MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE SET DEADLINE FOR MANDATORY IMPLEMENTATION OF GOOD MANUFACTURING PRACTICES (GMP)

- GMP ensures that **products are consistently produced and controlled** according to **set quality standards**.
 - World Health Organization (WHO) has established detailed guidelines for GMP.
- In India, **GMP system was first incorporated in 1988 in Schedule M** of Drugs and Cosmetics Rules, 1945, and GMP were **revised in 2018**, bringing them **on par with WHO standards**.
 - **Schedule M** prescribes **requirements of facilities and their maintenance, personnel, manufacture, control and safety testing, storage and transport of material, written procedures and records, traceability, etc.**
- Presently, **only 2,000 of 10,500 manufacturing units** in country were **found to be compliant with WHO-GMP standards**.
- **Now**, drugmakers with an **annual turnover of over Rs 250 crore** will have to mandatorily adopt GMP **within six months** while those with **turnover of less than Rs 250 crore** will be given a **year**.
- **Significance of GMP certification:**
 - **Minimize risks** such as unexpected contamination of products, incorrect labelling, insufficient or too much active ingredient etc.
 - **India is a major exporter of medicines** to low- and middle-income (LMIC) **countries which require WHO-GMP certification**.
 - **Procurement of products under Pradhan Mantri Bharatiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana (PMBJP)** from WHO-GMP certified suppliers.

MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (MHA) INTRODUCES A NEW CATEGORY OF AYUSH VISA FOR FOREIGN NATIONALS

- Introduction of AYUSH Visa is **part of India's roadmap for Heal in India initiative**, which is intended at **promoting India as a medical value travel (MVT) destination**.
 - **AYUSH (Ayurveda, Yoga & Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha and Homeopathy) based healthcare & Wellness economy** is estimated to **grow to \$70 billion by 2025**.
- **Medical tourism** (also known as MVT) refers to **hosting foreign tourists visiting for maintaining, improving or restoring health through medical intervention**.
 - It is **broadly classified under 3 categories: Medical Treatment** for curative purposes; **Wellness & Rejuvenation**; **Alternative Cures** such as India's AYUSH.
- **Key drivers of MVT growth:** State of the art medical facilities, cost-effective healthcare services, quality diagnostic equipment and trained doctors, offering traditional therapies, no waiting time etc.
- **Challenges**
 - **Lack of regulations and nodal body** for medical travel sector.
 - **Regional Competition:** From Malaysia, Thailand and Singapore
 - **Lack of overseas medical care coverage** by insurers and **non-coverage of traditional systems of medicine**.
 - **Lack of awareness about National Accreditation Board for Hospitals and Healthcare Providers (NABH) accreditation at international level**.



GOODS AND SERVICES TAX (GST) COUNCIL ANNOUNCED TO RETAIN LEVY OF UNIFORM 28% TAX ON ONLINE GAMING COMPANIES WITH A TWEAK

Key Highlights

- **Tax rate:** 28% tax on electronic gaming, casinos, and horse racing. To be applied **on the initial amount paid upon entry**, and not on the total value of each bet placed.
 - **Covers both games based on both skill and chance:** Online gaming is defined as “an offering of a **game on the internet or an electronic network**.
 - It includes online money gaming (which include both games of skills and games of chance).
 - **Tax on offshore online gaming firms:** Such companies will have to **register themselves with the GST authorities** and pay the **tax to offer their services to Indian gamers**.
 - **Amendment to the Integrated GST Act, 2017** will be made to enforce this.
 - **Enforcement:** After the necessary **modifications to the central and state laws**, the new tax is expected to **come into effect from October 1**.
- In a related development, **Finance Ministry notified an amendment to the GST Act to exempt certain small businesses using e-commerce platforms (refer to the box)** to sell their products from **compulsory registration**.

Small businesses using e-commerce platform are exempted if:

- Their **turnover is less than ₹40 lakh and ₹20 lakh** (₹20 lakh and ₹10 lakh in selected States) for goods and services, respectively and fulfilling criteria like **no inter-State supply of goods; supply goods through e-commerce operators** in more than one State or Union territory; etc.

Rajasthan	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Udaipur Koftgari Metal Craft: An ancient art for making ornamental weaponry in which whole design is produced mainly by wire • Bikaner Kashidakari Craft: A type of stitching on cotton, silk or velvet with mirror-work. Practiced by weavers of Meghwal community. • Jodhpur Bandhej Craft: A textile art of tying (using Cotton thread) and dyeing of muslin, silk and voil fabrics. • Bikaner Usta Kala Craft: A gold nakashi art restricted only to camel hide, wall paintings & metal art. Practiced by the Dapgar community. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ It was practiced in the ancient period on the walls of palaces, temples.
Goa	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mankurad Mango: Main traditional fruit crops of Goa. Named by Portuguese as malcorada (means ‘poor coloured’). Its higher amount of total soluble solids makes it sweeter. • Goan Bebinca: Also known as queen of Goan desserts is a type of pudding and a traditional Indo-Portuguese dessert.
Uttar Pradesh	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jalesar Dhatu Shilp: Includes decorative metal craft and brassware (like anklets, bells) practiced by Thatheras community. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Jalesar was the capital of Magadha king Jarasandha.

