STANDING COMMITTEE OF PARLIAMENT ON CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS TABLED REPORT ON FERTILIZERS

Observations	Recommendations
Increasing subsidy burden as all major fertilizers covered under subsidy.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Fertilizer subsidy scheme (Urea and Nutrient based subsidy scheme) needs to be reviewed in consultation with all stakeholders to remove deficiencies.
30% of urea, 100% muriate of potash, 60% Diammonium phosphate imported due to local shortage in states.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Increase fertilizers production (especially urea) through facilitating investments for public, cooperative and private fertilizers manufacturers.
Budget allocation and price fluctuations due to international developments.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Centre should introduce purchase policy reforms and enter into long term contracts for import of fertilizers and raw materials to offset the effects of international price rise.

COMPTROLLER AND AUDITOR GENERAL (CAG) SUBMITTED PERFORMANCE AUDIT OF NATIONAL SOCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (NSAP) FOR 2017-21

- NSAP has been implemented by **Ministry of Rural Development** since 1995.
- It aims to provide **social assistance to BPL households** in the case of the **old age, disabled, widows, etc. (refer infographics).**
 - **4.65 crore** people availed benefits during 2017-21.
- **Article 151 of the Constitution** mandates the CAG to present **audit reports to the President.**
- **Key findings**
 - **Beneficiaries:**
 - **Identification** of beneficiaries is **based on BPL list** even after finalisation of **SECC data.**
 - Scheme **aims for universal coverage**, but being implemented in **demand-driven mode.**
 - **Financial Management:**
 - **Rs 2.83 crore** were **diverted** for campaigning in respect to other ministry schemes.
 - In many states expenditure **incurred on inadmissible items like payment of honorarium, wages, etc.**
 - **Implementation**
 - **Delays in identification and sanction of pension to eligible beneficiaries.**
 - **Scheme is not fully DBT compliant**, leading to over-payments, short-payments, etc.
 - **Monitoring the Scheme**
 - **No State Level Monitoring Committee** in 30 States/UTs.
 - **Absence of periodic review, social audit and related remedial action** in many states.
- **Recommendations:** Robust **social audit and grievance redressal** mechanisms, **fixing of responsibility** for irregular pension payments, etc.

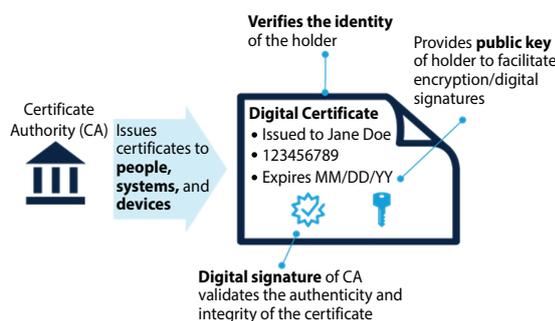
MINISTRY OF STATISTICS AND PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION (MOSPI) UNVEILS THE REVISED DRAFT NATIONAL POLICY ON OFFICIAL STATISTICS (NPOS)

- This policy provides for **laying down a road-map towards modernized data collection and timely dissemination of information.**
 - It reinforces the **United Nations Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics (UNFPOS) adopted by India in 2016.**
 - UNFPOS lists **10 guiding principles of official statistics** while asking for a high level of **independence of national statistical systems.**
- **Need for the revised policy**
 - **Lack of reliable and timely social and economic statistics.**
 - **Lack of a common standard** for official statistics.
 - **To strengthen digital capabilities utilising Big Data, Artificial Intelligence, etc.** for releasing official statistics.
- **Key highlights of draft:**
 - **Creation of Integrated Data System led by MoSPI:** To enable **interoperability** among different data-producing systems at National and State/UT level.
 - **An online web resource** would be created for this.
 - **Optimizing the use of Administrative Statistics:** To reduce Government costs, eliminate survey errors, etc.
 - **Focusing on core official statistics:** Core statistics are **critical to the economy**, hence, are required to be **robust and timely.**
 - A list of core statistics had been prepared in eight domains: **National Income, Production & Services sectors, Budgetary Transactions, etc.**

MINISTRY OF ELECTRONICS & INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (MEITY) LAUNCHED INDIAN WEB BROWSER DEVELOPMENT CHALLENGE (IWBC)

- IWBC is an **open challenge competition** that seeks to empower technology enthusiasts, and developers to **create an indigenous web browser.**
 - This web browser will have its own trust store with an inbuilt Controller of Certifying Authorities (CCA) India root certificate.
 - Browser envisions the ability to **digitally sign documents using a crypto token**, bolstering secure transactions.
- A browser's **trust store or root store** contains a **list of certification authorities** whose certificates can be trusted.
 - Top browsers like **Chrome and Firefox do not include CCA** in their root stores.
 - Due to this, for **digital certificates or Security Sockets Layer (SSL) certificates**, **India has depended on SSL certificates issued by Roots of Foreign entities.**
- CCA was appointed **under Information Technology (IT) Act 2000 of MeitY.**
 - CCA issues certificate **only to Certifying Authorities (CAs).** CAs issue **Digital Signature Certificates** to end-entities. Digital Signatures are valid under IT Act 2000.
 - For identifying and verifying CAs, CCA established **Root Certifying Authority of India (RCAI)** under IT Act.

- **Digital signature** is an **e-signature backed by a digital certificate**, providing proof of an individual's identity.
 - **SSL certificates** are digital certificates that authenticate a website's identity and enable an encrypted connection.



