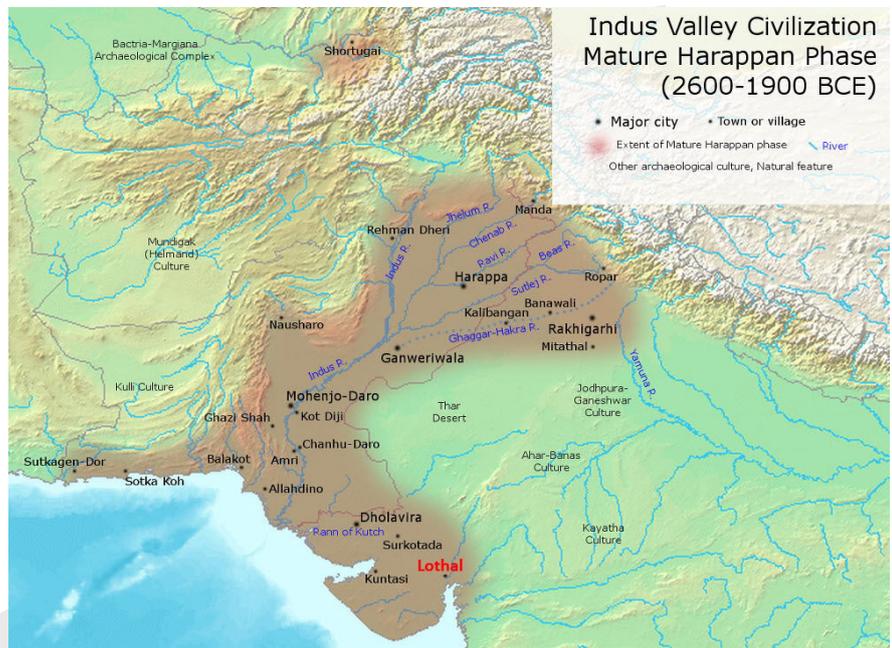

GOVERNMENT TO DEVELOP NATIONAL MARITIME HERITAGE COMPLEX (NMHC) IN LOTHAL, GUJARAT

- Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways (MoPSW)** is developing a **NMHC**, a world-class facility at **Lothal**, under **Sagarmala programme** to showcase **India's rich and diverse maritime heritage**.
 - It will consolidate all diverse and rich artifacts from ancient to modern times for **edutainment purposes**, i.e. entertainment designed to be educational.
 - It will include **world's highest light house museum**, **world's largest open aquatic gallery**, **India's largest naval museum** and is envisaged to be **one of the biggest international tourist destinations** in world.
 - It is funded by **MoPSW** and **Ministry of Culture** through **National Culture Fund** by way of grant.
- Lothal**, prominent city of **Indus-Valley Civilization (IVC)**, had the **oldest man-made dry-dock** dating back to **2400 BC**.
 - It is located between **Bhogavo** and **Sabarmati** rivers near Gulf of Khambat.
 - It was **nominated to be enlisted as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2014** and its **application is pending** on tentative list of UNESCO.
- IVC aka Harappan Civilization** was home to **largest of four ancient urban civilizations** of **Egypt, Mesopotamia, India and China**.
 - It thrived about **2,500 BC** in western South Asia, which now is **Pakistan and northwest India**.
- Sagarmala Programme**, launched in 2015 by MoPSW, ensures **holistic port infrastructure development** along **India's 7500km long coastline**.



INDIAN COMPUTER EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CERT-IN) ISSUED “GUIDELINES ON INFORMATION SECURITY PRACTICES” FOR GOVERNMENT ENTITIES

