
ANTHROPOGENIC AND GEOLOGICAL REASONS AMONG MANY FOR JOSHIMATH SINKING

- Joshimath (about 6000ft) in Uttarakhand's Chamoli district is a key transit point for Badrinath and Hemkund Sahib.
- It is bounded by the Karmanasa and Dhaknala streams on the west and the east.
 - > The Dhauliganga and Alaknanda rivers on the south and the north.
 - The first instance of subsidence in Joshmiath was reported in 1976 Mishra Commission report.
- Natural factors for subsidence
 - > Joshimath almost sits on the Vaikrita Thurst (VT), a tectonic fault line and is also very close to main geological fault lines, Main Central Thrust (MCT), and Pandukeshwar Thrust (PT).
 - It falls in Zone V of the Seismic Zonation Map.
 - The area around it is covered with a thick layer of overburden material making it vulnerable to sinking.
 - High snowfall and highly weathered gneissic rocks makes the area prone to landslides.
 - > The impact of extreme rainfall events impacting the stability of the slope.
- Anthropogenic factors: Unplanned construction and Improper water drainage
 - > Hydroelectric schemes around Joshimath and Tapovan, including the Vishnugad HE Project has created additional pressure on fragile slope.
 - > Increase in ground seepage of water from surface, a probable cause for subsidence.

- Following initiatives were launched during it:
 - > National Framework on Reuse of Treated Waste Water.
 - > National Framework for Sedimentation Management.
 - Sedimentation management enables optimal utilization of reservoir capacity. It focuses on Adaptive structural and functional measures
 - > Best practices under Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain
 - 'Catch the rain' aims to nudge Rain Water Harvesting Structures with people's active participation.
 - > Inauguration of a **sub-portal of 'Jal Itihas'** under WRIS portal.
 - Jal Itihas showcases selected water heritage structures more than 100 years old.
 - India- Water Resources Information System (WRIS) provides a single window solution for all water resources data and standardised information.
 - > 'Water Vision Park' was proposed to be established to promote idea of afforestation to achieve goal of water conservation.
 - Also, key features of Water and Allied Resources Information and Management (WARMIS) were highlighted like Unified data repository, Intelligent Insight into data etc.
- Significance of the conference: It will bring in synergies between different government programmes /schemes in terms of planning, process and implementation.

> It highlighted the need to focus on the 4 Es of Water Governance i.e., Ecology, Equity, Efficiency and Economics.



Land subsidence: It is a gradual settling or sudden sinking of the Earth's surface due to removal or displacement of subsurface earth materials.

- Constitutional provisions for water governance:
 - State list, entry 17 (Water supplies, irrigation and canals, drainage etc);
 - Union list, entry 56 (Regulation and development of inter-State rivers and river valleys)

CENSUS POSTPONED BY AT LEAST 4 YEARS TO 2024-25: OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR GENERAL AND CENSUS COMMISSIONER OF INDIA

- Citing the **on-going COVID pandemic**, the office of RGI has **extended the deadline of freezing of administrative boundaries to June 30, 2023** (extended multiple times since COVID).
 - As per Rule 8(iv) of Census Rules, 1990, the boundaries of the administrative units shall be frozen from the date intimated by the Census Commissioner, which shall not be earlier than one year from the Census reference date.
 - > As general elections are scheduled for early 2024, it would not be possible to conduct Census operations before polls.
- The Census Process:
 - **> Before every Census,** the states are required to provide information to the RGI on changes in the number of administrative units like towns, districts, etc.
 - The number of districts changed from 640 in 2011 to 736 in 2022.
 - ightarrow After which the Census Operations will be carried out in two phases: -
 - House listing and Housing Census- As per the recent amendments to Census Rules this phase also carries enumeration of National Population Register (NPR).
 - Population Enumeration- During this each person is enumerated and her/his individual particulars (Age, Marital status, Religion, etc).

