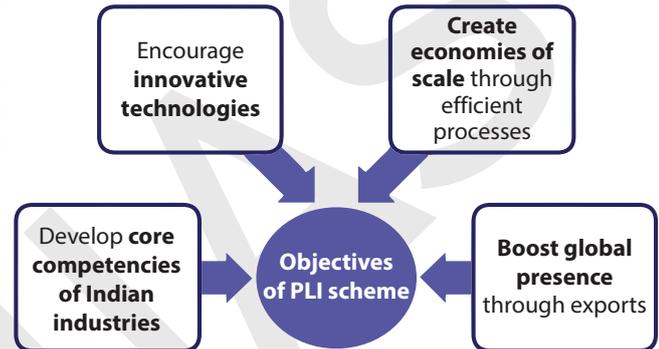

PRODUCTION LINKED INCENTIVE (PLI) SCHEMES CONTRIBUTE TO INCREASE IN PRODUCTION, EMPLOYMENT GENERATION, AND ECONOMIC GROWTH

• PLI related data from Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) highlighted:

- > A significant increase in FDI inflows from FY 2021-22 to FY 2022-23 in various sectors including: **Manufacturing (+76%), Drugs and Pharmaceuticals (+46%), Food Processing Industries (+26%) and Medical Appliances (+91%)**.
- > **60% import substitution achieved in Telecom sector.**
- > **Actual investment of Rs. 62,500 Crore** has been realized till March 2023 which has resulted in **incremental production/ sales over Rs. 6.75 Lakh Crore and employment generation of around 3,25,000.**
- > **Exports boosted by Rs 2.56 Lakh Crore** till FY 2022-23.



• **Union Budget 2021-22 announced** an outlay of **INR 1.97 lakh crores for PLI schemes for 14 key sectors** including electronic manufacturing, automobile, battery, pharma, food, textiles, telecom etc.

- > Scheme **extends incentive** on net incremental sale (over base year) of manufactured goods covered **under target segments.**

• **Challenges**

- > **Low disbursement of incentives** to manufacturers.
- > **6 of the 14 sectors** including textiles, solar PV modules, advanced chemistry cell (ACC) batteries **are lagging.**
- > **No common set of parameters to understand the value added** by beneficiary companies.
- > **Lack of a centralized database** to monitor progress.

30th ANNIVERSARY OF THE VIENNA DECLARATION AND PROGRAMME OF ACTION

• **World Conference on Human Rights**, held in June 1993, by consensus adopted **Vienna Declaration and Programme of Action (VDPA).**

- > **Building on the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR)** of 1948, delegates at Vienna **affirmed the universality, indivisibility and interdependency** of human rights.

• **Vienna Declaration stated**

- > **Universal nature of all human rights** and fundamental freedoms **is beyond question.**
- > **Right of self-determination** to freely determine their political status, and freely pursue their economic, social and cultural development.
- > **A role for international action** to promote and protect human rights.

• **Vienna consensus gave birth to** historical advances on

- > **Rights of women, children, indigenous peoples, minorities** and other groups.
- > **Fight against impunity**, including establishment of **International Criminal Court (ICC).**

• However, **new challenges are holding back fulfilment** of UDHR and VDPA, among these, **digitalization and climate change, inequalities, gender discrimination,** and a rise in **hate speech, disinformation and polarization.**

• Throughout 2023, **UN Human Rights is celebrating Human Rights 75 initiative** to call on States and all others to take clear steps **to fulfil the promises of the Universal Declaration.**

INTERNATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS LAW

- **Foundation** laid by **UDHR (1948).**
- **Two treaties** i.e International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR) and International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (ICESCR) **adopted in 1966.**
- **Together** with UDHR, ICCPR and ICESCR **comprise the International Bill of Human Rights.**
- **India has ratified both** ICCPR and ICESCR. Unlike the covenants, **the UDHR is not a treaty and has not been signed or ratified by states.**

UNITED NATIONS PEACEKEEPING MARKS ITS 75TH ANNIVERSARY

- **Theme** of year-long global campaign is **Peace Begins with Me**.
- **Peacekeeping began in 1948** when UNSC authorized the deployment of UN military observers to the Middle East. There are **currently 12 UN peacekeeping operations**.
 - **UNSC determines** (deriving power from UN charter) **when and where a UN peace operation should be deployed**.
- **It helps countries** torn by conflict **achieve lasting peace, supports political processes, protects civilians**, assists in the **disarmament, demobilization** and guarantee **ceasefires**.
 - **It is guided by three basic principles:** Consent of the parties, Impartiality and Non-use of force except in self-defence and defence of the mandate.
 - **In 1988**, UN peacekeepers were **awarded the Nobel Peace Prize**.
- **India and Peacekeeping**
 - **Deployed Over 200,000 troops over the years** in around 49 UN Peacekeeping Missions.
 - **First country to deploy an all-women contingent** to UN peacekeeping mission in **Liberia**.
 - **India in collaboration with UN launched UNITE Aware Platform**, a situational awareness software programme that will utilise modern surveillance technology for real time threat assessments to peacekeepers.
 - **India provided COVID-19 vaccines** for UN Peacekeeping personnel worldwide.