- CERT-In** has issued guidelines under **section 70B of Information Technology (IT) Act, 2000**.
 - These guidelines **apply to all Ministries, Departments, Secretariats, and Offices specified in First Schedule to Government of India (Allocation of Business) Rules, 1961**, along with their attached and subordinate offices.
 - These guidelines are a **roadmap for Government entities and industry** to **reduce cyber risk, protect citizen data and improve cybersecurity ecosystem** in country.
- Key highlights**
 - Nominate a Chief Information Security Officer (CISO)** for IT Security.
 - Formulate cyber security policy** and assign roles and responsibilities for CISO and a dedicated cyber security functional team.
 - Internal and external audit** of entire **ICT infrastructure** and deploy appropriate security controls based on audit outcome.
 - Ensure proper **physical isolation of sensitive and wireless networks**.
 - Data Backup policy** should be documented, scheduled and monitored.
- Cert-In**, established as per provisions of section 70B of IT Act, 2000 under **Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology**, is the **national nodal agency for responding to computer security incidents**.
- Other Cyber Security Measures taken in India:** National Cyber Security Policy, 2013, Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C), etc.



SIX YEARS OF GOODS AND SERVICES TAX (GST)

- GST, implemented on the place of launched on 1st July 2017, is a **comprehensive, multi-stage, destination-based tax** introduced through **101st Constitutional Amendment Act, 2016** for a **One Nation, One Tax, One Market** regime.
 - It was **first discussed in the Kelkar Task Force** report on indirect taxes in 2003-04.
 - Under **Article 279A**, **GST Council** was established. It is a **joint forum of Centre and States** with Union Finance Minister as Chairperson.

Achievements	Areas of concern

US SUPREME COURT LIMITS AFFIRMATIVE ACTION IN COLLEGE ADMISSIONS

- In landmark ruling, SC effectively **overruled judgements of Grutter v. Bollinger (2003) and Regents of University of California v. Bakke (1978)** which validated affirmative action in college admissions based on race.
- **Affirmative Action** means **positive action/discrimination** which was **introduced in US to counter historical patterns of prejudice against individuals** with certain identities.
 - In context of higher education, **it refers to admission practices that seek to increase the representation of Black, Hispanic and other minority students in colleges** and universities of US.
 - **Reservation is a system of affirmative action in India** that provides historically disadvantaged groups representation in **education, employment, government schemes, scholarships and politics.**
- **Affirmative actions in India and USA**

Purpose	Uplift lower strata of society who were referred as Scheduled Castes and Tribes.	Provide level playing field for groups that have been historically discriminated based on race, gender, sexual orientation, disability.
Genesis	Introduced as fundamental right under Article 15(4) and 16(4).	Embedded in Civil Rights Act of 1964 which ban discrimination on various grounds.
Quota	Fixed at 50% (Indra Swahney judgement) for OBC, SC & ST in both employment and education.	Varies across states and institutes and is not fixed.

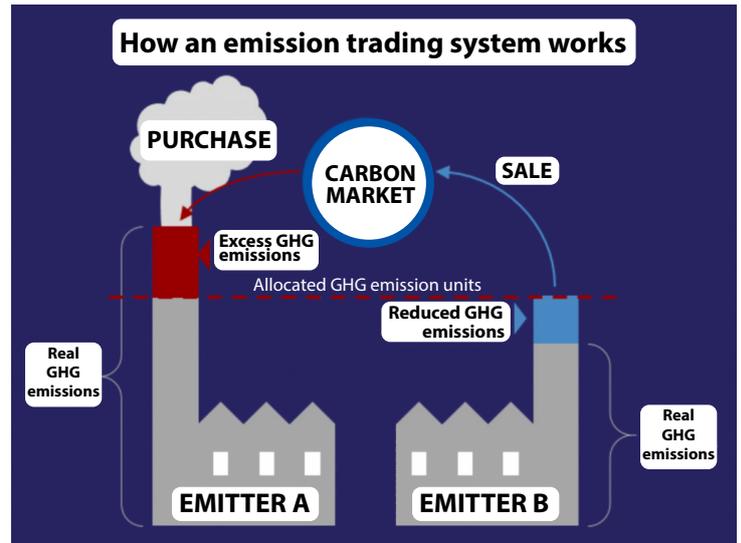
GLOBAL ENVIRONMENT FACILITY (GEF) APPROVES GLOBAL BIODIVERSITY FRAMEWORK FUND (GBFF)

