** where it mainly nests in coastal tundra habitats.
 - It **belongs to** the family of **Anatidae**.
- IUCN status: **Least Concern**.