Earlier, External Affairs Minister **proposed a four-point framework** with a **focus on technological availability and improvement** and **Consistent training and capacity building** for securing UN peacekeepers to meet contemporary threats.

CENTRE ANNOUNCES THREE SCHEMES WORTH OVER RS 8000 CR FOR DISASTER MANAGEMENT IN COUNTRY

- **Central government will provide funds to the States for:**
 - **Expanding** and modernize **fire services**.
 - **Reducing risk of urban flooding** in the seven most populous metros including Mumbai, Chennai, Kolkata, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Ahmedabad, and Pune.
 - **National Landslide Risk Mitigation Project** for 17 States and UTs.
- **India's approach** towards disaster management has **shifted from relief-centric and reactionary to Disaster Risk Reduction** with focus on **early warning system, prevention, mitigation and preparedness** at grassroots level.
- **Recent initiatives taken**
 - **IMD gives 5 days advance forecast** of rainfall and flood (earlier used to give three days advance forecast).
 - **271 wetlands identified in Northeast** by ISRO for **flood management**.
 - **Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI)** launched.
 - **Model Fire Bill and State level action plan for Thunderstorm and Lightning, cold wave and fog** by Centre.
 - **Strict protocols for states, where nuclear power plants** are coming up, for rescue in emergency.
 - **Building dedicated institutions** like National Fire Service College (NFSC) and National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) Academy.
 - **Aapda Mitra** scheme, a **Centrally Sponsored Scheme**, focusing on **training community volunteers** in disaster response in **30 most flood-prone districts**.

INSTITUTIONS MUST PREPARE THEMSELVES FOR AUDITING AI- BASED GOVERNANCE SYSTEMS: COMPTROLLER AND AUDITOR GENERAL (CAG)

- In a recent report, **CAG highlighted** that Supreme Audit Institutions have a **crucial role in audit of Responsible AI** to ensure good governance, transparency and accountability.
 - **AI can be used for removing repetitive tasks** in audit, **enabling analysis of large volumes of data** and risk assessment, fraud detection and continuous auditing.
- Report also presented a **case for use of AI in public sector to:**
 - Enables **faster, more efficient, and more effective delivery of services**.
 - **Increase transparency and accountability**.
 - Better **citizen engagement and informed policy decisions**.
- Report highlights **need for a Responsible AI which stands on four pillars:**
 - **Organisational democratisation** that empowers and encourages individuals to raise concerns.
 - **Systems that enable AI to flourish**.
 - **Systems and platforms that are trustworthy** and explainable by design.
 - **Articulation of responsible AI Mission** that is anchored in organisational values and ethical guardrails.
- Report presented some of the **global standards for AI that can be used for auditing:**
 - **UNESCO Global Agreement:** to guide governments and companies towards AI technologies that confirm with commonly agreed principles.
 - **ISO/IEC JTC1/SC 42:** an international standards committee responsible for developing AI standards.

RELATED NEWS

Hiroshima AI Process (HAP)

- **At the recent G7 summit**, hosted by Japan, leaders initiated **HAP to regulate Artificial Intelligence (AI)**.
 - HAP will be **established through a G7 working group**, in cooperation with **OECD and Global Partnership on AI (GPAI)**.
- **With the help of HAP, G7 countries could move towards a divergent regulation** based on shared norms, principles and guiding values.

US SENATE COMMITTEE APPROVED LEGISLATION TO REMOVE CHINA'S "DEVELOPING COUNTRY" STATUS

- Legislation establishes a **US policy against granting China developing country status** in future treaties and international organisations.
 - **Earlier**, a similar legislation was **passed by House of Representatives**.
- It has been asserted that **China can no longer be considered** a developing country, given its **significant economy, military power, and extensive investments worldwide**.
- **World Trade Organization (WTO) has not defined 'developed' and 'developing' countries** and therefore **member countries are free to announce** whether they are 'developed' or 'developing'.
 - **UN also has no formal definition** of developing countries, but still uses the term for monitoring purposes.
- **Advantages of Developing country status:**
 - **Receive preferential treatment** in terms of **market access, loans, reduction in government support and technical assistance** from international organisations.
 - **Longer transition period** before they are required to fully implement WTO agreement.
 - **Benefit from unilateral preference schemes** of some of developed country members such as USA's Generalized System of Preferences (GSP).
 - **Favourable treatment concerning issues** such as **climate change** responsibilities.