- **GEF's governing board has approved the establishment of a new fund** to finance the **implementation of Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (KMGBF).**
 - The approved GBFF will be launched at the next GEF Assembly in Canada by August 2023.
- GBFF will draw in capital from governments, private sector, and philanthropic organisations and **will focus on eight thematic Action Areas** namely Biodiversity conservation, restoration, land/sea-use and spatial planning, etc.
 - **GBFF acknowledges the important roles and contributions of indigenous peoples** as custodians of biodiversity and in the conservation, restoration and sustainable use.
- **Three principles that guide the country's allocation of resources for GBFF**
 - Allocation system must **accommodate financial contributions on a rolling basis.**
 - Consider **special needs of Least Developed Countries and Small Island developing States.**
 - Acknowledge that biodiversity is not evenly distributed across the globe and some areas have greater potential to contribute to global biodiversity benefits than others.
- **KMGBF was adopted by COP15 (Montreal)** of UN Convention on Biological Diversity.
 - It has **set 23 targets to be achieved by 2030**, which include 30% conservation of land and sea, **30% restoration of degraded ecosystems** and halving the introduction of invasive species.

MINISTRY OF POWER NOTIFIES CARBON CREDIT TRADING SCHEME (CCTS)

- CCTS 2023 provides to **set up a carbon credit trading market** as the **country aims at decarbonizing economy** and has committed to **cut emissions by 45 percent from 2005 levels by 2030**.
 - **CCTS was first announced under Energy Conservation Act 2001** which was amended by Energy Conservation (Amendment) Bill 2022.
- **Key highlights of CCTS**
 - Set up **National Steering Committee (NSC) aka Indian Carbon Market Governing Board (ICMGB)**, headed by power and environment secretaries, to **govern and oversee the functions of Indian Carbon Market (ICM)**.
 - **Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE)** would be the **administrator** for carbon market and **set targets for reduction in emissions, issue carbon credit certificates** and accredit carbon verification agencies.
 - **Central Electricity Regulatory Commission (CERC)** will be **regulator** for all trading activities.
 - **Grid Controller of India** will be the registry of ICM.
- Carbon markets are a tool **for putting a price on carbon emissions**— they establish **trading systems where carbon credits or allowances can be bought and sold**.
 - A carbon credit is a kind of **tradable permit** that **equals one tonne of carbon dioxide removed, reduced, or sequestered from atmosphere**.

Solicitor General of India (SGI)

- **Appointments Committee of Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister** has approved re-appointment of existing SGI and **Additional SGI**.
- **Solicitor General** is the **second most senior law officer** after **Attorney General (Article 76)**.
 - He is assisted by Additional SGIs.
 - **Term of office is of 3 years**, or until further notice, whichever should be earlier.
 - He also **advises the government** in legal matter.



Electoral Bonds (EBs)

- **Government has approved the 27th sale of EBs from July 3, 2023**.
- **EBs**, introduced in 2017-18, as **interest-free bearer instruments** to **cleanse the system of political funding in country**.
 - EBs are **valid for 15 days from the date of issue** and can be purchased by **a citizen of India or entities incorporated or established in India**.
 - **Sold in multiples** of Rs 1,000, Rs 10,000, Rs 1 lakh, Rs 10 lakh, and Rs 1 crore.
 - **SBI is the only bank authorised** to sell them.
 - **Rationale was to** limit use of cash in political funding, curb black money etc.



Mahila Samman Savings Certificate (MSSC)

- Ministry of Finance has permitted all **Public Sector Banks and eligible Private Sector Banks to implement and operationalise MSSC, 2023**.
- MSSC is a **one-time savings scheme introduced in Budget 2023-24** to encourage women to invest.
 - It offers a **fixed interest rate of 7.5 percent per year** and has a **flexible investment and partial withdrawal options**, with a **maximum limit of Rs 2 lakh**.
 - **Maturity date is two years** from deposit date.
 - Minimum amount to be invested is Rs.1,000 and any sum in multiples of Rs.100.



Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas

- **LCA Tejas has completed seven years of service** in the Indian Air Force.
- **It is a 4.5 generation, all weather and multi-role fighter aircraft**.
 - Aircraft is capable of taking up **offensive air support, close combat and ground attack role at ease**.
 - It was designed by **Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA)** and produced by Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL).
- **Key characteristics:** Smallest & lightest aircraft in its class; In Flight Refueling (IFR) Probe; Equipped with state-of-the-art Satellite aided Inertial Navigation System.