INITIATIVES LAUNCHED ON 76TH FOUNDATION DAY OF BUREAU OF INDIAN STANDARDS (BIS)

- BIS was established under the BIS Act 1986, assuming the functions of the erstwhile Indian Standards Institution (ISI) which was established in 1947.
 - Presently BIS operates under the framework of the BIS Act of 2016.
- Various Initiatives launched were-
- Standards National Action Plan (SNAP) 2022- 27: SNAP to meet the emerging technologies and concerns of sustainability and climate change.
 - Will play an important role in steering the national standardization efforts.

- SOME COMMON BIS STANDARDS
- **BIS Hallmark**: Mandatory standard for gold and silver jewellery
- ISI Mark: Standards compliance mark for industrial products
- **Ecomark:** Labeling of environment friendly products.
- **Product Certification Scheme:** Applicable for tangible products.
- Foreign Manufacturers Certification Scheme: Overseas applicants/foreign manufacturers are granted a license for the use of the ISI mark.
- System Certification Scheme: Applicable for systems/processes.
- Revised National Electrical Code of India 2023 or NEC 2023: Prepared by BIS, it provides guidelines for regulating Electrical Installations practices across country.
 - > India's first NEC was formulated in 1985 (subsequently revised in 2011).
 - Current revision includes latest International best practices and addition of special locations like Hospitals, Community facilities, Hotels, etc.
- Revision Exercise of National Building Code of India (NBC 2016): BIS initiated exercise of Revision of NBC to include Sustainable city planning norms; New and sustainable building materials, etc.
- Standards Clubs in Schools: Through Standards Clubs, BIS aims to expose science students of class 9th and above to the concepts of Quality and Standardization through student centric activities.
- Training courses for national capacity building for judicious implementation of NBC 2016 and NEC 2023.


- The responsibility of conducting the decadal census rests with the Office of the Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India, Ministry of Home Affairs.
- National Population Register (NPR) is a register of all usual residents of the country regardless of whether they are citizens/non-citizens of India.
 - First compiled in 2010 and updated in 2015.
 - Prepared under provisions of Citizenship Act 1955 and Rules, 2003.

SC DIRECTS PANEL TO EVOLVE FRAMEWORK ON GUIDELINES FOR ROAD SAFETY

- The SC bench along with CJI, has highlighted the immediate necessity to formulate Guidelines for Road Safety in India.
 - > The committee will be led by a former apex court judge, **Justice A.M. Sapre.**
 - It will seek to create State-specific guidelines for the electronic monitoring and enforcement of road safety across States as per Section 136A of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988.
 - The bench also acknowledged that speeding is the main cause of fatal accidents on Indian roads.
- Motor Vehicle Act, 1988
 - The act replaced the Motor Vehicles Act, 1939 and came into force from 1 July 1989.
 - ➤ Various sections of it are amended and the recent one in 2022, for third party insurance and creation of Motor Accident Claims Tribunal.
 - Section 136 (2) of the act mandates the Centre to "make rules for the electronic monitoring and enforcement of road safety including speed cameras, closed-circuit television cameras, etc.
 - Sections 215 A and B of the act, provides for the functions of electronic monitoring to the States and the formation of a National Road Safety Board in an advisory capacity.
- According to a Ministry of Road Transport and Highways report (2021), altogether 4,12,432 road accidents were reported.
 - Steps like dashboard for road accidents, cashless treatment, acknowledgement of good Samaritans and establishment of National Road Safety Council have been taken to deal with it.