ALSO IN NEWS



Ordinance

- **A recent analysis showed that:**
 - Number of **ordinance issued has dropped since 2019**.
 - **In 2022**, for the first time in 59 years, **no ordinances were promulgated**.
 - **10th Lok Sabha** (1991 to 1996) **holds record for promulgating most number of ordinances i.e 109**.
- **Article 123 empowers President to promulgate ordinances** during the recess of Parliament.
- These ordinances **have the same force and effect as an act of Parliament**, but are in the nature of temporary laws.



Capacity Building Commission(CBC)

- **Geological Survey of India Training Institute (GSITI)** gets accreditation certificate from CBC.
- Established in 2021, CBC has been **mandated to drive standardisation and harmonisation** across **Indian civil services landscape**.
 - Commission's role is **central to the overall institutional framework of Mission Karmayogi-National Programme for Civil Services Capacity Building**.
- Established as an **independent body with complete executive and financial autonomy**, CBC comprises of **three Members** and is supported by an **internal Secretariat**.



Cost Inflation Index(CII)

- **Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT)** has notified the final CII for FY24 at 348.
- CII number is **used to adjust the purchase price of assets** on the **basis of inflation**.
- CII number **helps to calculate long-term capital gains** on assets **after taking inflation into account**.
 - **From the current financial year**, CII number **cannot be used for debt mutual fund schemes and international equity mutual fund schemes**, among others.



Common panel of Insolvency Professionals (IPs)

- Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (IBBI) **will prepare a common panel of Insolvency Professionals (IPs)** for appointment as:
 - IRP (interim resolution professional),
 - Liquidator,
 - RP (resolution professionals) and
 - BT (bankruptcy trustee).
- Board will also **share the list in advance with the adjudicating authority (AA)** to choose from to **oversee various cases** of resolution or liquidation.
 - At present, IBBI is required to **recommend the IP's name only after receiving reference** from AA.
- **Advantages:** Avoid administrative delays in the appointment of IPs, will expedite insolvency resolution etc.



 <p>European Union Deforestation Regulation (EUDR)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> European Union (EU) gave the final go-ahead to EUDR that aims to minimise risk of deforestation and forest degradation associated with products that are placed on or exported from EU market. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Mandatory due diligence rules are set for palm oil, cattle, wood, coffee, cocoa, rubber and soy. ➤ Rules also apply to a number of derived products such as chocolate, furniture, printed paper etc. It assigns a level of risk related to deforestation and forest degradation to countries within and outside the EU.
 <p>Two warships launched</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Two warships Anjadip (named after an island on western coast) and Sanshodhak were launched. Anjadip is the 3rd Anti-Submarine Shallow Water Craft (ASWSWC), and Sanshodhak is the 4th Survey Vessel Large (SVL). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ ASWSWCs require less draft and can operate close to the coast, searching for underwater threats and neutralising enemy assets. ➤ SVL ships will replace the existing Sandhayak Class survey ships with new generation hydrographic equipment to collect oceanographic data. Both are being built by Kolkata-based Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers Ltd (GRSE).
 <p>Mayon Volcano</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Thousands evacuated as Mayon Volcano oozes lava. It is the most active volcano in the Philippines and one of the most active in the world, having erupted over 51 times in the past four centuries. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ It is also called one of the world's most perfect volcanic cone because of the symmetry of its shape. It is situated in main island of Luzon and is at the centre of Mayon Volcano National Park.
 <p>Tissue Engineering</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO) approved first indigenously developed animal-derived tissue engineering scaffold for healing skin wounds. Tissue engineering is a biomedical engineering discipline to create tissues or cellular products outside the body or to repair tissues within the body. It combines the principles of materials and cell transplantation to develop substitute tissues and/or promote endogenous regeneration. Artificial skin and cartilage are examples of engineered tissues.
 <p>Leptospirosis</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> With the onset of monsoon in India, threat of Leptospirosis disease has increased. It is a potentially fatal zoonotic bacterial disease, caused by a bacterium Leptospira interrogans, or leptospira. It is a contagious disease in animals (carrier includes rodents, cattle, pigs, and dogs) but is occasionally transmitted to humans in certain environmental conditions. It is prevalent in warm, humid countries and in both urban and rural areas. Its symptoms mimic those of dengue, malaria, and hepatitis.
 <p>Chikungunya</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A single-dose vaccine for chikungunya was found safe and produced a strong immune response. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ VLA1553 vaccine is developed by French biotech company Valneva. Chikungunya is a mosquito-borne disease caused by chikungunya virus (CHIKV), which is endemic in some regions of Africa, Asia, and the Americas. Chikungunya virus is transmitted by mosquitoes, most commonly Aedes (Stegomyia) aegypti and Aedes (Stegomyia) albopictus, which can also transmit dengue and Zika viruses. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ These mosquitoes bite primarily during daylight hours. ➤ There is currently no approved vaccine or specific treatment for chikungunya virus infections.

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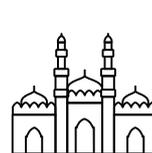
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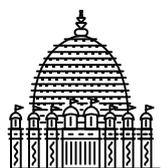
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