 <p>Subansiri Lower Hydroelectric Project (SLHP)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• National Hydroelectric Power Corporation (NHPC) Limited has completed construction of 2,000 Mega Watt Subansiri Lower Hydroelectric Project dam till the top level of Elevation Level (EL) 210 m.• SLHP is located on Subansiri River which is on border of India's two north-eastern states, Arunachal Pradesh and Assam.<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ It is the biggest hydroelectric project undertaken in India so far.• Subansiri River, aka Gold River, is the tributary of River Brahmaputra.
 <p>Anamalai Tiger Reserve (ATR)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• ATR is carved out of the Tamil Nadu portion of the Anamalais.<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ It lies South of the Palakkad gap in the Southern Western Ghats.➤ Reserve falls within the Western Ghats mountain chain.➤ Flora: Mango, Jackfruit, etc.➤ Fauna: Asiatic elephant, Sambar, Spotted deer, Barking deer, Mouse deer, etc.• Anamalais is a home for six different indigenous people i.e., Malai Malasars, Kadar, Malasar, Muduvan, Pulayar, Eravallar.
 <p>WMO Ozone and Ultraviolet (UV) Bulletin</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Bulletin highlighting the steady recovery of Ozone layer was published by World Meteorological Organisation (WMO) after gap of seven years.• Key highlights<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Montreal Protocol and its amendments are successful in eliminating up to 99% of Ozone Depleting Substances (ODS).<ul style="list-style-type: none">■ ODS are long-lived man-made chemicals which destroy the protective ozone layer.➤ Hunga Tonga-Hunga Ha'apai volcanic eruption (located under ocean surface in western Pacific) in January 2022 has increased twater vapor content of stratosphere by 5% to 10%.<ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Nearly 90% of Earth's ozone resides in stratosphere (aka Ozone Layer) above troposphere — layer closest to Earth's surface.
 <p>Zombie drug</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Zombie drug epidemic grips some states of USA.• Xylazine, also known as "tranq," "tranq dope" and "zombie drug", has sedative like symptoms such as extreme sleepiness.<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Tranq, known for its ability to induce a "zombie" like stupor and cause flesh rot near injection sites.➤ When combined with opioids like fentanyl, xylazine increases life-threatening effect of respiratory depression (slowing or stopping breathing) caused by opioids, increasing the risk of overdose and death.➤ Zombie drug can cause raw wounds on the user's skin. It starts with ulcers, hardens to dead skin called eschar, and if left untreated can result in amputation.➤ It is usually used as a tranquilizer on cows and horses.
 <p>OI Chiki script of Santhali language</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Prime Minister wished the people of Santhal tribe on occasion of Hul diwas using OI Chiki Script of Santhali language.<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ 92nd Constitutional Amendment Act added Santali to Schedule VIII to Constitution of India, which lists the official languages of India, along with Bodo, Dogri and Maithili languages.• OI Chiki script was created in 1925 by Raghunath Murmu.<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Santhali is a Munda language and is spoken mainly in Jharkhand, West Bengal, Odisha, and also in Bangladesh, eastern Nepal and Bhutan.➤ There are about 7.3 million speakers of Santali in India according to 2011 census.
 <p>Personality in News</p>	<p>Swami Sahajanand Saraswati (22nd February 1889- 26th June 1950)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Born in Ghazipur, Uttar Pradesh.• By organising farmers, he infused a new consciousness in the Freedom Movement.• At Congress session in Lucknow in April 1936, All India Kisan Sabha was formed and he was elected as its 1st President.• He organised Bakasht movement in Bihar against zamindars evicting tenants from Bakasht lands.<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ This led to enactment of Bihar Tenancy Act and Bakasht Land Tax to protect farmers' rights.• He also led the successful struggle in the Dalmia Sugar Mill at Bihta, where peasant-worker unity was the most important characteristics.• Values: Courage, Leadership etc.