- **GI Tag** is issued by the **GI Registry** in Chennai under **Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection) Act, 1999**.
- **GI Tag, valid for a decade, renewable for another 10 years, prevent its use by a third party.**

IN-SPACE RELEASED CONSULTATION PAPER ON EARTH OBSERVATION (EO) DATA FROM INDIAN SATELLITES MISSIONS

- EO refers to **use of remote sensing technologies** (including satellites, aircraft, drones, and ground-based sensors) to **monitor land, marine and atmosphere**.
- **Application of EO Data:**
 - Provides **comprehensive understanding of Earth’s climate**, ocean circulation, carbon, energy and water cycle, albedo, cryosphere etc.
 - **National security** as EO satellites are crucial for **Imagery Intelligence, photo reconnaissance, Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR)**, and electro optical functions.
 - Provide **valuable insight and inform policy decisions** spanning many government departments such as: **agriculture, water resources, urban planning, rural development, mineral prospecting, forestry, disaster management** etc.
- **Initiatives by India**
 - **ISRO has launched** series of EO satellites including **IRS, Resourcesat, Cartosat, Oceansat, RISAT** satellites.
 - **GalaxEye, Pixxel, Dhruva Space, KaleidEO** are some of **Non-Government Private Entities (NGPEs)** that have planned to **launch their EO satellites**.
- **IN-SPACe** (Indian National Space Promotion and Authorisation Centre) is a **single-window, independent, nodal agency** that functions as an **autonomous agency in Department of Space (DOS)** to facilitate **participation of private players**.

<p>Participatory notes (P-notes)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • P-note investments touched a 5-yr high of Rs 1.13 trn at June-end in the country. • P-notes are offshore derivative instruments with Indian shares as the underlying assets. • They are issued by registered Foreign portfolio investment (FPIs) to overseas investors who wish to invest in the Indian stock market without directly registering themselves with SEBI. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➢ The anonymity provided by the P- Notes makes it lucrative for entities that try to use this route to round trip funds.

 <p>Sahakar-22</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC) had launched Sahakar-22 during FY 2017-18 to achieve rural and farm prosperity through Cooperatives by 2022. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ NCDC is a statutory body under administrative control of Ministry of Cooperation. ● It included: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ FOCUS 222: NCDC's focused assistance for Cooperatives in 222 Districts (including 117 Aspirational Districts); ➤ PACS HUB: Transformation of PACS and other Coops as Apna Kisan Resource Centers; ➤ AENEC: Act East and North East Cooperatives; ➤ CEMtC: Centres of Excellence to Market through Cooperatives; ➤ SAHAKAR PRAGYA - Capacity Development through Laxmanrao Inamdar National Academy for Cooperative Research Development (LINAC).
 <p>Climate Change Impact upon Indian subcontinent</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Findings of a 2020 report by Ministry of Earth Sciences included: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ India's average temperature has risen by around 0.7 deg. C during 1901-2018. ➤ Frequency of daily precipitation extremes (>150 mm per day) increased by about 75% during 1950-2015. ➤ Sea-level rise in North Indian Ocean occurred at a rate of 3.3 mm per year (1993-2017). ➤ Frequency of Severe Cyclonic Storms over Arabian sea has increased during post monsoon seasons of 1998-2018.
 <p>ZARTH (ZTF Augmented Reality Transient Hunter)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● ZARTH is an app to allow anyone with a smartphone to find astronomical Transients, using data from Zwicky Transient Facility (ZTF), a public-private partnership, in USA. ● Transient astronomical events are intense, bright, and short-lived phenomena that briefly light up the sky before fading away. ● Transients can be caused by different astrophysical sources such as <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Supernovae (Explosion of a star at end of life), ➤ Flaring stars (stars varying in brightness), ➤ Active galactic nuclei (small region at centre of some galaxies with much higher luminosity) etc.
 <p>Superconductor</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● South Korean researchers have claimed they have created a material (LK-99), which functions as a superconductor at room temperature. ● Superconductors are materials that can conduct electric currents without any loss when they are cooled below a critical temperature. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ They also expel magnetic fields as they transition to superconducting state (Meissner effect). ➤ However, they typically need to be extremely cooled, to around minus 195 degrees Celsius, and subjected to extreme pressure to work. ● Potential applications: Generation and transmission of electric power, Medical diagnosis, Electromagnets, superfast Maglev trains etc.
 <p>Finger Minutiae Record - Finger Image Record (FMR-FIR) modality</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● FMR-FIR is an Artificial Intelligence/Machine Learning based tool that uses a combination of both finger minutiae and finger image to check liveness of a fingerprint and to detect use of a cloned fingerprint. ● UIDAI has rolled out FMR-FIR to prevent Aadhaar-enabled Payment System (AePS) frauds. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ AePS frauds have been undertaken using spoofed fingerprints during Aadhaar authentication.
 <p>UNESCO's List of World Heritage in Danger (WHD)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● UNESCO proposed to add the Italian city of Venice, threatened by mass tourism, development projects and climate change, to the list of WHD. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Kyiv in Ukraine, the town of Timbuktu in Mali are also proposed to be placed under the list. ● Under the 1972 World Heritage Convention, a World Heritage property can be inscribed on the List of WHD. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Cities in WHD list are considered to face specific and proven imminent danger or threats which could have deleterious effects on their inherent characteristics.