About India's Official statistics system

- **Up-to date, and comprehensive** official Statistics helps formulate, monitor and assess **economic and social policies.**
- At the national level, the **MoSPI is the nodal agency.**
- **National Statistical Commission** was constituted in 2006 as an **apex advisory body on statistical matters.**

PARLIAMENTARY COMMITTEE ON THE EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN TABLED THE 'HEALTH FACILITIES FOR TRIBAL WOMEN' REPORT

- As per NFHS 5 (2019-2020) data, Committee has found **tribal women suffer from malnutrition, a high infant mortality rate (41.6%), and communicable diseases** like malaria, tuberculosis etc.
- **Observations**
 - **Lack of a separate database on tribal health conditions** like Maternal Mortality Rate (MMR).
 - MMR refers to **number of maternal deaths during a given period per 1,00,000 live births** during same period.
 - **Prevalence of Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) is higher** in tribal groups due to absence of effective treatment.
 - **Early marriage in tribal women** causes early pregnancy and other general health risks.
 - **Lack of facilities of pre and post-natal care.**
- **Recommendations**
 - Ministry of Tribal Affairs should work with MoHFW to **generate central health data for tribals with separate classifications** like girl children, women of various age groups etc.
 - **Linking of Swasthya portal to various government databases** such as POSHAN tracker.
 - **Financial assistance** should be imparted and **establish special wing** in hospitals to treat SCD.
 - Devise **special action plan to retain tribal girl child in school** and developing **alternate learning program for 'out of school' girl child.**

Related news

- **Ministry of Railway** has initiated **Janjatiya Gaurav Corridor** to push **rail infrastructure & promote rail connectivity in tribal dominated regions.**
- It is guided by factors like **economic viability, closing last mile gaps, alternative routes and social economic considerations.**

AMENDMENT TO NEW DRUGS AND CLINICAL TRIAL RULES (2023) WILL REPLACE THE USE OF ANIMALS IN RESEARCH

- According to reports, the recent amendment authorises **researchers to use non-animal and human-relevant methods for drug testing** like
 - > **3D organoids (mini-organ):** A millimetre-sized three-dimensional **cellular structures that mimic specific organs of the body.**
 - > **Organs-on-chip:** Microengineered biomimetic system which **reflects structural and functional characteristics of human tissue.**
 - > **Advanced computational methods:** Like Bioprinting and Inkjet-based bioprinting.
 - **Bioprinting** creates three-dimensional structures **consisting of biomaterials, cells, and biomolecules.**
 - Inkjet-based bioprinting is a type of bioprinting based on **conventional inkjet printing process with desktop inkjet printers.**
- **European Union, US, Canada, and South Korea** have also proposed similar initiative to facilitate transition towards **technologies that don't use animals in research.**
- So far, **generally rodents and a non-rodent** (canines and primates) were used as the **first step in drug testing.** But it results in a **high failure** of the drug development process.
 - > **Lab grown animal species may not fully capture the human response** to a drug.
 - Also, it results in ethical issues like **violation of Right to life of animals.**
 - > **Humans are more complex creatures.** Their drug responses often vary from person to person based on factors such as age, sex, etc.

Raisina Dialogue

- Raisina Dialogue is an **annual conference on geopolitics and geoeconomics** addressing issues facing the global community.
 - > It takes its **name from Raisina Hill, the seat of Indian government.**
 - > It has been **held annually in New Delhi** since 2016 by **Observer Research Foundation (ORF)**, an independent think-tank, in **collaboration with Ministry of External Affairs.**
- **8th Edition** was held in March **2023** with **theme "Provocation, Uncertainty, Turbulence: Lighthouse in the Tempest"**.



Revised timeline for Initial Public Offering (IPO)

- **SEBI has halved the time for IPO listing of companies** from six days to three days. i.e from T+6 to T+3.
 - > **IPO** refers to the **selling of securities to the public in the primary market.**
 - > It acts as the **largest source of funds for the company.**
- It will enhance the **ease of doing business** for issuers and provide investors with **quicker access to capital and liquidity.**
- The revised T+3 days timeline will **become mandatory from 1 December 2023 onwards.**



CAG Report on Railway Finances 2023

- **Key findings**
 - > **High Operating Ratio (OR):** OR is 107% i.e., railways' **spent ₹107 to earn ₹100** during 2021-22 owing to higher appropriation to **fund pensions.**
 - > **Loss decreased:** However, entire profits from freight operations were used to cross-subsidise passenger fares.
 - > **Other:** Higher dependence on **Budget Support and Extra Budgetary Resources, continuation of cash transaction, etc.**
- **Recommendations:** Utilize funds judiciously, foster greater responsibility and accountability, etc.



High Price Day Ahead Market and Surplus Power Portal (PUSHp portal)

- PUSHp portal was **launched by Ministry of Power to ensure greater availability of power during peak demand season.**
 - > **Power Distribution Companies (DISCOMS)** will be able to indicate their **surplus power** in block times / days / months on portal.
 - > Those DISCOMs who need power will be able to requisition the surplus power.
 - > This will **reduce the fixed cost burden on DISCOMs**, and **enable the available generation capacity to be utilise.**



Exercise Zayed Talwar

- It is a **naval exercise** between **India** and **UAE.**
- This year, it will be conducted at **Port Rashid (man-made commercial port)** in Dubai.