First Advance Estimates (FAE)	 India's GDP (gross domestic product) may grow 7% for the financial year 2022-23, according to the first advance estimates released by the NSO under Ministry of Statistics. About First Advance Estimate (FAE): First introduced in 2016-17. They are the "first" official estimates of how GDP is expected to grow in that financial year. They are also the "advance" estimates because they are published long before the financial year (April to March) is over. The significance of FAE lies in the fact that they are the GDP estimates that the Union Finance Ministry uses to decide the next financial year's budget allocations. 		
The Indian Telegraph (Infrastructure Safety) Rules 2022	 The Department of Telecommunications under the Ministry of Communications has formulated the Indian Telegraph (Infrastructure Safety) Rules 2022. Government has established a pan India telecom infrastructure network. However, due to excavation activities by various agencies underground utility assets get damaged. In the Telecom Sector alone, there is an economic loss of approx. Rs 3000 Crore/year. Advantage: Many utilities can be saved from unwanted cuts and wasteful cost towards restoration. 		
Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India), Order 2017 (PPP-MII)	 The Union Government has flagged over a dozen Restrictive and discriminatory conditions in tender conditions. The tweaking of the tender conditions was in violation of the Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) Order, 2017, issued to protect the interests of local suppliers. About PPP-MII: As per the order the minimum local content shall ordinarily be 50%. It was issued to promote domestic value addition in public procurement. 		
Working Time and Work-Life Balance Around the World Report	 It has been released by the International Labour Organisation. Key Highlights: Short-time work and work-sharing measures helped to reduce the volume of work and save jobs during the COVID-19 pandemic. Flexible working hours enabled individuals as well as companies to collectively reduce the hours of work. 		
Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act 1967 (UAPA Act).	 The Ministry of Home Affairs has banned the group named People's Anti-Fascist-Front (PAFF) under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act 1967 (UAPA Act). It is considered as a proxy outfit of the banned terror group Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) of Pakistan. UAPA Act The act gives power to the government to declare any organisation as an "unlawful association" or a "terrorist organisation". Both Indian and foreign nationals can be charged under the act. A tribunal headed by a High court judge is constituted by the Central Government to confirm a ban on a political organisation based on evidence and analysis of the allegations. 		
Moirang	 Union Home and Cooperation Minister inaugurated and laid foundation stone of few development projects at Moirang, Manipur. > Also unveiled 165-feet tall tricolor at historic 'Azad Hind Fauj' Headquarters at Moirang, which is tallest national flag in the entire North East region. About Moirang (a small town in Bishnupur district of Manipur): > Historical importance: During World War II, Moirang was headquarters of Indian National Army (INA), Tricolour was unfurled here in 1944. > Cultural importance: Moirang Haraoba festival, Khamba- Thoibi dance originated. > Ecological attractions: Sendra Island, Keibul Lamjao National Park, and the Loktak Lake etc. 		





Cloud Forest	 A new report suggested that Cloud Forest Bond will incentivise governments to protect their cloud forests. About Cloud Forests (montane rainforests): Refer to vegetation of tropical mountainous regions where there is heavy rainfall and persistent condensation resulting from cooling of moisture being pushed upwards by mountains. Usually characterized by a persistent, frequent and seasonal low-lying layer of mist and cloud cover usually at canopy level. Only found in tropical areas with tall mountains. 	
Sagol Kangjei	 The Home Minister recently inaugurated a 122 ft statute in Manipur, which depicts a Sagol Kangjei player. Modern polo is said to have originated from Sagol Kangjei, a sport which is indigenous to Manipur. The game is played with 7 players on each side, who are mounted on Manipur Ponies and the ball used is made of bamboo root. Manipur Pony It is one of five Indigenous horse breeds of India. Other 4 are Marwari, Kathiawari, Zanskari and Spiti. The state government has formulated Manipur Pony Conservation and Development Policy 2016 to save the breed. The Marjing Polo Complex was developed by the state to conserve the breed. 	
Purple Fest	 The first ever Purple Fest, which brings together people with disabilities from across the country was inaugurated in Goa It is hosted by the Goa State Commission for Persons with Disabilities in association with the Directorate of Social Welfare and Entertainment Society of Goa. 	
NEWS Place in news	 Abyei Indian Army has deployed its largest contingent of women Peacekeepers in a UN mission at Abyei. Abeyi is contentious region that is oil-rich near the demarcation line which divides Sudan and the South Sudan. Sudan: It is a Northeast African Country, which is bordered by Egypt,Lybia,Chad,Central African Republic, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea and opens to the Red Sea. Capital : Khartoum. Both White nile and Blue nile, along with Atbara river converge to form the Great Nile in Sudan. The Marrah Mountain range is towards its west. South Sudan: It is a landlocked country in East Africa, surrounded by Sudan, Central African Republic, Democratic Republic of Congo,Uganda, Kenya and Ethiopia. Capital: Juba White Nile is the major river that runs through it. It houses the famous Southern National park and the Boma National parks.
