## THE STATE OF THE GLOBAL CLIMATE 2022 REPORT RELEASED BY WORLD METEOROLOGICAL ORGANIZATION (WMO)

- Annual report **give details of climate indicators** such as temperatures, ocean heat, sea level rise, extreme weather etc. It **complements the IPCC Sixth Assessment report**.
  - WMO is a **specialized agency of UN** with 193 Member States and Territories (**including India**).
- **Key Findings**
  - **Global mean temperature in 2022** was 1.15°C above the 1850–1900 average. **Years 2015 to 2022 were eight warmest** on record despite cooling impact of a **La Niña event** for past three years.
  - **Concentrations of three main greenhouse gases** – carbon dioxide, methane and nitrous oxide – **reached record highs in 2021**.
  - Overall, **58% of ocean surface** experienced **at least one marine heatwaves** during 2022.
  - **Rate of global mean sea level rise has doubled** between 1993-2002 (2.27 mm-yr-) and 2013-2022 (4.62 mm-yr).
  - **Socio-economic and environmental impacts**
    - **Heatwaves in 2022 pre-monsoon season in India** and Pakistan caused a **decline in crop yields**.
    - **Recent assessment around Tibetan Plateau**, largest storehouse of snow and ice outside Arctic and Antarctic, found that **global warming is causing temperate zone to expand**.
    - **In East Africa, rainfall** has been **below average in five consecutive wet seasons**, longest such sequence in 40 years.

## 2023 GLOBAL FOOD POLICY REPORT RELEASED BY INTERNATIONAL FOOD POLICY RESEARCH INSTITUTE (IFPRI)

- Established in 1975, **IFPRI provides research-based policy solutions** to sustainably **reduce poverty and end hunger and malnutrition** in developing countries.
- **Key highlights of report**
  - **Food insecurity raised** during 2020-2022 **due to multiple crises** such as COVID-19 pandemic, climate change, natural disasters along with civil unrest and political instability.
  - **With climate change**, as many as **72 million more people will be undernourished** by 2050.
- **Report provides several responses** to reduce impacts of **food crises including:**

# EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT APPROVED MARKETS IN CRYPTO ACT (MiCA)

- MiCA forms part of European Union's (EU) broader digital financial package, which includes Digital Operational Resilience Act and Pilot Regime on Distributed Ledger Technology.
  - It aims to embrace innovation and new financial technologies while ensuring consumer protection and financial stability across EU.
- Key Features of MiCA
  - Impose requirements on crypto platforms, token issuers, and traders around transparency, disclosure, authorization, and supervision of transactions.
  - Platforms to inform consumers about risks associated with their operations, while sales of new tokens will also come under regulation.
  - Stablecoins like Tether will be required to maintain ample reserves to meet redemption requests in the event of mass withdrawals.
  - European Securities and Markets Authority to step in and ban or restrict crypto platforms if they do not protect investors properly.
  - Imposed international travel rule on crypto asset.
    - Travel rule requires financial companies to screen, record and communicate information on both sender and recipient, to help combat money laundering.
  - Addresses environmental concerns surrounding crypto, with firms forced to disclose their energy consumption as well as the impact of digital assets on environment.
- Presently, Crypto assets are not regulated in India.

OTHER GLOBAL EFFORTS TO REGULATE CRYPTO ASSETS	IMF released <b>Nine-Point Crypto Assets Action Plan</b> .
	OECD has Approved <b>Crypto-Asset Reporting Framework (CARF)</b> for reporting of tax information on transactions in Crypto-Assets in a standardized manner.
	<b>Financial Action Task Force (FATF)</b> issued binding standards to prevent misuse of virtual assets for money laundering and terrorist financing.

# GLOBAL BUDDHIST SUMMIT 2023 CONCLUDED WITH NEW DELHI DECLARATION

- Summit was organised by Ministry of culture, in collaboration with Delhi-based International Buddhist Confederation, to engage global Buddhist dharma leadership and scholars on matters of Buddhist and universal concerns.
- Key highlights of New Delhi Declaration
  - In the present world scenario, texts, doctrines and philosophy of Buddha Dharma are best guide for inter-faith dialogue, harmony and universal peace.
  - Recognize significance of Buddhist pilgrimage as a living heritage.
- Summit highlighted the rising role of Buddhism in India's soft power strategy.
  - Soft power enables a change of behaviour in others, without competition or conflict, by using persuasion and attraction.
- Other initiatives taken towards Buddhist diplomacy
  - PM makes Buddhism a regular feature of his diplomatic visits and also emphasises shared Buddhist heritage.
  - Presence of Dalai Lama and Tibetan government-in-exile in Dharamshala has bolstered India's image in global Buddhist community.
  - India hosted Buddhist pilgrims from South Korea.
  - Creation of specialized Buddhist tourist circuits that cross international borders.
  - Restoration of Nalanda University etc.

# MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION LAUNCHES REGIONAL CONNECTIVITY SCHEME (RCS)- UDAN (UDE DESH KA AAM NAGRIK) 5.0

- RCS-UDAN, a market-driven scheme, aims to enhance regional air connectivity from unserved and underserved airports and making air travel affordable.
  - It was formulated based on the review of National Civil Aviation Policy (NCAP)-2016.
- Key features of UDAN 5.0
  - Focuses on Category-2 (20-80 seats) and Category-3 (>80 seats).
  - Length cap of 600 km is waived off.
  - No predetermined routes would be offered.
  - Viability gap funding (VGF) increased to 600 km from 500 km earlier.
- Over the years, depending upon priorities of government as well as market response, there have been several additions / modifications in UDAN scheme.
  - Under UDAN 2, enhanced focus on hilly areas, and North Eastern Region (NER) and island states.
  - Under UDAN 3, seaplanes operations and concept of tourism routes were introduced.
  - Under UDAN 4, enhancement of VGF support for smaller aircraft, inclusion of State routes and focus on shorter routes for development of regional hubs.
  - Lifeline UDAN for transportation of medical cargo during pandemic.
  - Krishi UDAN for value realization of agriculture products especially in NER and tribal districts.
  - International UDAN routes for NER to explore International Connectivity from / to Guwahati and Imphal.

KEY FEATURES OF UDAN	
• <b>Limited government support:</b>	Objectives were to be achieved via monetary (VGF) and non-monetary benefits provided to the airline operators.
• <b>Cooperative Federalism:</b>	State-level coordination committees to extend benefits to airline operators.
• <b>Capped airfares, Technology enabled processes and Transparent, competitive bidding.</b>	

## Significance of promotion of Buddhist diplomacy

- Pan-Asian presence of the religion and its importance for national identities in the region.
- Deepening ties with Asian nations on basis of Buddhism could potentially help with, 'Neighbourhood First' policy, 'Act East' policy etc.

# FSSAI SAYS IT KEEPS ACTING AGAINST FOOD BUSINESSES INVOLVED IN MISLEADING CLAIMS

- Statement comes in the wake of **allegations of high sugar content in Bournvita** made by a social media influencer.
- **Regulation of Food advertisement in India**
  - **Food Safety & Standards Act, 2006 prescribe punishment for selling misbranded food** and also for **misleading advertisements.**
  - **FSSAI has notified Food Safety and Standards (Advertisements & Claims) Regulations, 2018** under which **deceptive claims or advertisements** are prohibited and are punishable offences.
  - **FSSAI has set up a dedicated advertisement monitoring committee** which periodically scrutinises advertisements and claims being made by **Food Business Operators (FBOs)** on various channels.
  - Advertising Standards Council of India (ASCI) has drafted and implemented a **Code for Self-Regulation in Advertising (ASCI Code).**
  - **FSSAI has been designated as the nodal point for liaison with the Codex**, international food standards body.

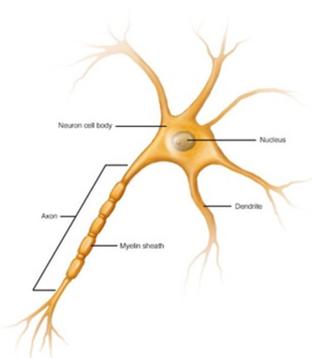
- ▶ Laying down mechanisms and guidelines for accreditation of certification bodies.

<p><b>Myelin Basic Protein (MBP)</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Scientists from <b>Institute of Advanced Study in Science and Technology, Guwahati</b>, an autonomous institute under Department of Science and Technology, fabricated MBP.</li> <li>• <b>MBP is a major protein component of myelin sheath.</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Myelin sheath is a <b>protective membrane that wraps around the axon of nerve cells</b> and acts as a model protein in <b>studying diseases like multiple sclerosis.</b></li> </ul> </li> <li>• MBP is <b>responsible for adhesion of the cytosolic surfaces</b> (liquids found inside cells) of myelin.</li> <li>• Fabrication of MBP <b>will help in studying different chemical and physical properties</b> in the <b>vicinity of protein environment.</b></li> </ul>





 <p><b>Logistic Performance Index (LPI) 2023</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● India improved its rank to <b>38</b> (from 44 in 2018) in <b>World Bank's LPI 2023</b>. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➢ <b>Significant investments in both soft and hard infrastructure as well as technology</b> has led to an <b>improvement in India's port performance</b>.</li> <li>➢ <b>Singapore topped</b> the index.</li> </ul> </li> <li>● LPI is a <b>benchmarking tool</b> created to help <b>countries identify challenges and opportunities</b> they face in their performance <b>on trade logistics</b>.</li> <li>● <b>LPI 2023 ranks countries on six dimensions of trade</b> - including customs performance, infrastructure quality, and timeliness of shipments</li> </ul>
 <p><b>Draft Electricity (Amendment) Rules, 2023</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● It will <b>amend the Electricity Rules, 2005</b>, framed under Electricity Act, 2003.</li> <li>● <b>Key Provisions:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➢ <b>Quarterly report</b> should be submitted <b>by state electricity regulatory commissions (SERCs) for DISCOMS</b> in their jurisdiction.</li> <li>➢ <b>SERCs can levy penalty on DISCOMS</b> in case their subsidy accounting, the raising of bills for subsidy and the payment are not in accordance with the Act or Rules.</li> </ul> </li> <li>● <b>Amendments are in line with Revamped Distribution Sector Scheme (RDSS)</b>, which aims to reduce <b>Aggregate Technical &amp; Commercial (AT&amp;C) losses</b> to pan-India levels of 12-15%.</li> </ul>

 <p><b>VIM-GES-CRPA</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) <b>linked India-made eye drops to outbreak of rare strain- VIM-GES-CRPA</b> in US.</li> <li>● <b>VIM-GES-CRPA</b> is a <b>rare strain of extensively drug-resistant Pseudomonas aeruginosa</b>. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➢ It is <b>associated with multiple types of infections</b>, including eye infections.</li> <li>➢ <b>Most patients</b> infected with VIM-GES-CRPA <b>report using artificial tears</b>.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
